THE TERRITORIAL OFFICERS' DECORA-TION WARRANT.

EDWARD R. & I.

Whereas it is Our Royal Desire to reward the long and meritorious services of Officers of proved capacity in Our Territorial Force; Now for the purpose of attaining this end, We have instituted, constituted and created, and by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, do institute, constitute and create a.new Decoration which We are desirous should be highly prized by the Officers of Our Territorial Force; and We are graciously pleased to make, ordain and establish the following rules and ordinances for the government of the same, which shall from henceforth be observed and kept:

Firstly.—It is ordained that the Decoration shall be styled and designated "The Territorial Decoration," and shall consist of an Oak Wreath

in silver tied with gold, having in the centre the Royal Cipher and Crown in gold.

Secondly.—It is ordained that the Decoration shall be suspended on the left breast from a silver Oak bar-brooch by a green riband of one inch and a half in width with a yellow stripe

down the centre.

Thirdly.—It is ordained that the Decoration may be worn by Us, Our Heirs and Successors, Kings and Queens Regnant of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland; and it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to confer the Decoration upon any of the Princes of the Royal Family of Great Britain and Ireland.

Fourthly.—It is ordained that no person shall be eligible for this Decoration who is in possession of the Volunteer Officers' Decoration nor shall he be nominated thereto unless he is or was a Commissioned Officer and has served twenty years in Our Territorial Force, including previous commissioned service in Our Yeomanry Cavalry, Imperial Yeomanry, or Volunteer Force, previous service qualifying for the Colonial Auxiliary

Forces, or Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, Officers' Decoration, and all service as an acting or honorary officer of a Cadet Corps, or Cadet Battalion, after attaining the age of seventeen years—is recommended by the Commanding Officer of the Unit in which he has served—and is duly certified by the District Military Authorities in which the Unit is located, as having been an efficient and thoroughly capable Officer, in every way deserving of such a Decoration; Provided nevertheless and We do hereby declare that half of any time during which an Officer of Our Territorial Force may have served in the ranks of Our said Force, or in the ranks of Our Yeomanry Cavalry, Imperial Yeomanry, or Volunteer Force, or of a Cadet Corps, or Cadet Battalion, after attaining the age of seventeen years, shall reckon as qualifying service towards

the twenty years required as aforesaid.
Fifthly.—It is ordained that the names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer the Decoration shall be published in the London Gazette, and a Registry thereof kept in the office of Our Principal Secretary of State for War.

Sixthly.—In order to make such additional provision as shall effectually preserve pure this most honourable Distinction, it is ordained that, if any person on whom it shall be conferred be convicted of any act derogatory to his honour as an Officer and gentleman, his name shall forthwith be erased from the Registry of individuals upon whom the said Decoration shall have been conferred, by an order from Us under Our Royal Sign Manual; and a notification thereof shall be duly published in the London Gazette.

Lastly.—We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs, and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with these regulations, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Royal Sign

Manual.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 21st, from His Majesty's Representative at Christiania, enclosing the following translation of a Circular issued by the Norwegian Government regarding the measures to be taken to prevent cholera from entering Norway:—

From the Royal Department of Justice and Police.

In accordance with the Act, dated 26th June, 1893, and Royal Ordinance of the 14th July, the following Regulations as to measures in consequence of cholera are to be observed.

- 1. Persons arriving in Norway by land or water from a foreign cholera infected or declared district, either direct or viâ an uninfected district, shall, after arrival at place of destination in this country, instantly give notice to the health committee or one of the officers of the same. They shall also during the first 5 days after arrival in this country daily apply to the health committee or an officer of the same at any place where they stay over night or more than 12 hours. Such notice is to be given direct or indirect through the one who receives travellers as boarders.
- 2. Anyone who receives travellers as boarders shall, on arrival of travellers from any foreign cholera infected or declared district, and who have not been staying 5 days within the borders of the country, instantly give notice to the health committee or officer of the same.
- 3. Masters of vessels arriving in Norway and to whom the rules in the quarantine notice of 4th September, 1893, section 1, apply, shall produce to the customs officers a list of the crew and passengers of their vessels, giving their names, station, homestead, and address, and whether they have been staying at any cholera infected place (giving names of places and time).

4. Before the quarantine flag is allowed to be hoisted down on any vessel which is not put in quarantine, the quarantine commission or the examining doctor, custom house officer, or pilot foreman, shall fill in a card for each traveller who in accordance with above rules has to report himself. Provided the traveller intends, before 5 days, to leave the place of landing, the one who has issued the card has to inform the health committee at the place where the traveller intends to stay at night, or more than 12 hours.

A list of the persons who intend to stay ashore or leave the vessel, is to be sent with information regarding the destination of such

Contraventions of the above measures are, provided no severer punishment is applicable, punishable in accordance with the Civil Crimes Act, section 357—fines or imprisonment up to 3 months.

A further Circular states that the Bulgarian Government has ordered that travellers coming from contaminated places in Russia, who have made a journey of 7 days up to their arrival in Bulgaria will be submitted to a strict medical visit, a disinfection of their clothes and baggage, and also to a surveillance of 5 days at their homes or stopping places.
