COAL MINES REGULATION ACT, 1896.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make the following Orders under the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901:—

 An Order under section 40 (4) granting a special exception as to meal times in Florists' Workshops.

(2) An Order under section 45 granting a special exception as to holidays for persons employed (a) in Florists' Workshops and (b) in Hospital Laundries in Scotland.

(3) An Order under section 46 granting a special exception to Florists' Workshops as to employment inside and outside the workshop on the same day.

(4) An Order under section 49 consolidating existing Orders with regard to the overtime employment of women for press of work, viz.: the Orders of 29th December, 1903, and 15th November, 1904:—and extending the special exception contained in these Orders to Florists' Workshops.
