

thereafter continue to be the parish church of the united benefice.

"2. That upon the union taking effect the table of fees used in the church which will become the church of the united benefice shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the table of fees for the united parish.

"3. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms marriages and burials of the parish of Saint Luke, Charlton, and of the new parish of Saint Paul, Charlton, shall be placed in the custody of the Incumbent of the united benefice and shall so continue.

"PART III.

"As to the endowments of the united benefice we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further recommend and propose:—

"1. That upon the union taking effect all the properties, revenues and income constituting the endowments of the rectory of Saint Luke, Charlton, and of the rectory of Saint Paul, Charlton (other than the present parsonage house of the rectory of Saint Luke, Charlton and the grounds appurtenant thereto or heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith) shall be transferred and annexed to the united benefice.

"2. The Incumbent for the time being of the united benefice shall out of the endowments and income so transferred pay a stipend of not less than one hundred and fifty pounds per annum to an assistant curate to be duly licensed by the bishop to perform the office of stipendiary curate in the united parish.

"3. That upon the union taking effect the present parsonage house of the rectory of Saint Paul, Charlton, shall be the parsonage house of the united benefice.

"PART IV.

"Upon the subject of patronage, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further recommend and propose:—

"That the patronage of the united benefice shall be vested in the said Spencer Pocklington Maryon Maryon-Wilson his heirs and assigns.

"PART V.

"As to the present parsonage house of the rectory of Saint Luke, Charlton, and the site and appurtenances thereof, and as to the proceeds of any sale or sales thereof, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further recommend and propose:—

"1. That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the present parsonage house of Saint Luke, Charlton, and the site and the appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient.

"2. That the net proceeds to arise from such sale shall form one aggregate fund and shall be applied as follows, and in the following order, that is to say:—

"(a) That we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, shall out of such aggregate fund first set apart a capital sum not exceeding two thousand pounds for or towards the acquisition of a suitable site for and the erection of or otherwise for the provision of a parsonage house for a new district to be constituted wholly or in part out of the united parish but until the said capital sum shall be so applied the interest thereon shall be applied towards the payment of the sum of one hundred pounds per annum next hereinafter

mentioned if required for that purpose and if not so required shall be added to and applied as the income of the residue of the said aggregate fund.

"(b) That we shall out of such aggregate fund (if it shall suffice) next set apart a capital sum the interest whereon shall amount to one hundred pounds per annum and such interest shall be paid by way of additional income to the Incumbent of the united benefice so long as there shall be payable to the Reverend Charles Swainson, late rector of Saint Luke, Charlton, the pension assigned to him out of the revenues of the said benefice upon his retirement therefrom under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts and when such pension shall cease to be payable the sum so set aside shall fall into and form part of the residue of the said aggregate fund and shall be applied as such residue is hereinafter directed to be applied.

"(c) That we shall apply the residue of the said aggregate fund for the endowment or augmentation of the income of the minister or Incumbent of the new district for the provision of a parsonage house for which the sum of two thousand pounds is to be set aside as aforesaid."

And whereas the said scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwark.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixteenth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the particular district of Saint Thomas, Crookes, in the county of York and in the diocese of York.
