MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of the North Riding of Yorkshire.

HEREAS by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, by regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hercinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any specified kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous:

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of the North Riding of Yorkshire have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made under section 6 of the Act of 1896, and section 8 of the Act of 1903, for prohibiting the driving of motor cars on the following highways or parts of highways within the urban district of Whitby, that is to say:

It is hereby notified, for general information, in conformity with Article 3 of the Regulations for the prevention of contagious, infectious and epidemic diseases, published by Government Notice No. 165 of the 28th ultimo, that the following places are regarded as infected places within the meaning of Article 1 of the said Regulations, and will be, until further notice, dealt with as such, viz.:—The Regency of Tunis, as a small-pox infected place; Arabia (excepting Perim and Aden), Rostow, Taganrog, Novorossisk, Batoum, Theodosia, Kertch and Odessa, as cholera-infected places; India and Alexandria, as plague-infected places. Government Notice 179 of the 8th instant is hereby repealed.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a cop of a Despatch, dated September 25th, from His Majesty's Representative at Brussels transmitting the following copy of a Decree which appeared in the "Moniteur Belge" imposing new Sanitary Regulations on ships arriving at Antwerp :-

Service sanitaire d'Anvers.—Surveillance des navires en déchargement.

LÉOPOLD II, Roi des Belges,

A tous présents et à venir, Salut. Vu le décret du 18 juillet 1831, sur la police sanitaire;

Vu l'arrêté royal du 17 août 1831, prescrivant

des mesures sanitaires;

Vu l'arrêté royal du 8 février 1897, relatif à l'organisation et aux attributions des autorités sanitaires ;

Vu l'arrêté royal du 8 mars 1898, relatif aux navires remontant l'Escaut sans avoir subi la visite à la station sanitaire du Doel;

Vu l'arrêté royal du 10 juin 1908, instituant un

service sanitaire à Anvers;

Considérant que la convention sanitaire internationale de Paris 1903, ratifiée le 6 avril 1907, recommande entre autres objets qu'il soit établi dans les grands ports de navigation maritime une surveillance médicale permanente de l'état sanitaire des équipages et qu'elle détermine les mesures à appliquer aux navires porteurs de rongeurs atteints de peste;

Vu l'avis de la commission sanitaire de

l'Escaut;

Sur la proposition de Notre Ministre de l'agriculture ad interim,

Nous avons arrêté et arrêtons:

Art. 1er. Endéans les deux heures de l'ancrage de son navire en rade d'Anvers, de son amarrage à quai ou de son entrée dans les bassins, tout capitaine d'un navire dispensé de la patente de santé devra se rendre ou envoyer un de ses officiers au bureau sanitaire pour y montrer ses papiers de bord et répondre aux questions d'ordre

sanitaire qui lui seront posées.

Art. 2. Tout capitaine d'un navire non dispense de la patente de santé qui n'aurait pu subir la visite à la station sanitaire de Doel, par suite de circonstances de force majeure, ancrera son navire en rade d'Anvers, à l'endroit qui lui sera indiqué par le pilotage et y attendra, sous quarantaine, la visite de l'agent sanitaire.

Il devra notamment hisser le pavillon et exhiber les feux prescrits par l'article 2 de l'arrêté royal du 8 mars 1898 et empêcher toute communication avant l'admission à la libre pratique.

Art. 3. Tout capitaine de navire admis à la libre pratique au port d'Anvers est soumis à la surveillance du service sanitaire.

Cette surveillance sera exercée de manière à ne pas entraver les opérations de déchargement du navire.

Art. 4. Si, au cours de cette surveillance, des accidents, tels que la survenance d'un malade atteint de maladie pestilentielle, ou la présence de rongeurs reconnus ou soupçonnés pesteux, ou des communications de nature suspecte sont constates, le capitaine devra, sur réquisition soit de la commission, soit de l'agent sanitaire, suspendre toute opération et se conformer aux indications qui lui seront données par la commission sanitaire ou l'agent susdit.

Art. 5. Dans ce cas, le capitaine est tenu

notamment:

1° D'arborer immédiatement sur son navire un pavillon de couleur jaune et d'exhiber de nuit les feux prescrits par l'article 2 de l'arrêté royal du 8 mars 1898;

2° D'empêcher toute communication avec terre

ou avec d'autres navires;

3° Eventuellement, de faire conduire

navire dans le lieu qui lui sera indiqué;

4° De se soumettre aux mesures extraordinaires de surveillance, d'isolement, de désinfection et de dératisation qui seront ordonnées par les autorités sanitaires, conformément aux prescriptions de la convention sanitaire internationale de Paris 1903.

Art. 6. Toutes les fois que des faits, visés à l'article 4, auront conduit l'agent sanitaire à enjoindre verbalement au capitaine de suspendre les opérations de déchargement du navire, l'agent sanitaire devra, dans le plus bref délai, et en tout cas endéans les deux heures, remettre au commandant du navire un ordre écrit de suspension des opérations de chargement et de déchargement du navire.

Art. 7. L'agent sanitaire devra de même, dans le plus bref délai possible, et en tout cas endéans les deux heures, notifier, par la voie la plus rapide, la situation au président de la commission sanitaire et au bourgmestre de la ville.

Endéans le même délai, une notification sera faite télégraphiquement au identique

ministre de l'agriculture.

Art. 8. Les infractions au présent arrêté seront punies des peines comminées par le décret sanitaire du 18 juillet 1831.

Art. 9. Notre Ministre de l'agriculture ad interim est chargé de l'exécution du présent arrêté, qui entrera en vigueur le 1er octobre

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following translation of a Notice, dated September 23rd, issued by the Danish Government, prescribing the measures to be taken for the prevention of the introduction of cholera into Denmark :-

In virtue of \$23 (c.f. §15) in the Notice of the Ministry of Justice of May, 14, 1900, the following is herewith decreed:-

Until further notice every person who desires to enter the Kingdom by sea from any country

against which the Health Regulations in virtue of the above mentioned Notice of the Ministry of Justice of May 14, 1900, Section 2 I, have been imposed, is required to furnish the Quarantine Commission or the Customs Inspection with his full name and place of destination and so far as possible with his address here.

The information thus obtained is to be immediately reported, so far as possible by telegraph, to the police of the place of destination. Before this report has been despatched, the traveller

must not be allowed to proceed.

The police are required to take measures, in co-operation so far as may be necessary with the Sanitary Commission, to ensure that persons, whose arrival has been reported to them in accordance with §1, shall for the space of five days after their arrival in this country, be inspected once daily by a doctor appointed for the purpose. With that object the doctor may require them to be present at their residence at a definite time of the day.

The place of destination given in pursuance of \$1 may not be changed by the person concerned for the five days pext after his arrival, until such person has notified his new place of destination and so far as possible his address there to the police of that place, who shall thereupon report by telegraph to the police of the new place of destination, provided that place is not without the kingdom. The same procedure shall be applied to each change of place of residence within the above named limits of time.

The doctors appointed in virtue of this notice to carry out the examinations are to be indemnified according to the rules of the Law of March 31, 1900, §24, concerning measures against

the spread of contagious diseases.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following translation of two Orders, issued by the Spanish Government, prescribing certain precautions to be taken against cholera:-

(1) The epidemic of Asiatic Cholera which has invaded the Russian Empire, spreading to populous towns in extensive relations with the rest of Europe, and the fact, which has been proved, that man and the objects of his immediate use are the most efficient means for propagating this serious disease, necessitate the adoption of all measures which may conduce to prevent the appearance in our country of the dreaded illness, such measures to be adopted without alarm or precipitation since the danger is far off to-day. With this end in view, and in conformity and transit of rags, used articles of clothing, and

with the duties incumbent on the Ministry of the Interior to safeguard the public health in the present circumstances, His Majesty the King has been pleased to direct (this Circular is addressed to the Civil Governors of the Provinces) that Your Excellency should exercise the most detailed and continuous watchfulness in order that all the rolling-stock in the railway stations for the conveyance of passengers, and especially sleeping-cars, the linen used in the same, restaurant cars and closets, be kept perfectly clean, and that Your Excellency should see that the provincial and municipal Sanitary Inspectors frequently visit the above-mentioned railway stations with the object of ascertaining. whether the aforesaid hygienic measures are being carried out, and of immediately reporting cases of neglect.

(2) In conformity with existing legislation and in view of the sanitary state of extensive districts of the Russian Empire which have actually been invaded by a deadly cholera epidemic, and as a measure of precaution for the prevention of the introduction of the disease into our territory, His Majesty the King has resolved (this is addressed to the Civil Governors of the maritime and frontier provinces and the Commandants of Ceuta and Melilla) to prohibit the entry into our ports or across our frontier of old clothes, rags, soiled personal and bed linen proceeding from

Russia.

If the above objects are considered as baggage or as goods in transit they will be admitted; but they will have to arrive wrapped up in tarred canvas, and the rags in large pressed bales bound with iron hoops.

The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 which require movement of swine in a float, cart or van shall not apply to movement along, over or across any street in the borough of Barnsley.

(DATED 1ST OCTOBER 1908.)

HUNSLET (LEEDS) ALLOTMENT GAR-DENS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1908.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

## Premises to which this Order applies.

- 1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the city of Leeds to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said city and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.
- (2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the said Local Authority.
- (3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

#### Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

# Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

- 8.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies in a float, cart or van to a slaughter-house situate in the city of Leeds, for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of that city, which licence shall be in force for not more than six days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.
- (3.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (4.) The swine moved under this Article shall and Fisheries, 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W. | be moved by the nearest available route and

without unnecessary delay, and shall, after their arrival at the slaughter-house, be there detained until they are slaughtered.

# Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicle used for Conveyance of Swine.

- 4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article, shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the owner of the float, cart or van as follows:
- (i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then
  - (ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
  - (iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

# Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

- 5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Leeds, which licence shall be in force for not more than six days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Swine may also be moved to any premises to which this Order applies if such movement is authorised by a licence (Form A) granted under and in accordance with the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.
- (3.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.
- (4.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (5.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.
- (6.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (7.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

# Local Authority to enforce Order.

7. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

# Offences.

- 8.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesnid, and the eccupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any float, cart or van used for the convoyance of swine, the owner, or other person for the time being in charge of the float, cart or van shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (5.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Interpretation.

- 9. In this Order-
- "The Act of 1894" means the Discases of Animals Act, 1894:
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

"Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Place under any Order of the

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

#### Commencement.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of October, nineteen hundred and eight.
