The following Address was presented to The King on Tuesday, the 7th July, on the occasion of Their Majesties' visit to Leeds for the opening of the new University buildings in that city:

To Their Most Excellent Majesties King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra.

May it please Your Majesties,

We, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Leeds in Council assembled, desire to approach Your Majesties on behalf of the inhabitants of this City with every assurance of our unabated loyalty and dutiful homage. It is our great privilege to-day to welcome Your Majesties to the Metropolis of the West Riding upon this the first occasion on which You have honoured us with a visit since You ascended the Throne of these Realms.

It is with sincere pleasure that we look back to former occasions on which we have had the gratification of welcoming Members of the Royal Family to Leeds, assembled as we are in the very building which Your Majesty The King's revered Mother, the late Queen Victoria, was

graciously pleased to open just fifty years ago.

Especially do our thoughts revert to-day to that auspicious occasion when in 1885 Your Majesties as Prince and Princess of Wales conferred on the City the great honour of opening the Yorkshire College, which as a result of the zeal and enthusiasm inspired by that gracious act has enjoyed so rapid an expansion and reached a position of such importance that in 1904 it was elevated to the status of a University by Your Royal Charter. It is therefore a source of peculiar satisfaction to us that the object of Your Majesties' presence here to-day should be to inaugurate an extension of that Institution, and we feel that this further manifestation of Your Majesties' deep and continuing interest in the educational and material well-being of our Citizens will tend to encourage and invigorate

the pursuit and study of higher culture in the City and throughout the County.

In conclusion, we venture respectfully to assure Your Majesties of the sincere and unabated loyalty and affection of the inhabitants of Leeds towards Your Majesties and of their fervent prayer that health, happiness and every blessing may be vouchsafed to You and that You may be spared to Your devoted subjects, whose welfare You have so much at heart.

"I am especially gratified to learn that in your community public bodies and private individuals alike have spared no pains to alleviate

viduals alike have spared no pains to alleviate human suffering, by ensuring the efficiency of your hospitals and promoting the care of the

sick and needy.

"I look with astonishment at the great increase of population, wealth, and prosperity which has taken place in your City since Our visit in 1885, to which you refer in such kindly

"The Queen and Myself are glad to think that the establishment of the Yorkshire College,

which has now developed into your wellequipped and efficient University, has borne an important share in the industrial as well as the artistic and intellectual life of your City.

"The growth of the leather industry, of engineering, of clothing, wool and worsted works has been continuous, and has rendered your City famous throughout the world.

"It is by honesty, industry, energy, and perseverance that great traditions are founded; and in all these qualities the people of Yorkshire and

of the city of Leeds are pre-eminent.
"On this occasion I cannot recapitulate the long list of those who have devoted money and time to the development of your Municipality and its Institutions, and to the embellishment of the City; but their names are known to Me, and are household words with you.

"You may be assured that your welfare and happiness will always be a subject of My

warmest solicitude."

We the Members of the University of Leeds desire to express our dutiful loyalty to Your Majesties, and to proffer You a heartfelt welcome to the University which You honour with Your

We bear in grateful memory the visit with which Your Majesties were graciously pleased to honour this Institution, then the Yorkshire College, for the purpose of opening the buildings erected in 1885, as also the occasion on which Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of York graciously consented to open the Hall and Library and the new buildings for our School

of Medicine in 1894.

It is now four years since Your Majesty was graciously pleased to incorporate the Yorkshire College by Royal Charter as the University of And we humbly trust that both the growth in the number of students, and the foundation of fresh departments, which have led to the erection of the further buildings now completed, may be taken as proof that the favours thus shown by Your Majesty have not been bestowed in vain, but that they have already given an impetus to those higher studies, and that advance in scientific, literary, and historical research in which Your Majesty has always shown so deep an interest.

The present extensions are designed not only to provide better accommodation for those literary and historical studies which have an immemorial place in schools of learning, but also to meet the ever-growing needs of scientific study, and of those branches of applied science, such as electrical engineering and metallurgy, which have so direct a bearing upon the industrial life of a great manufacturing community, and which it is one of our first duties as an University to

We recall with gratitude the interest which Your Majesty, following in the steps of Your revered Father and Your Royal Ancestors, has ever shown in the Universities of Your Kingdom, and we are proud to reflect that the same beneficent appreciation of University studies which Your Majesty has already proved, formerly as Chancellor, and now as Protector of the

University of Wales, should have been repeatedly manifested in the case of this University, and of the earlier Institution from which it grew.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:

"On behalf of the Queen and Myself, I tender to you Our cordial thanks for your loyal and

dutiful Address of Welcome.

"We greatly admire the fine buildings which have been added to the equipment of your University, and which will enable you to increase the efficiency and to extend the scope of its teaching, especially the teaching of science, which has already been marked by such notable

results.

"My interest in the great cause of education is well known, and I note with gratification the ever-widening basis of the instruction now undertaken by our great educational institutions. The high standard of moral and intellectual discipline for which our schools and Universities have been distinguished has not been lowered, nor has the pursuit of literary and historical studies been checked by the inclusion in the University curriculum of those scientific studies, and especially of those branches of applied science for which such ample provision has now been made. I rejoice to think that the opportunities open to the young men of our great industrial com-munities of acquiring a knowledge of subjects of commercial utility in an atmosphere of academic culture are being so greatly increased, and I find it difficult to express My appreciation of the manner in which the great responsibilities which rest on the authorities and teachers of a University such as this have been discharged.

"It is a source of pleasure to Me to know that you have provided also for the study of the theory and practice of agriculture, for I am convinced that the best possible results cannot be derived from the industry and natural ability of our farmers unless they are properly instructed

in the scientific aspects of their work

"Already in all parts of the world there are to be found capable and energetic men holding. responsible positions, whose capacity and energy have been fostered by the training which they have received as students of this University, and I am convinced that the result of their academic education has been to equip them, not merely for the attainment of success in their own pursuits, but also to play a distinguished part in the promotion of the welfare of the nation.

"I pray that the blessing of God may attend

your labours."

We, the Chairman and Members of the Committee to whom the Council of the City and County of Bristol have entrusted the management of their Dock undertaking, most humbly offer a heartfelt greeting to Your Majesties, on the occasion of Your coming amongst us to open the Royal Edward Dock.

We beg leave to remind Your Majesties that our City and Port is rich in associations with the history of these islands and of the British Colonies over the Seas, and that it has had no mean share in building up the mighty Empire

We pray that He who rules over all kingdoms will grant to Your Majesties health, joy, and honour, and that He may influence Your subjects, of whatever race and creed, always to serve Your Majesties with one heart and mind, so that under His Divine Providence the blessings of peace and prosperity may rest upon our land.

"No ceremony affords Me greater pleasure than to inaugurate an enterprise designed to increase the prosperity of Our country and to aid

"This Dock, constructed at great expense, by vast labour, and with exceptional skill, will be capable of receiving through its fine entrance piers the largest ships of all the nations.

"I shall watch with great interest the success

of your undertaking."

To Their Most Gracious Majesties King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra.

We, the Master Wardens and Commonalty of Merchant Venturers of the City of Bristol, humbly desire to present to Your Majesties an Address of welcome on the auspicious occasion

of Your Majesties' visit to this City, and the inauguration of our new Dock at Avonmouth, honoured in commemoration of Your gracious presence by the name of The Royal Edward Dock.

Constituted under Charters of Your Majesty's Royal Predecessors on the Throne of England, King Edward VI, Queen Elizabeth, King Charles I, and King Charles II, our Ancient Guild was incorporated for the promotion of the commerce of the City, and for the protection of its Citizen Merchants, and under the privileges thus granted, and the regulations of our Guild, the City of Bristol so prospered as to become the second Port of the Kingdom. Among the duties undertaken by our Society not the least important were those of collecting the revenue and shipping dues of the Port, and of expending these dues in the formation of the Quays and Harbours of the ancient City.

In the performance of these duties our Guild won so high a reputation, both for integrity of purpose and ability in the management of affairs, that the first Citizens of their times were proud to enrol themselves as members of our Society, and to confide to the Merchant Venturers the Trusteeship of their private charities and public One of such was the eminent benefactions. philanthropist of the eighteenth century, Edward Colston, who amongst his other charities, founded a hospital for the boarding, clothing, and education of 100 poor boys, and made the Merchant Venturers Trustees of this bounty, the duties of which Trust since its formation in the year 1708 to the present day, the members of our Guild have

faithfully discharged. Following on these lines and actuated by its guiding desire to promote the interests of the poorer Citizens of Bristol according to the changing circumstances of the times our Society was among the first to recognise the paramount need of practical education for the artisans of this country to meet the rising tide of foreign competition, and as one of the happy pioneers of technical education built and equipped the Institution known as the Merchant Venturers Technical College, which provides the working classes of this City with the means of a technical education in the widest sense and from the lowest to the highest stage.

And now again in the important movement soon, it is hoped, to be crowned with completion by Your Majesty's Royal Charter for the foundation of a University in this City, our Society aspires to co-operate, and by undertaking the technological department of the University to lighten the labours of those who seek to diffuse the love of letters and the spirit of scientific

research.

Always foremost amongst the subjects of the Throne in loyalty and devotion to the Reigning Monarch, we have thus ventured to address Your Majesties, earnestly praying that the blessings of peace, in whose sacred cause Your Majesty's signal and bloodless victories have added fresh lustre to the Crown, may continue to attend Your reign, and that under Your beneficent rule the glories and the strength of the British Empire may be maintained and increased.

"The Queen and I are highly gratified to receive your Address of Welcome from the Master, Wardens, and Commonalty of Merchant Venturers of the City of Bristol.

We, the Members of the Bristol Incorporated Chamber of Commerce and Shipping, as representing the trade and commerce of this ancient City, humbly desire to offer to Your Majesties a most loyal and dutiful welcome on the occasion of Your visit to open the new dock which bears His

Majesty's name.

The ancient Port of Bristol has for many centuries held a high position among the maritime cities of the United Kingdom, and has played an important part in National and Imperial affairs. It was from Bristol the Cabots set forth upon the voyage which resulted in the discovery of the mainland of America, and thus laid the foundation of Your Majesties' world-wide Empire. May it please Your Majesties,

We, the members of the Council and Senate of University College, Bristol, humbly desire to offer to Your Majesties a most loyal and dutiful welcome.

The ancient and loyal City of Bristol has always been zealous in the cause of education. One of its early records concerns Prince Henry, afterwards King Henry II, who for four years was entrusted by Robert, Earl of Gloucester, to one Matthew, of Bristol, to be instructed in letters and in all noble conduct. In mediaeval times the Church was the chief guardian of educational interests; but in the 16th, 17th and 18th centuries rich laymen endowed schools in Bristol, in which the sons of poorer citizens were taught. Amongst these benefactors the names of Robert and Nicholas Thorne, John Carr, John Whitson, and Edward Colston are honourably remembered; and in the last century Hannah More and Mary Carpenter were distinguished as pioneers in special fields of work.

In recent years the educational system of Bristol has been largely extended and strengthened. The old foundations continue their work as is seen in the Grammar School, Queen Elizabeth's Hospital, the Red Maids School, and Colston's Hospital; elementary education has been organised; Clifton College received from Your Majesty's gracious Mother, Queen Victoria, a Royal Charter, giving it a place among public schools; high schools for girls have been estab-lished; the Merchant Venturers Technical College has done valuable work, and Bristol University College, which was founded in 1876, and comprises a Faculty of Arts and Science, and a Faculty of Medicine, with which a Medical School of long standing and high repute has been incorporated, has for upwards of thirty years brought the opportunity of education and training of a University type within the reach of

large numbers of the Citizens.

We humbly trust that Your Majesty will regard with satisfaction the provision that has thus been made in our City for education in its various grades, and will look with favour on our hope that our educational system will be completed and crowned by the establishment of a University in Bristol, similar to those founded in recent years in other important Cities of the Realm. The public spirit and generosity lately shown by a member of a well-known Bristol family in promising the sum of one hundred thousand pounds towards the endowment of a Bristol University, leads us to anticipate that with the help of other liberal benefactors our City may shortly be in a position to crave of Your Majesty the grant of a Royal Charter for the incorporation of this University, and we hope that when the time arrives Your Majesty will take the prayer of your ancient and loyal City of Bristol into Your Majesty's gracious consideration.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:

"It gives the Queen and Myself great pleasure to receive your Address from the University College, Bristol, and I am much interested in the account you have given Me of the progress of education in the City.

"The roll of names quoted by you is a reminder that your citizens showed culture and zeal for learning in times when education was far more difficult of attainment than it is now.

"It is now recognised by the great municipalities and other education authorities of My Kingdom that it is their duty to provide facilities for the acquirement of special knowledge, so that young men may be enabled to obtain efficient equipment, both literary and technical, without travelling to distant Universities to obtain it.

"The generous emulation of rival Cities in this respect is necessarily beneficial, for every addition to the practical efficiency and culture of a community, and every stimulus thereby

supplied to others, are gains to the whole Nation.
"I will take care that your petition for the grant of a Charter for the incorporation of a University in Bristol is referred to a Committee of My Privy Council who will give it careful and sympathetic consideration and then submit to Me their advice.'

"Since a Charter was granted to your School by My beloved Mother in the year 1877, Clifton College has made its mark amongst the public schools of this country. Its name is famous alike for patriotism, scholarship, and sport; and it has developed in a high degree the public spirit, the sense of good comradeship, and the splendid rivalry in all honour and manliness and good feeling, which is the finest tradition of our great schools.

"I am specially gratified to learn that Clifton maintains a modern and efficient system of instruction in science and modern languages. These branches of education are of great importance to a boy's career, whatever profession he may adopt, and the thoroughness of the preparation which Clifton gives is shown by the success of her sons alike in examinations and

practical life.

"I am aware of the wide extension of the powers of Poor Law authorities which recent legislation has made in order that effect may be given to the growing public solicitude for the welfare of the destitute, the sick, and the infirm

of all classes and all ages.

"The difficulty of reconciling the more sympathetic system which modern feeling demands with the economic administration of the public finances is a serious one, demanding for its solution honest, intelligent, and most careful management.

"These considerations, I doubt not, you keep in mind, and your good work has My sincere

sympathy.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

The following Draft Rules are published pursuant to the Rules Publication Act, 1893. Copies may be obtained on application at the Lord Chancellor's Office, House of Lords, S.W.

Draft Rules of the Supreme Court as to Judges' Summonses in the King's Bench Division.

Rules of the Supreme Court (July) 1908. Order LIV., Rule A.

1. All originating summonses and all summonses other than in actions returnable before the Judge and all appeals to the Judge otherwise than in actions, and also all Judges' summonses and appeals to a Judge in actions before the mode and place of trial of such action shall have been fixed, shall be returnable before and be dealt with by a Judge to be from time to time assigned by the Lord Chief Justice to take such The Judge so assigned (in these rules called the Judge for interlocutory business) shall sit either in Court or in Chambers to dispose of such business on such days of the week and at such hour as shall from time to time be directed by the Lord Chief Justice, and urgent applications may be made to the said Judge when not sitting for interlocutory business as well as when he is so sitting. Two or more Judges may be assigned by the Lord Chief Justice to take between them the interlocutory business for such period as he may think fit, but so that for every day one Judge only shall be the assigned Judge for interlocutory business for that day. Urgent applications may be dealt with by any Judge when the Judge for interlocutory business is not available.

2. So far as practicable all Judges' summonses, appeals to a Judge, and applications to a Judge in an action, after the mode and place of trial of the action has been fixed, shall be dealt with by

the Judge who, according to the rotas of business in the King's Bench Division and to the circuits announced for the Judges, may be expected to try such action. Where for any reason this is not practicable, such matters shall be dealt with by the Judge for interlocutory business.

3. The order made on the summons for directions in every action, and every order giving leave to defend under Order 14, shall direct whether the action is to be tried with a special jury or with a common jury, or without a jury (whether by a Judge or otherwise), and shall also direct where the action is to be tried, and the action shall at once be entered accordingly by the party having the carriage of the order in such one of the lists hereinafter mentioned as the master shall direct, but the mode and place of trial so directed may be subsequently altered for sufficient cause on a summons or a notice under the summons for directions issued by either party. If the mode or place of trial is so altered, the action shall thereupon be transferred to the appropriate list.

4. For actions in which the place fixed for trial is Middlesex there shall be such lists for special juries, common juries, and without juries, respectively, as the Lord Chief Justice shall from time to time direct; and every action, so soon as the place and mode of trial are fixed as aforesaid, shall be entered in such one of these lists as may from time to time be directed.

5. All Judges' summonses, appeals to the Judge, and applications to the Judge in actions directed to be tried with a special jury or with a common jury or without a jury (other than circuit cases) shall, unless it be at any time otherwise directed by the Lord Chief Justice, he returnable before a Judge for the time being in charge of the list of special jury, common jury, or without-jury actions respectively, as the case may be, in which the action has been entered or has been ordered to be entered as aforesaid.

6. Notice shall be given to the Judge's clerk of all summonses returnable before and all appeals to a Judge sitting in Middlesex other than the Judge for interlocutory business, and the summonses shall be returnable in Court for Chambers at such time as the Judge may from

time to time direct.

7. All Judges' summonses and all appeals to the Judge in actions directed to be tried on circuit at any assize town shall be returnable before the Judge who according to the rota of business is expected to take the civil business at that assize town, if such Judge shall be in London or if the assize at the town at which the trial is fixed has commenced. If such Judge shall not be in London or at such assize town, such summonses and appeals shall be returnable before and dealt with by the Judge for interlocutory business, unless in any particular case both parties shall agree that a summons shall be taken by the Circuit Judge at an assize town other than that at which the case is to be tried.

8. Any appeal from a District Registrar, and any Judges' summonses or appeals to the Judge in any action or matter proceeding in a District Registry may be heard by any Judge on the circuit within which the registry is situate, notwithstanding that he may not be the Judge before whom, according to the preceding Rules of this Order, such appeal or summons should be

returnable or heard.

9. If for any cause the Judge before whom a summons or appeal should, according to the preceding Rules of this Order be returnable or heard is not available, or in any case of a Judge's summons or appeal not herein provided

for, such summons or appeal may be made returnable before or heard by the Judge for interlocutory business.

10. Lists shall be made and published of all summonses and appeals for hearing before the Judge for interlocutory business for each day on which he shall sit, as heretofore done in Judge's Chambers, and when summonses and appeals are in fact heard in Court, the hearing is to be deemed to be in Chambers, and all persons who would have a right of audience in Judge's Chambers may be heard on such matters, and there shall be no further right to publish the proceedings without leave than if the hearing were in fact in Chambers. Lists of summonses returnable before any Judge other than the Judge for interlocutory business shall, when necessary, be made by the Judge's clerk, as in the Commercial Court.

11. For the purpose of exercising every authority conferred by Statute, Order, or Rule upon the Judge at Chambers, and not hereinbefore specifically provided for, the Judge for interlocutory business shall be the Judge at

Chambers.

12. These Rules shall not affect the practice of the Commercial Court as to summonses, which shall continue as heretofore.

13. These rules shall come into operation on the 12th of October, 1908. They may be cited as the Rules of the Supreme Court (July) 1908, or each Rule may be cited by the heading thereof with reference to the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1883.

Should a vessel approach the towing-train in such a manner as to threaten collision, a blue light will be shown from the tug. By day.—Two black cones, point down. The above signals indicate that the vessel showing them is towing one or several targets, which may be as much as one mile astern of her. Also, that the tug is obstructed more or less in her ability to manceuvre.

(b) Targets in tow.—At night, when gun practice is not being carried out at towed targets, and circumstances will permit of it, a white light,

visible all round the horizon, will be shown from the end of the last target. If gun practice is taking place, or about to take place, this light will not, as a rule, be displayed. The exhibition of a light from the target cannot therefore be relied on.

(c) Targets at anchor.—Every target at anchor shall exhibit a white light visible round the horizon.

Caution.—When approaching a vessel which is firing, special caution is required. By night, the direction of the rays of the searchlights will afford an indication of the direction of fire and the position of the targets.
