THE MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.
Borough of Bangor.

WHEREAS the Council of the Borough of Bangor have made application to the Local Government Board for the issue of regulations:—

(a) Under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, and section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, for restricting to five miles per hour the speed at which any motor car may be driven within the limits comprising the following roads within the Borough; that is to say, High-street and Dean-street; and

(b) Under sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, for restricting to ten miles per hour the speed at which any motor car may be driven within the limits comprising the following roads and parts of roads within the Borough; that is to say—

So much of Holyhead-road as extends from High-street to Menai View Outlook;

So much of Carnarvon-road as extends from High-street to the boundary of the Borough; Farrar-road; Beach-road, Beach-row, and

Strand-street; Garth-road and so much of Menai-road as extends therefrom to the western end of Garth-terrace; College-road and Upper Garth-road; and Friddoedd-road:

And whereas notice of the said application and of the time and manner in which objections should be made to any such regulation appeared in the London Gazette of the 7th day of April, 1908, and in the "North Wales Chronicle," of the 10th day of April, 1908:

And whereas certain objections to the making of any regulation in pursuance of the said provisions have been received by the Local Government Board, and it is expedient that further inquiry should be made in the matter of the said application:

Notice is hereby given that F. J. Willis, Esq., Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the Local Government Board, will attend at the Town Hall, Bangor, on Saturday, the 19th day of September, 1908, at 10.45 o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a local inquiry into the subject matter of the said application:

And notice is hereby further given that any person interested may attend at such inquiry, and be heard with reference to the said application.
