ORDER of the Local Government Board: . Motor Car Act, 1903. Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

URBAN DISTRICT OF WATFORD.

To the County Council of Hertford:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Hertford, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said Subsection putting the above-mentioned provisions of that Sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the Urban District of Watford, in the County of Hertford, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:-

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the Urban District of Watford which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and

eight.

SCHEDULE.

Chalk Hill, extending from its junction with High-street to its junction with Villiers-road;

So much of Pinner-road as extends from its junction with High-street to its junction with Capel-road;

So much of Aldenham-road as extends from the northern boundary of the School Premises situate therein to its junction with Pinner-road;

So much of High-street as extends from its junction with Chalk Hill to its junction with Upton-road;

So much of King-street as extends from its junction with High-street to its junction with George-street;

George-street, extending from its junction with King-street to its junction with Vicarageroad;

So much of Queen's-road as extends from its junction with High-street to a point in the road situate 10 yards north of its junction with Derby-

BOROUGH OF HUDDERSFIELD.

WHEREAS the majority of the Council of the borough of Huddersfield on the fifteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eight, agreed to petition, and the Council of the said borough thereupon petitioned His Majesty for an alteration of the number and boundaries of the wards of the said borough;

And whereas His Majesty has been pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council and in pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in His Majesty by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882," as amended by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1893," to fix the number of wards into which the borough of Huddersfield shall be divided, and to order and direct that the said borough shall thenceforth be divided into fifteen wards, which Order was made on the ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eight;

And whereas on the twenty-ninth day of April, in the year last aforesaid, the Right Honourable Herbert John Gladstone, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did duly warrant and appoint me, Samuel Pope, Esquire, Barristerat-Law, a Commissioner, to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of such wards and for apportioning the Councillors of the said borough among such wards.

Now I, the said Samuel Pope, in pursuance of the powers given me by virtue of the said appointment under the said Acts, do hereby determine as hereinafter mentioned the boundaries of the said fifteen wards into which the said borough is divided, which wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows (that is to say):—

- 1. Longwood Ward.
- 2. Lindley Ward.
- 3. Birkby Ward.
- 4. Fartown Ward.
- 5. Dalton, Bradley and Deighton Ward.
- 6. Marsh Ward.
- . 7. Paddock Ward.
- 8. West Central Ward.
- 9. North Central Ward.
- 10. South Central Ward.
- 11. Moldgreen Ward.
- 12. Almondbury Ward.
- 13. Newsome Ward.
- 14. Crosland Moor Ward.
- 15. Lockwood Ward.

And where in the following descriptions of the ward boundaries (so far as such descriptions do not refer to the borough boundary) a street, road, footpath or fence is given as the boundary of a ward, the boundary is to be taken as the centre of such street, road, footpath or fence, and where any street or road is described as joining another street or road, the point of junction is to be taken as the point at which lines drawn along the centres of the two streets or roads, and continued, would intersect each other, and a point described as being opposite a street or road is to be taken as opposite the centre of the street or road.

And where a river or stream is given as the boundary of a ward, the boundary (except where it refers to the borough boundary) is to be taken as the medium filum of such river or stream.

And where reference is made to the borough boundary, the already determined boundary line of the borough is meant.

And in the event of any discrepancy between the the map and the description, the Ordnance Survey Map (2nd Edition, 1906-7) shall prevail.

No. 1.-Longwood Ward

I do hereby determine that Longwood Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Huddersfield as lies within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point on the northerly boundary of the said borough at the junction of Lindley Moor-road and Weather Hill-road, thence proceeding in a north-westerly, south-easterly and south-westerly direction along such boundary I'ne to a point in New Hey-road near its junction with Royal George-road, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the same boundary line to a point in the River Colne 17 yards west of Lower Bank House Mill, thence in a north-easterly direction along that river to its junction with the stream which runs along the west side of Johnny Moore's Hill and Cloughroad, thence in a northerly direction along the course of the said stream to Paddock Head, thence in a westerly direction along Quarmby-road to its junction with Longwood-road, thence along that road, Vicarage-road and Thornhill-road to a point 33 yards south of its junction with Ballroyd Clough-road, thence in a north-westerly direction by an undefined straight line to the south-east corner of the public recreation ground, thence along the south-west side of such recreation ground to Longwood Edge, thence along Longwood Edge to the public footpath at a point about 200 yards north-west of Haugh's-lane, thence in a northerly direction along such public footpath to New Hey-road, thence in a westerly direction along that road for a distance of 45 yards, thence in a northerly direction along another public footpath to Hill Top-road, thence along that road to its junction with Crosland-road, thence along that road to its juuction with Lindley Moor-road and thence in a north-easterly direction along that road to the point first above described.

No. 2.—Lindley Ward.

I do hereby determine that Lindley Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as lies within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point on the northerly boundary of the said borough at the junction of the two un-named roads leading to Grimscar Foot at Reap Hirst, thence proceeding in a westerly direction along such boundary line to the junction of Lindley Moor-road and Weather Hill-road, thence in a south-westerly direction along Lindley Moor-road to its junction with Crosland-road, thence in a southerly direction along that road to its junction with Hill Top-road, thence along that road to the public footpath leading to New Hey-road, thence along that footpath to New Heyroad, thence in an easterly direction along that road for a distance of 45 yards, thence in a southerly direction along another public footpath to a point in Longwood Edge about 200 yards north-west of Haugh's-lane, thence in a southeasterly direction along the said Longwood Edge to the south-west corner of the public recreation ground, thence along the south-west side of such recreation ground for its whole length, thence along an undefined straight line to Thornhillroad at a point 33 yards south of its junction with Ballroyd Clough-road, thence along the said Thornhill-road and Vicarage-road to a point in the latter road opposite the north corner of the

Longwood Vicarage grounds, thence in a northeasterly direction along a well-defined fence for a distance of about 90 yards to the angle in Cliffe-lane, thence along that lane to its junction with Quarmby-road, thence across that road and along Reinwood-road to New Hey-road, thence in a south-easterly direction along that road to its junction with Thornhill-road, Lindley, thence in a northerly direction along that road to its junction with Halifax-road, thence in a south-easterly direction along that road to its junction with Brian-road, thence in a northeasterly and northerly direction along that road to its junction with Birkby-road, thence along that road to its junction with Reap Hirst-road, thence along that road to its junction with the road leading to Grimscar Foot, and thence along the said road leading to Grimscar Foot to the point first above described.

No. 3.—Birkby Ward.

I do hereby determine that Birkby Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as lies within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the said borough in Lightridge-road 140 yards south-east of its junction with Jilley Royd-lane, proceeding thence along such boundary line in a south-westerly direction to the junction of the two-unnamed roads leading to Grimscar Foot at Reap Hirst, thence in a southerly direction along the road leading to Reap Hirstroad, thence along that road to its junction with Birkby-road, thence along that road to its junction with Brian-road, thence in an easterly direction along Birkby Hall-road to Birkby Lodge-road, thence in a south-easterly direction along that road to its junction with Blacker-road North, thence in an easterly direction along that road to the north corner of the cemetery, thence in a south-easterly direction by a public footpath to the east corner of the cemetery, thence in a north-easterly direction along an intended new road past St. John's Church to St. John'sroad, thence across that road, thence in a northeasterly and easterly direction along Willow-lane to its junction with Halifax Old-road, thence in a north-westerly direction along that road to its junction with Yew-street, thence in a northeasterly direction along that street, Spaines-road and Wasp Nest-road to its junction with Bradford-road North, thence in a northerly direction along that road to its junction with Harry-lane, and thence in a north-westerly direction along that lane and Lightridge-road to the point first above described.

No. 4.—Fartown Ward.

I do hereby determine that Fartown Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as lies within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point at the junction of Chestnut-street and the road leading to Fieldhouse, thence proceeding in a westerly direction along the said Chestnut-street to its junction with Sheepridge-road, thence in a south-westerly direction along that road to its junction with Ash Browroad, thence in a westerly and north-westerly direction along that road to its junction with Bradford-road North near the New Inn, thence in a southerly direction along that road to its junction with Wasp Nest-road, thence in a south-westerly direction along that road to its junction with Spaines-road, thence along that road to its junction with Spaines-road, thence along that road to its junction with Yew-street, thence

along that street to its junction with Halifax Old-road, thence in a south-easterly direction along Halifax Old-road to its junction with Bradford-road, thence across that road and along Willow-lane East and Hillhouse-road to Leeds-road, thence across that road and along Thistle-street to St. Andrew's-road, thence across that road and along Hebble Beck to its junction with the River Colne, thence in a north-easterly direction along the said river to a point where the proposed new road in continuance of Old Field-house-lane will meet the said river, thence in a north-westerly direction along the said proposed new road, Old Fieldhouse-lane and the road leading to Fieldhouse to the point first above described.

No. 5.—Dalton, Bradley and Deighton Ward.

I do hereby determine that Dalton, Bradley and Deighton Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as lies within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point on the north-easterly boundary of the said borough at the junction of the River Colne and the River Calder and proceeding in a north-westerly, westerly and southwesterly direction along such boundary line to Lightridge-road, thence in a south-easterly direction along that road and Harry-lane to its junction with Bradford-road North, thence across that road, thence in a south-easterly and easterly direction along Ash Brow-road to its junction with Sheepridge-road, thence in a northeasterly direction along that road to its junction with Chestnut-street, thence in an easterly direction along that street to its junction with the road leading to Fieldhouse, thence in a southeasterly direction along that road to its junction with Old Fieldhouse-lane, thence along that lane and the proposed new road in continuation thereof to the River Colne, thence in a south-westerly direction along the said river to a point therein near Read Holliday and Sons Limited Works, 120 yards below the weir, thence in an easterly direction along an undefined straight line to Kilner Bank-road at a point opposite the public footpath leading to Dalton Fold, thence along the said footpath to Dalton Fold, thence in a south-easterly direction along Dalton Fold-lane to Little Carr Green-lane, thence in a southerly direction along that lane to Long-lane, thence in a north-easterly direction along that lane and Briggate to Briggate Bridge, thence in a south-easterly direction along Lees Head Beck to the borough boundary, and thence in an easterly and northerly direction along the said boundary line to the point first above described.

No. 6.-Marsh Ward.

I do hereby determine that Marsh Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as lies within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point at the junction of Halifax Old-road and Willow-lane, thence proceeding in a westerly and south-westerly direction along that lane to St. John's-road, thence across that road and along the proposed new road past St. John's Church to the east corner of the cemetery, thence in a north-westerly direction along a public footpath to the north corner of such cemetery, thence in a south-westerly direction along Blacker-road North to its junction with Birkby Lodge-road, thence in a north-westerly direction along that road to Birkby Hall-road, thence in a westerly direction along

that road to its junction with Brian-road, thence in a southerly and south-westerly direction along that road to its junction with Halifax-road, thence in a north-westerly direction along that road to its junction with Thornhill-road, thence in a southerly direction along that road to its junction with New Hey-road, thence in an easterly direction along that road to its junction with Luck-lane, thence in a southerly direction along that lane to its junction with Jim-lane, thence in a south-easterly direction along that lane and Dingle-road to its junction with Heatonroad, thence in an easterly direction along that road to its junction with Gledholt-road, thence in a northerly direction along that road to its junction with West-hill, thence in a southeasterly direction along the said West-hill, Trinity-street and West-parade and Westgate to a point in Westgate opposite the easterly boundary wall of the Huddersfield Railway Station, thence in a north-easterly direction along the said easterly boundary of the said station and railway to a point where such railway crosses over Bradford-road, and thence in a northerly direction along that road to the point first above described.

No. 7.—Paddock Ward.

I do hereby determine that Paddock Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as lies within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point at the junction of Heaton-road and Gledholt-road, thence proceeding in a westerly direction along the said Heatonroad to its junction with Dingle-road, thence in a north-westerly direction along that road and Jim-lane to its junction with Luck-lane, thence in a northerly direction along that lane to its junction with New Hey-road, thence in a northwesterly direction along that road to its junction with Reinwood-road, thence in a south-westerly direction along that road to its junction with Quarmby-road, thence across that road and along Cliffe-lane to the angle in that lane, thence along a well-defined fence to Vicarage-road, opposite the north corner of the Longwood Vicarage grounds, thence in a south-easterly and easterly direction along that road, Longwood-road and Quarmby-road to Paddock Head, thence in a southerly direction along the stream which runs along the west side of Clough-road, and Johnny Moore's-hill to its junction with the River Colne, thence in an easterly direction along that river to the westerly side of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Viaduct, thence in a northeasterly direction along the westerly side of that viaduct to Longroyd-lane, thence in a northerly direction along the east side of the Triangle at Paddock Foot, and thence along Gledholt Bank to the point first above described

No. 8.-West Central Ward.

I do hereby determine that West Central Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as lies within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point at the junction of Westparade and Upperhead-row, thence proceeding in a north-westerly direction along the said Westparade, Trinity-street and West-hill to its junction with Gledholt-road, thence in a southerly direction along the said road, Glenholt Bank and the east side of the Triangle at Paddock Foot to Longroyd-lane, thence in a south-westerly direction along the westerly side of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Viaduct to the River

Colne, thence in an easterly direction along that river to Folly Hall, thence in a north-easterly direction along the said Folly Hall and Chapel-hill to its junction with Buxton-road, thence in a westerly direction along South-parade to its junction with Manchester-street, thence across that street to its junction with Upperhead-row, thence in a northerly direction along the said Upperhead-row to the point first above described.

No. 9.-North Central Ward.

I do hereby determine that North Central Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as lies within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point at the junction of Hebble Beck with the River Colne, thence proceeding in a north-westerly direction along the said Beck to St. Andrew's-road, thence across that road and along Thistle-street to Leeds-road, thence across that road and along Hillhouse-lane to its junction with Willow-lane East, thence along that lane to its junction with Bradford-road, thence in a southerly direction along that road to the easterly boundary of the railway, thence in a south-westerly direction along the easterly side of the said easterly boundary of that railway and the Huddersfield Railway Station, to a point in Westgate opposite the easterly boundary wall of the said station, thence in an easterly direction along Westgate to its junction with John Williamstreet, thence across that street, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along Kirkgate to its junction with Old Post Office-yard, thence along the south side of that yard to Castlegate, thence in a southerly direction along Castlegate to its junction with Dock-street, thence in an easterly direction along that street and an undefined straight line in continuation thereof and across the canal to the towing path, thence in a northerly direction along that path to Turnbridge-road, thence in an easterly direction along that road and an undefined straight line in continuation thereof to the River Colne, and thence in a northerly direction along that river to the point first above described.

No. 10.—South Central Ward.

I do hereby determine that South Central Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as lies within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point in the River Colne opposite an undefined straight line in continuation of Turnbridge-road, thence proceeding in a westerly direction along that undefined straight line and Turnbridge-road to the canal towing path, thence in a southerly direction along that towing path to a point opposite an undefined straight line in continuation of Dock-street, thence in a westerly direction along that undefined straight line and across the canal and along Dock-street to its junction with Castlegate, thence in a northerly direction along Castlegate to its junction with Old Post Office-yard, thence in a westerly direction along the south side of that yard to its junction with Kirkgate, thence in a north-westerly and westerly direction along the said Kirkgate to its junction with John William-street, thence across that street and along Westgate to its junction with Upperhead-row, thence in a southerly direction along that row to its junction with Manchester-street, thence in an easterly direction across that street and along South-parade to its junction with Buxton-road and Chapel-hill, thence in a south-westerly direction along Chapel-hill and Folly Hall to the

River Colne, and thence in an easterly and northeasterly direction along that river to the point first above described.

No. 11.-Moldgreen Ward.

I do hereby determine that Moldgreen Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as lies within the following boundary:—

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated August 25th, from His Majesty's Representative at Sofia, enclosing copies of Circulars issued by the Bulgarian Government declaring the towns of Kazan, Ghelindjin, and Restov in Russia to be infected with Cholera.

A later Despatch, dated August 27th, states that a further Circular has been issued declaring the Russian provinces of Tiflis, Saroslav, and Tavris to be infected by Cholera.

The following measures are prescribed for

arrivals from Rostov :-

(1) Vessels arriving directly from a contaminated port will only have free access at Varna and Silistria. Free entry exclusively at the Bulgarian Port of Silistria will only be allowed to vessels which have already submitted to quarantine at Sulina. Passengers of such vessels will be required to submit to a medical visit, after which they will be under surveillance at their place of abode. Their effects will be strictly disinfected.

(2) Vessels arriving at Varna from a con-taminated port will spend five days in quarantine and will be carefully disinfected. The water in the tanks will be emptied, disinfected, and renewed, drinking water will be treated in the same way. Passengers who leave the vessels in question will spend five days in quarantine, and will be submitted to a surveillance of ten days at their stopping place. Their property will be carefully disinfected.

(3) Traffic in Bulgarian ports is forbidden to all vessels leaving a contaminated port if during the voyage or in the last seven days a case of cholera has been declared. Bulgarian subjects who find themselves on board a vessel which is contaminated, whether they are ill or not, will be received ashore, but the vessel

must return.

(4) Vessels carrying the Bulgarian flag and having on board a case of cholera will by virtue of special permission of the Medical Council have free entry at the port of Varna in

order to pass quarantine.

(5) When cholera is declared on board a "free" vessel, or on a vessel which has passed the quarantine, it will be necessary to act in accordance with Sections 3 and 4 of the

present Circular.

(6) Goods proceeding from a contaminated port and carried in a non-contaminated vessel will only be allowed to be imported into Bulgaria on condition that 15 days have elapsed since their departure.

(7) The entry of goods coming from a non-contaminated port on the Black Sea is free, provided that they have not been in contact with others which are contaminated or coming from a contaminated port.

(8) The entry of the following contaminated

goods is probibited :-

- (a) Clothing and used linen, cloths, counterpanes, and all kinds of used articles which arrive in the form of merchandise.
 - (b) Old used sacks and all kinds of tow. (c) Crude products of animals, skins,

bones, etc.

(d) All kinds of fruit and vegetables.
(9) The entry into Bulgaria of postal correspondence, new books and newspapers coming from a contaminated port is free.

(10) The entry by post of parcels coming from a contaminated port will not be allowed.

(11) Mayors of districts must keep an exact list of those travellers who arrive from a contaminated port, and are submitted to the quarantine of 10 days.
