The following Address was presented to His Majesty on the occasion of Their Majesties' visit, on the 22nd instant, to lay the Commemoration Stone of King Edward VII Hospital for Windsor, Eton and District:—

May it please Your Majesties,

We, the President, Governors, and Executive Committee of King Edward VII Hospital and Dispensary for Windsor, Eton and the neighbourhood desire most respectfully to welcome Your Majesties on this auspicious occasion.

For some years past the growing demands of modern science and the increased pressure of work in the old Infirmary compelled us to recognise that the Institution was totally inadequate to the needs of the District. The number of annual In-patients had increased in the last five years from 328 to 507, the operations performed from 167 to 369, and the Out-patients and casualty patients had increased in proportion.

Looking to all these facts the Governors decided after much earnest consideration to build a new Hospital, feeling it to be a duty they owed to the public. We have been most generously supported in our efforts—thanks to Your Majesties' most gracious example—and in asking You to place this Commemoration Stone we feel confident that those who live under the shadow of Windsor Castle, and in the surrounding district, will not allow the Hospital which bears Your name to suffer from want of funds. We can assure Your Majesties and the contributors to our funds that the representative character of the Committee, the skill and devotion of the medical and nursing staff, and the single-hearted desire on the part of all to do their best to relieve the sufferings of the poor, give us good grounds for hoping that for many a year to come King Edward VII's Hospital will win for itself the loving support of those who live in the district, and will prove itself a blessing to the poor people of Windsor, Eton and the neighbourhood.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

"In behalf of the Queen and Myself I thank you most sincerely for your loyal address of welcome.

"It is a special pleasure to Me to place this Commemoration Stone in the new hospital. I take deep interest in all hospitals, and in none more than the institution which serves the needs of the district lying at My own gates. I am not surprised to hear of the growth of its work. Hospitals are not less needed in many country districts than they are in great cities. The surroundings of the country may be more conducive to health, but disease is never absent, and in a wide and scattered district medical and surgical assistance is often harder to obtain than in a city. The increased accommodation provided by this new hospital will give greater scope than before to its beneficent work, and will afford, I doubt not, fresh proof of the unselfish devotion which has always been manifested by its staff.

"I pray that the blessing of God may attend your labours."

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative
County of Durham) Order, 1908.

Dated 25th June, 1908.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me
by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904,
and upon application by the County Council of
the Administrative County of Durham, I hereby
make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild
Birds Protection (Administrative County of
Durham) Order, 1908."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking
of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880
shall be extended throughout the Administrative
County of Durham so as to be between the last
day of February and the 1st day of September in
any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880,
shall apply within the Administrative County
of Durham to the following species of Wild

Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act :—

Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough-legged Buzzard, Peregrine Falcon, Hobby, Kestrel, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Osprey, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Durham :—

Goldfinch, Kingfisher, House Martin, Sand Martin, Swallow.

Sunday Protection.

V. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Bank Holidays is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Durham, except in the under-mentioned areas, viz. :—

(1) In Weardale Union, the Ecclesiastical Districts of Rookhope, St. John's Chapel, Heathery Cleugh, Westgate and Eastgate, all in the township of Stanhope, and

(2) In Teesdale Union, the parishes of Forest and Frith, Newbiggen, Middleton-in-Teesdale and Egglestone,

as shown on a map deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, sealed with the Home Office seal, and dated the 25th day of June, 1908.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of Durham :—

Bittern, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Common Buzzard, Tree Creeper, Curlew, Dipper, Dotterel, Dunlin (Ox Bird, Purre), Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Black-headed Gull, Golden Plover, Goldfinch, Hawfinch, Heron, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Lark (Skylark), House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Nuthatch, Ring Ouzel, Owl (all species), Water Rail, Raven, Robin, Snipe, Swallow, Wagtail (all species), Woodcock, Woodpecker (all species).

Repeal of Former Orders.

VII. The Orders of the 3rd February, 1891, and the 27th February, 1896, are hereby repealed.

ORDER of the Local Government Board:
Temporary Order: Relief to able-bodied Men,
their Wives and Families:—

MIDDLESBROUGH UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Middlesbrough Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by an Order dated the 16th day of July, 1875, We, the Local Government Board, prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of out-door relief to poor persons in the Middlesbrough Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Union:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

Article I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Middlesbrough Union may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

Article II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse the wife and family of any able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse.

(2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.

(3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of subdivision (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time or any part of the time of his absence.

Article III.—This Order shall operate and have effect until the thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

GLAMORGAN (CONTROL OF DOGS)
ORDER OF 1908.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of

the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

6. This Order may be cited as the GLAMORGAN (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1908.
