#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-fifth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property formerly belonging to the Prebend of Wedland, in the cathedral church of Saint Paul, London, and now vested in us.

"Whereas on the vacancy of the said Prebend which occurred on or about the twenty-third day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, by the decease of the Reverend Frederick William Blomberg, Doctor in Divinity, the then Prebendary, all the lands, tenements, and hereditaments theretofore belonging to the said Prebend (except rights of patronage) became by virtue of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, absolutely vested in us for the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable to other hereditaments vested in us.

"And whereas the lands, tenements, and hereditaments which so became vested in us as aforesaid are in our possession, but are held under us for estates of inheritance by copy of Court Roll at small annual quit rents, and on that account and in some instances on account of

the character or situation of the property the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments or such parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to dispose of our interest therein or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments, in writing, duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty's reign with the consent of the holder or holders thereof (if any) to be testified by his, her, or their being made parties to such instruments, all or any of the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments formerly belonging to the said Prebend of Wedland and so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances and all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to pur-chase the same and his or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he, she, or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and enquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands tithes rent-charges tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said

Acts or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said scheme has approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of London.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirtynine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirtysecond years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fourth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the

words and figures following, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Shirebrook, in the county of Derby and in the diocese of Southwell.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Shirebrook is now vested under the will of the late Joseph Paget in the trustees therein named upon trust for Helen Elizabeth

Paget now of 1, Percival-terrace, Brighton, in the county of Sussex, the widow of the said Joseph Paget during her life and the said Helen Elizabeth Paget is therefore the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant.

"And whereas the said Helen Elizabeth Paget is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Shirebrook should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time

being of the said diocese of Southwell.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edwyn, now Bishop of Southwell, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Shirebrook which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the new parish of Shirebrook.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Helen Elizabeth Paget, being the person whose consent as Patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the first and second years of Her said late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and six (in testimony of which consent she the said Helen Elizabeth Paget has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Shirebrook shall be transferred to the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same Bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, and by his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of

any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts: and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwell.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has power and jurisdiction, in and over Cyprus:

And whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, on the thirtieth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two made an Order in Council entitled "The Cyprus Courts of Justice Order, 1882":

And whereas His Majesty the King, on the eleventh day of August one thousand nine hundred and two made an Order in Council entitled "The Cyprus Courts of Justice Amendment Order, 1902":

And whereas it is expedient to amend the same:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by virtue of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

#### Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as "The Cyprus Courts of Justice Order, 1908," and where not inconsistent therewith shall be read as one with "The Cyprus Courts of Justice Order, 1882," and "The Cyprus Courts of Justice Amendment Order, 1902," and may be cited together with the said Orders as "The Cyprus Courts of Justice Orders, 1882 to 1908."

Substitution of new clause for clause twenty-eight of "The Cyprus Courts of Justice Order, 1882."

2. Clause twenty-eight of "The Cyprus Courts of Justice Order, 1882," is hereby revoked but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder and the said Order shall henceforth be construed and take effect as if, instead of the said clause twenty-eight, the following clause had been inserted therein.

#### Jurisdiction of Village Judges.

"28.—(1) Every Village Judge within his judicial division shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine all Ottoman actions, and, with the consent of all parties thereto but not otherwise, all foreign actions:—

(a) In respect of any debt, damage, or demand, where the amount of such debt,

damage or demand is not more than five pounds and the defendant or one of the defendants resides within such judicial division.

Provided that, except as in this Order provided, a Village Judge shall not have power to try any action for the possession of or to restrain interference with immoveable property or for preemption or for excessive damage or for compensation under the Malicious Injury to Property Law or in respect of water rights or in which the title to immoveable property or to any rights, benefits or profits over or out of or in respect of immoveable property shall be in question.

- (b) (1) In respect of any claim for the possession of or to restrain interference with any immoveable property situated within such judicial division where the value of the property claimed shall not exceed two pounds.
- (2) In respect of any claim for pre-emption of immoveable property situated within such judicial division where the value of the property claimed does not exceed two pounds.
- (3) In respect of any claim for excessive damage to immoveable property situated within such judicial division where neither the value of the property damaged nor of any property causing damage exceeds two pounds.
- (4) In respect of the claim of any person for compensation under the Malicious Injury to Property Law 1894 or any amendment thereof where the respondent or any respondent to the petition is situated within such judicial division and where the amount of such claim is not more than two pounds.

Provided that on the application of the defendant a Village Judge shall refuse to hear any such action as is in this section (b) of subclause (1) hereof mentioned if he is satisfied that the title to immoveable property of greater value than two pounds would be affected by the decision in the action.

(c) In respect of any claim to restrain interference with the right to use water for the irrigation of immoveable property or for any other purpose within such judicial division where the value of immoveable property in respect of which the right is claimed or the value of the right claimed shall not exceed two pounds.

Provided that a Village Judge shall refuse to hear the action if on the application of the defendant he is satisfied that immoveable property or water rights of a greater value than two pounds or the title to immoveable property or water rights of greater value than two pounds would be affected by the decision in the action.

- (d) In respect of any other claim in which the title to any immoveable property situated within such judicial division or any rights or benefits over, out of or in respect of such immoveable property shall come into question where the value of the immoveable property shall not exceed two pounds or in case of an easement or servitude (such as a right of way, a right to have a water channel, a right to discharge water) where either the dominant or servient property is situated within such judicial division and neither the value of the immoveable property, if any, in respect of which the easement or servitude is claimed nor the value of the property on, through, over or under which such easement or servitude is claimed shall exceed the sum of two pounds.
- (e) In respect of any claim in which the title to any immoveable property or water rights.

or any rights, benefits or profits over, out of or in respect of immoveable property shall come in question incidentally if both parties consent at the hearing that the Judge shall have power to decide the claim which it is the immediate object of the action to enforce.

- (f) In respect of the right of any person to the use in common with others of any immoveable property situated within such judicial division dedicated to the common use of the inhabitants of any place or places.
- (g) In respect of any claim for partition of immoveable property situated within such judicial division which the defendant alleges to be held in undivided share by himself and any other person or persons (mushterek).

. The High Commissioner may at any time and from time to time by order to be published in the Cyprus Gazette enlarge the jurisdiction of the Village Judge of any judicial division by directing that the limit of value in this sub-clause (1) hereof mentioned shall be increased in any case that he may direct to any extent not exceeding ten pounds and may in like manner repeal or amend or vary any such order.

(2) Where the President or an Ordinary Judge of the District Court is sitting as Village Judge he shall within the local jurisdiction of the District Court have jurisdiction similar to that given by the previous sub-clause (1) hereof to any Village Judge.

Provided that in the case of any Judge of the District Court the limit of value shall in all cases be ten pounds instead of two pounds and that the limit of local jurisdiction shall be the local jurisdiction of the District Court and not the judicial division.

Provided also that in the case of the President of the District Court the consent of the parties shall not be necessary to his hearing foreign actions.

(3) Nothing in this Order shall deprive the District Court of any jurisdiction which it had previous to the passing of this Order.

Provided that where any action within the jurisdiction of any Village Judge is brought in the District Court any Judge shall on the application of any party to the action made at or before the settlement of issue unless there is good cause to the contrary and the Court or Judge may at any time of its motion order the case to be tried before any Village Judge before whom the same might have been commenced and, thereupon, the plaintiff shall institute proceedings before such Village Judge and the

ceedings before such Village Judge and the costs of the proceedings in the District Court shall be in the discretion of the Judge.

Provided also that if an action triable before a Village Judge is heard in the District Court unless the Judge or Court before whom the

action is tried certifies that there was sufficient reason for bringing the action in the District Court the plaintiff shall not recover any more costs than he would have recovered if he had

sued in a Village Judge Court.

(4) Where an injunction or order to restrain any person from doing any act is claimed before the Village Judge the Village Judge of any judicial division may by his judgment grant such injunction or order to restrain and the party obtaining such judgment may file the same with the Registrar of the District Court within the local jurisdiction of which the Village Judge sits and, thereupon, the District Court shall enforce such judgment as if it were a judgment of the District Court.

- (5) Any Judge of a District Court sitting as Village Judge may give the same remedies and shall have the same powers of enforcing his judgment as a District Court or any Judge thereof.
- (6) Every judgment of a Village Judge shall be subject to appeal to the full District Court and any party to the appeal may, in such cases and subject to such conditions as shall be prescribed by Rules of Court, on giving security for costs to the Registrar of the District Court not to exceed five pounds apply that the appeal shall be a re-hearing and that the witnesses shall be heard before the Court and, thereupon, the parties shall summon their witnesses before the District Court on the hearing of the appeal.
- (7) Every appeal from a judgment of a Judge of a District Court sitting as Village Judge where the only question raised on the appeal is a question of law may be to the Supreme Court.
- (8) In any case in which the Judge decides the action by consent as provided by section (e) of sub-clause (1) hereof and in any case of partition where the property of which partition is made exceeds the value in respect of which the Village Judge has jurisdiction the judgment of the Court shall not be evidence of title between the parties or their privies in any other action or matter before that or any other Village Judge or before any Court and such consent as is in section (e) of sub-clause (1) hereof mentioned shall not prejudice any right of appeal of either party.
- (9) No judgment by which it is found that an unregistered person is entitled to property or to restrain any other persons from interfering with property the right to or possession of which is by law required to be registered shall have any force until he has obtained registration."

Substitution of new clause for clause forty-eight of "The Cyprus Courts of Justice Order, 1882."

3. Clause forty-eight of "The Oyprus Courts of Justice Order, 1882," is hereby revoked but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder and the said Order shall henceforth be construed and take effect as if, instead of the said clause forty-eight, the following clause had been inserted therein.

#### Jurisdiction of Magisterial Court.

"48. (a) A Magisterial Court formed by the President or the two Ordinary Judges of the District Court sitting together shall have jurisdiction summarily to try all complaints of offences committed within the local jurisdiction of the District Court of which they are members which are punishable with imprisonment for any term not exceeding one month or with fine not exceeding five pounds or with both such punishments and to receive complaints of all other offences mentioned and thereupon to investigate the same with power to dismiss any such complaint or to commit the accused for trial before the proper Court.

Provided that no charge against a person who is not an Ottoman subject shall, unless with the consent of the accused, be brought either for summary trial or for preliminary examination before a Magisterial Court consisting of the two Ordinary Judges of a District Court.

No charge against such person under the English law shall, without his consent, be dealt with summarily unless it would be triable by a Court of summary jurisdiction in England summarily without consent.

- (b) If a complaint is brought before a Magisterial Court, constituted as aforesaid, of any offence committed within the local jurisdiction aforesaid being one of the offences specified in the First Schedule to this Order, the Court, if it think it expedient so to do, having regard to the character and antecedents of the person charged, the nature of the offence and all the circumstances of the case and if the accused is willing that the case should be tried summarily by such Magisterial Court may deal summarily with the offence and adjudge such person, if found guilty of the offence, to be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding three months or to pay a fine not exceeding ten pounds or both.
- (c) If a complaint is brought before any Magisterial Court, constituted as aforesaid, of any offence committed within the local jurisdiction aforesaid being one of the offences specified in the Second Schedule to this Order and the Court, at any time during the hearing of the case, becomes satisfied that the evidence is sufficient to put the person charged on his trial for the said offence and, further, is satisfied that the case is one which, having regard to the character and antecedents of the person charged, the nature of the offence and all the circumstances of the case, may properly be dealt with summarily and may be adequately punished by virtue of the powers of this Order, then, the Court shall cause the charge to be reduced into writing and read to the person charged and shall then ask him whether he is guilty or not of the charge and, if such person says that he is guilty, the Court shall, thereupon, cause a plea of guilty to be entered and adjudge him to be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding six months and may, in addition, impose a fine not exceeding ten pounds.

The Court, before asking, in pursuance of this clause, the person charged whether he is guilty or not, shall explain to him that he is not obliged to plead or answer and that if he pleads guilty he will be dealt with summarily and that if he does not plead or answer or pleads not guilty he will be dealt with on information before the District or Assize Court. The Court shall further state to such person that he is not obliged to say anything unless he desires to do so but that whatever he says will be taken down in writing and may be given in evidence against him upon his trial and shall give him clearly to understand that he has nothing to hope from any promise of favour and nothing to fear from any threat which may have been held out to him to induce him to make any admission or confession of his guilt but that whatever he then says may be given in evidence against him upon his trial notwithstanding such promise or threat.

If the prisoner does not plead guilty whatever he says in answer shall be taken down in writing and read over to him and signed by a Judge constituting or forming part of the Court and kept with the depositions of the witnesses and transmitted with them in manner required by law and, afterwards, upon the trial of the prisoner, may, if necessary, be given in evidence against him without further proof unless it is proved that the Judge purporting to have signed the same did not in fact sign the same.

(d) If a complaint is brought before any Magisterial Court constituted as aforesaid of any offence committed within the local jurisdiction aforesaid being one of the offences specified in the schedules to this Order and it appears to the Court that the prisoner has previously been convicted of the offence charged and that, owing to

such a previous conviction or otherwise, he is punishable by law with imprisonment for over three years the Court shall not deal with the case summarily in pursuance of this Order.

(e) If, upon the hearing of a charge for an offence punishable on summary conviction under this Order or under any other Order or Law whether past or future before a Magisterial Court constituted as aforesaid, the Court thinks that, though the charge is proved, the offence was in the particular case of so trifling a nature that it is inexpedient to inflict any punishment or any other than a nominal punishment the Court, without proceeding to conviction, may dismiss the information and, if the Court thinks fit, may order the person charged to pay such damages, not exceeding forty shillings, and such costs of the proceeding, or either of them, as the Court think reasonable: or, the Court, upon convicting the person charged, may discharge him conditionally on his giving security, with or without sureties, to appear for sentence when called upon or to be of good behaviour and either without payment of damages and costs or subject to the payment of such damages and costs or either of them as the Court thinks reasonable.

Provided that this sub-clause shall not apply to an adult convicted in pursuance of this Order of an offence of which he has pleaded guilty and of which he could not, if he had not pleaded guilty, be convicted by a Magisterial Court.

- (f) On the summary trial of any offence under this Order a Court constituted as aforesaid shall have power to grant as compensation to the accused any sum admitted by the accused to be due as compensation or, if the accused denies that any compensation is due or disputes the amount, any sum proved to be due for compensation not exceeding ten pounds. Such Court shall also have the power of ordering restitution of property given under clause one hundred and fifty-eight of this Order.
- (g) Where, on the summary trial of any offence by a Magisterial Court consisting of two Judges, the members of the Court disagree as to the guilt or innocence of the defendant the defendant shall be discharged. And, where, on the preliminary investigation of any charge before any such Court, the members thereof disagree as to whether the accused ought to be committed for trial or not the accused shall be discharged but may at any time be brought up on the same charge before the President of the District Court for preliminary examination without the production of further evidence.
- (h) Any Magisterial Court other than Magisterial Courts constituted as hereinbefore mentioned shall within the local jurisdiction of such Court as defined by the Order establishing the same have such jurisdiction as has been or shall be conferred upon it by Order of the High Commissioner published in the Cyprus Gazette not exceeding the jurisdiction hereinbefore mentioned.

The High Commissioner shall have power by Order published in the Cyprus Gazette to make such Order as he shall think fit as to the jurisdiction of any additional Magisterial Court established or to be established and, in like manner, to amend or repeal the same.

(i) Every Ordinary Judge of a District Court, sitting alone, shall, for the purpose of holding preliminary enquiries into offences not triable summarily, have the same jurisdiction and may exercise the same powers as are conferred by the said Order for the said purpose upon Magisterial Courts consisting of the two

Ordinary Judges of a District Court sitting Offences under the Post Office, Revenue or other together.

If it shall appear to such Judge during the preliminary enquiry that the charge is one which might be dealt with under sub-clauses (b), (c), or (e) of this clause such Judge may adjourn the hearing of the charge and direct that it be taken before a Court properly constituted to exercise the jurisdiction conferred by the sub-clauses aforesaid.

- (j) The powers hereinafter conferred upon Magisterial Courts of adjourning the hearing of cases either on summary trial or on preliminary enquiry and of making such orders and issuing such warrants as may be necessary in consequence of such adjournment may be exercised by any member of a Magisterial Court whenever from any cause the full Court shall not be present.
- (k) Where any person is convicted on his own confession of any offence triable under this clause and sentenced to imprisonment without the option of a fine he may appeal against the sentence notwithstanding his plea of guilty.

#### Pending Cases.

4. All cases pending in the District Court at the time when this Order shall come into force which, under the provisions of this Order, would be under the jurisdiction of a Village Judge may be dealt with under Sub-clause 3 of Clause 28 of this Order but, subject to any Order under the said sub-clause, shall continue to be heard and determined as though this Order had not come into force.

#### Power of Judges as to Costs.

5. Subject to "The Cyprus Courts of Justice Orders, 1882 to 1908" and the Rules of Court made thereunder and the express provisions of any Law in force in Cyprus whether passed before or after the commencement of this Order the costs of and incident to all proceedings in the Supreme Court or any District Court or before any Village Judge shall be in the discretion of the Court or Judge and the Court or Judge shall have full power to determine by whom and to what extent such costs are to be paid.

#### Date of coming into operation.

"And whereas we consider it desirable that in certain cases this period of full pay sick leave should be extended:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to extend the period of full pay sick leave as from the first day of October last up to a maximum of twelve months in the following cases when recommended by the Director-General of the Medical Department of Your Majesty's Navy:

(a) Junior Officers of the actual or relative

rank of Sub-Lieutenant or under:

(b) Other Officers when the circumstances are such as to call for exceptional treatment, viz.: when the illness is due to service in the Tropics or unhealthy climate, or when the rate of half-pay is very small, or when heavy expenses for medical treatment have necessarily been incurred by the Officer.

"The extension of full pay sick leave in either case to be granted only when the Officer's illness is due to causes beyond his own control and there is a reasonable probability of ultimate

return to duty

"The period of full pay sick leave granted to Officers to include time which may be spent in hospital but not full pay leave earned by Foreign Service, the latter being granted on completion of period of full pay sick leave except in the cases of Officers invalided from Your Majesty's Navy who will not be granted any period of Foreign Service leave:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS respecting Boy Clerks registered for Temporary Employment in Public Departments.

\*\*\* Revised Regulations may at any time be issued.

1. Two Registers of Boy Clerks for temporary employment in Public Departments will be kept

by the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 2. These Registers will contain the names of boys who, being either natural-born or naturalized British subjects, have satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners that they are of good health and character, and that they are duly qualified under the following regulations (3 and 4). One Register will contain the names of boys for service in London, Edinburgh, and provincial towns of England, Scotland and Wales. The other will contain the names of boys for service in Dublin and provincial towns in Ireland.
- S. The limits of age are 15 to 17. If an examination begins in one of the first four months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of January in that year. If an examination begins in one of the second four months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of May in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last four months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of September in that year.
  - The subjects for examination are:—
     Handwriting and Orthography.
    - 2. Arithmetic, including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions.
  - English Composition.
     Copying Manuscript.

And any two of the following:-

5. Geography.

- 6. English History.7. Translation from Latin.
- 8. Translation from French.
- 9. Translation from German.
- 10. Mathematics.

11. The rudiments of Chemistry and Physics.
No subjects are obligatory, but no Candidate
will be regarded as qualified who fails to obtain

such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent amount of general

proficiency.

5. Open Competitive Examinations for the purpose of testing the qualifications of Candidates in the above-mentioned subjects will be held by the Civil Service Commissioners from time to time as may be necessary, and a certain number, regulated by the probable demand from the Public Departments, of those who show sufficient proficiency will be placed upon the Rogisters kept by the Commissioners, and will be available for employment as their services are required. The competitions for the Irish service will, as a rule, be held at the same time as the competitions for service in Great Britain, and the list of successful candidates for Ireland will be separate from that of the successful candidates for service in Great Britain. Candidates can enter for both competitions, when they are held simultaneously, paying only one fee. If successful in both they will be entered on the Register for Great Britain only, or on that for Ireland only, or on both Registers according to

6. The fee payable for attending an examina

tion will be 10s.

7. Boy Clerks placed on these Registers will be summoned for employment in any of the Public Departments as they are wanted. When not wanted, they will have no claim to employment. Refusing to serve when called upon, except for reasons satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, they will be removed from the Registers. The order in which they may be employed, the Departments to which they may be assigned, and their retention generally on the Registers, will be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners; but they will be subject to the orders of the Departments in which they are serving during the time of their actual employment, and will be liable to dismissal from them by the authorities thereof, without notice, for inefficiency or misconduct.

Boy Clerks resigning, or procuring their own discharges from Departments, except for sufficient reasons proved to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners, will be removed from the

Registers.

Their assignment for service will, as a general rule, be according to their order of merit in the examination; but exceptions to this general rule may be made when the engagement offered is very short, or for other sufficient reasons.

8\*. These Boy Clerks will usually be engaged and paid by the week of 39 hours, viz.:—7 hours a day on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, and 4 hours on Saturdays; and they will be paid 15s. per week during the first year of their service. After a year of approved service, an increase of pay to 16s. a week may be allowed; after a second year, an increase of pay to 17s. a week; after a third year, an increase to 18s.; after a fourth year, an increase to 19s.

In any case of absence without pay a Boy Clerk's increment shall be postponed one day for every day of such absence—absence without pay equally with the interval between two successive engagements not being reckoned as service for any purpose contemplated by the Regulations.

Boy Clerks may also be engaged and paid by the hour at the rate of  $4\frac{1}{2}d$ . per hour during their first year of service; at the rate of 5d. per hour during the second;  $5\frac{1}{2}d$ . during the third year of

\* Clause 8 applies to all Boy Clerks registered on the result of competitions held later than 1st April, 1902,

service; and afterwards at the rate of 6d. per hour. Any who may be engaged by the week and who may be required to attend for more than  $7\frac{1}{2}$  hours on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday, or more than  $4\frac{1}{2}$  hours on Saturday, will be paid at the hourly rate for such overtime attendance. But in no case must overtime attendance exceed 6 hours in any one week. They may also be paid by the piece at such rates as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury.

9. No service, however much it may happen to be prolonged, will confer any claim to superannuation or compensation allowance; and Boy Clerks will not be retained, as such, after they

shall have reached the age of 20.

10. If a public holiday, on which the office is closed, fall within the period of a Boy Clerk's engagement, he may be paid in respect of it as for a working day. Boy Clerks may, with the consent of the Department in which they are serving, or if not at the time serving, with the consent of the Civil Service Commissioners, be allowed holidays, with pay at the rate for the official day in the proportion of one day for every 24 full days of actual and approved service previously rendered by them as Boy Clerks. But no Boy Clerk shall be allowed to take more than 12 days' leave under these conditions, between the 1st day of January and the 31st day of December, both days inclusive, in any one year, and in calculating the leave to be allowed in any given year, no service rendered before the 1st day of January of the preceding year shall be counted.

January of the preceding year shall be counted.

Holiday pay can only be allowed for holidays actually taken, not for days on which the Boy Clerk is drawing pay in respect of employment

in any capacity in the Public Service.

11. Boy Clerks who may fall ill while serving in any Department, and whose illness may be attested by medical certificate to the satisfaction of the authorities of such Department, may be allowed sick-leave, receiving three-fourths of the rate of pay for the official day; provided that no Boy Clerk shall be paid for holidays and sick-leave, taken together, for more than 28 days within any one year, exclusive of public holidays.

12. Except in conformity with Regulations 10, 11, 14, and 15, Boy Clerks will only receive pay for the hours, or parts of hours, during

which they actually attend.

13. No person who has been trained, either wholly or partially, at the public expense, for the occupation of a teacher in schools in connexion with the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, is eligible for employment as a Boy Clerk until the consent of those Departments, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

14. If any case of infectious disease should occur in the house where a Boy Clerk is living, he must immediately report the fact to the Officer under whom he is employed, and must, if required, at once discontinue his attendance. In cases of such enforced absence from his employment, it is in the discretion of the Head of the Department in which he has been serving to allow the Boy Clerk full pay at the usual rate for the period for which it is medically certified that his attendance at the office would be likely to be dangerous to his colleagues.

15. In any year in which an open Competition for situations as Assistant Clerk (Abstractor

Class) in the Civil Service or for Clerkships of the Second Division is held, a Boy Clerk who obtains from the Head of the Department in which he is serving leave of absence to attend such Examination may also, at the discretion of the Head of the Department, be allowed pay, at the usual rate, for the days during which he is attending the Examination.

16. Service Marks for each full period of three calendar months of actual approved service, subject to a maximum of twelve such periods will be allowed to Candidates attending Examinations for the following situations, viz.:—

Clerkships in the Second Division of the

Civil Service,

Second Class Clerkships (Lower Section) for Port Service in the Department of His Majesty's Customs,

Assistantships of Excise, Assistantships of Customs,

who are serving or have served as Boy Clerks; but the number of marks to be allowed for each period may be different at successive examinations.

17. In the promotions of permanent Civil Servants [Assistant Clerks (Abstractor Class) and others] under Clause 15 of the Order in Council of 29th November, 1898, not less than one and not more than two years' approved service as Boy Clerk or Boy Copyist may be allowed to reckon towards the six years' established service required by the said clause.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination of Candidates for registration as Temporary Boy Clerks will be held, under the foregoing Regulations, in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Bristol, Liverpool, Southampton, Aberdeen, Glasgow, Belfast, and Cork, commencing on the 22nd September, 1908.

The number to be registered will depend partly on the requirements of the service, and partly on the number of Candidates who may show sufficient proficiency; but it is not likely to be less than 100, if so many shall be found competent: that is to say, 95 for service in London, Edinburgh, and provincial towns in England, Scotland, and Wales, and 5 for service in Dublin and provincial towns of Ireland exclusively.

No Candidate will be admitted to the Examination from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 27th August, an application, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary

at once.

CHESHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1908. (No. 2.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Special Provision as to Movement to Markets, &c.

1.—(1.) Article 2 (Restriction on Movement of Swine in Scheduled Area) of the Cheshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1908 (in this Order referred to as "the principal Order") shall not apply to the movement of swine from premises in the Scheduled Area to a market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area provided that the swine are accompanied by a Declaration in accordance with this Article.

(2.) In the case of movement to a specially authorised market or saleyard of swine marked as required by Article 5 of the principal Order, the Declaration shall be in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

(3.) In the case of any other movement affected by this Article, the Declaration shall be in the Form B set forth in the said Schedule.

(4.) Every Declaration shall be signed by the owner of the swine or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose and shall be available only if made on the day of movement or the previous day.

(5.) The Declaration shall be delivered up in exchange for the licence for movement of the swine from the market, fairground or saleyard.

(6.) Swine, while being moved under this Order, shall so far as is practicable be kept separate from all other swine, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Declaration, and not elsewhere.

#### Short Title and Construction.

2. This Order may be cited as the CHESHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1908 (No. 2), and shall be read as part of the principal Order.




