The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirtynine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirtieth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words

and figures following, that is to say :-"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Saint Mary, Hornsey Rise, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hornsey Rise, is vested in the Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of Saint Mark, Tollington Park, in the said county of Middlesex and in the said diocese of London.

"And whereas the Reverend Finlay Monds Finlay Green, now Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Saint Mark, Tollington Park, is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hornsey Rise, now vested in him as aforesaid as such Vicar or Incumbent, should be transferred to and be vested in himself, the said Finlay Monds Finlay Green, Francis Augustus Bevan, of number 54, Lombard-street, in the city of London, Esquire, John Francis William Deacon, of number 20, Birchin-lane, in the city of London, Esquire, the Reverend Thomas Graham, Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Peter, Southborough, in the county of Kent, and the Reverend David James Stather Hunt, Vicar of Holy Trinity, Tunbridge Wells, in the county of Kent (hereinafter called the said

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, now Bishop of London, as Bishop of the diocese in which the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hornsey Rise, is situate, is consenting to such transfer and in token of such his consent has executed this

scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas in consideration of the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hornsey Rise, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed a sum of five hundred pounds has been paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, for the augmentation of the endowment of the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hornsey Rise, and the said transfer will, therefore, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the new parish of Saint Mary, Hornsey

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Finlay Monds Finlay Green, the Vicar or Incumbent of the said vicarage of the parish of Saint Mark, Tollington Park, and Patron as such Vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hornsey Rise (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), and with the consent of the said Trustees (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hornsey Rise, now vested in him, the said Finlay Monds Finlay Green, as such Vicar or Incumbent of the said vicarage of Saint Mark, Tollington Park as aforesaid shall be transformed from him the said aforesaid, shall be transferred from him, the said Finlay Monds Finlay Green, and from his successors, Vicars or Incumbents of the said vicarage of Saint Mark, Tollington Park, to the said Trustees, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said

Trustees, their heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of

any other Act of Parliament. And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the thirtieth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eightyfour, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the incomes of the benefices of Windlesham and Saint Anne, Bagshot, in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas the whole advowson of each of the said two benefices of Windlesham and Saint Anne, Bagshot, is vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor

of Great Britain for the time being.

"And whereas by a deed made the twentyfirst day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, under the provisions of the Act of the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter forty-five, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter eighty-four, between the Reverend James Fyler, then Rector of Windlesham aforesaid, of the first part, the Right Reverend Father in God Edward Harold, by Divine permission Lord Bishop of Winchester, of the second part, the Right Honourable Hugh McCalmont, Baron Cairns, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain acting for and on behalf of Her of Great Britain, acting for and on behalf of Her said late Majesty as Patron in right of the Act of Parliament.

Crown of the rectory of Windlesham aforesaid and also of the said benefice of Saint Anne, Bagshot, of the third part, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the fourth part, and the Reverend Frederick Aylmer Pendarves Lory, then Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Anne, Bagshot, of the fifth part, one clear yearly rent charge of one hundred and thirteen pounds was charged upon all the glebe lands and revenues of the said rectory of Windlesham in favour of the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Anne, Bagshot, and his successors for ever as part of the endowment of the said benefice of Saint Anne, Bagshot.

"And whereas each of the said two benefices is now full of a Clerk.

"And whereas the Right Honourable Robert Threshie, Baron Loreburn, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, has represented to us and we are of opinion that it is desirable that the apportionment hereinafter recommended and proposed of the incomes of the said two benefices of Windlesham and Saint Anne, Bagshot, should be effected as from the date of the next yacation of the said benefice of Saint Anne, Bagshot.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said: Robert Threshie, Baron Loreburn (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed it with his episcopal seal) and with the consent of the Reverend Arthur George Musgrave, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Rector or Incumbent of the said benefice of Windlesham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and as from the date on which the said benefice of Saint Anne, Bagshot, shall from whatsoever cause be next avoided after the date of the gazetting of any order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme all and singular the tithe commutation rent charges which are specified in the schedule to this scheme appended shall be transferred from the said benefice of Windlesham to the said benefice of Saint Anne, Bagshot, and shall be annexed thereto and form part of the endowment of the said benefice of Saint Anne, Bagshot, and that as from the date of the transfer taking effect the annual payment of one hundred and thirteen pounds which is payable by the Rector or Incumbent of the said benefice of Windlesham to the Vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Anne, Bagshot, by virtue of the hereinbefore recited deed of the twentyfirst day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four shall cease and determine and shall no longer be payable by the Rector or Incumbent of the said benefice of Windlesham to the Vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Anne, Bagshot, and the glebe lands, properties and revenues of the benefice of Windlesham whereon the said annual payment is charged or out of which the same issues shall be absolutely released and discharged therefrom.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the thirtieth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint George, Edgbaston, and the new parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, both in the county of Warwick and in the diocese of Birmingham.

"Whereas by the authority of an Instrument bearing date the first day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two and being under the common seal of the late Commissioners for building New Churches and under the hand and seal of the late Right Reverend Henry, then Bishop of Worcester, a certain part of the parish of Edgbaston, in the said county of Warwick and at that time in the diocese of Worcester but now in the said diocese of Birmingham, was assigned as a particular district to the consecrated church of Saint George, Edgbaston, and the said particular district was known as 'The Particular District of Saint George, Edgbaston.

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine and published in the London Gazette on the sixth day of the following month, a part of the said parish of Edgbaston was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, and the said district chapelry was called 'The District Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston,'

"And whereas the said particular district of Saint George, Edgbaston, and the said district chapelry of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, have under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become new parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirtysecond and thirty-third years of Her said late

Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint George, Edgbaston, and the said new parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, shall be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of Right Reverend Charles, now Bishop of Birming-ham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint George, Edgbaston, and the said new parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, shall be altered so that all those portions of the said new parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, and of the said parish of Edgbaston which are described in the schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parish and parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint George, Edgbaston.

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other

Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the new parish of Saint George, Edgbaston, in the county of Warwick and in the diocese of Birmingham,

"I. All that portion of the new parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, in the said county and diocese, which is bounded upon part of the south-west and upon the south-east by the said new parish of Saint George, Edgbaston, upon the north-east by the new parish of Saint John, Ladywood, Birmingham, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon a small portion of the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John, Ladywood, Birmingham, from the said new parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, at the junction of Reserwith Harold-road, and extending ath-westward along the middle of voir-road thence south-westward along the middle of Harold-road for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with Waterworksroad, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Waterworks-road for a distance of ten yards or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Augustine,

George, Edgbaston.

"II. And also all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, which is bounded upon part of the north and upon the east by the said new parish of Saint George, Edgbaston, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the west and upon a small part of the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint George, Edgbaston, from the said new parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, crosses the middle of Hagley-road, and extending thence westward, along the middle of Hagley-road for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the premises of the Baptist Chapel known as 'The Church fo the Redeemer' and extending thence northward fo and along the said wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the houses and premises on the western side of Wyndham-road for a distance of five chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence meets the line of walls or fences at the back of the houses and premises on the south-eastern side of Stirling-road, and extending thence eastward along the said line of walls or fences for a distance of fifteen yards or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, from the said new parish of Saint George,

Edgbaston.
"III. And also all those portions of the said new parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, and of the parish of Edgbaston, in the said county and diocese, which, taken together, are bounded upon the north-east and upon part of the north by the said new parish of Saint George, Edgbaston, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north, upon the south-west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint George, Edgbaston, from the said new parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, at the point where the wall or fence forming the boundary between the house and premises known as Chad Hill and the house and premises known as Westfield meets the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the house and premises known as Chad Hill Cottage, and extending thence first north-westward and then south-westward along the walls or fences forming the north-eastern and the north-western boundaries of the said house and premises known as Chad Hill Cottage for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises on the northern side of Hawthorne-road, and extending thence first north-westward and then

Edgbaston, from the said new parish of Saint; south-westward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of three chains and threequarters or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as Oak Hill, and extending thence south-eastward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the garden of the lodge of the said house known as Oak Hill, and extending thence first south-westward and then southeastward along the walls or fences forming the north-western and the south-western boundaries of the said garden and lodge for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to the north-western side of Hawthorne-road, and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line (thereby passing to the south-west of the house and premises known as No. 179, Harborneroad) for a distance of three chains and threequarters or thereabouts to a point on the western side of Harborne-road opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the premises of the White Swan Inn, and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line (thereby crossing at the middle of Harborne-road the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Augustine, Edgbaston, from the said parish of Edgbaston and also crossing the southern end of the Botanical Gardens) for a distance of thirty-seven chains or thereabouts to the point where the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as Southfield meets the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the Birmingham and West Suburban Railway upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Edgbaston from the said new parish of Saint George, Edgbaston."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively

signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Birming ham.

TABLE OF ECCLESIASTICAL FEES.

It is ordered by the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor, and the Archbishop of York that the Orders of 10th December, 1895 (gazetted 2nd July, 1895), and of 29th November, 1907 (gazetted 29th November, 1907), shall be repealed, and that in pursuance of the provisions of 1 and 2 Vict. c. 106 and 30 and 31 Vict. c. 135 the following Table and Scales of Fees be ordained, settled, and established under the provisions of the said Acts.

Other Fees of Apparitor, Sealer, and Record Keeper.

The following fees may continue to be taken by any Apparitor, Sealer, or Record Keeper, who was appointed to his office before the 10th December, 1895, so long as he shall continue to discharge the duties of his office, but upon his death or resignation such fees shall wholly cease to be taken and shall not be claimed by or payable to the successor, if any, of such Apparitor, Sealer, or Record Keeper. These fees, where payable, are to be in addition to those hereinbefore prescribed, and payable to any Vicar-General, Chancellor, Registrar, or Secretary, respectively. Any demand or application for these Fees shall be in writing and shall state the name and address of the Apparitor, Sealer, or Record Keeper, claiming the fee and the date of his appointment.

RULES.

Disbursements.

1. The fees include postages, telegrams, carriage, and transmission of documents, office expenses, stationers' charges, and all other similar disbursements.

Annual Value.

2. The net annual value of a Benefice shall, for the purposes of the Scale of Fees in respect of Collation, Institution, Induction, and Licence to a Perpetual Curacy be computed as provided by the Pluralities Acts, 1 & 2 Vict. cap. 106, and 13 & 14 Vict. cap. 98, and shall be the gross amount of the annual value of such Benefice after deducting all taxes, rates, tenths, dues, and permanent charges and outgoings to which such Benefice shall be subject, but without any deduction or allowance for any stipend or stipends to any stipendiary Curate or Curates, nor for such taxes or rates in respect of the house of residence of the Benefice or of the Glebe Land belonging thereto as are usually paid by tenants or occupiers, nor for moneys expended in the repair or improvement of the

house or residence and buildings and premises belonging thereto.

Unless the fee payable under the said scale shall have been previously agreed between the Incumbent and the Secretary, the Incumbent shall within one week of the issue of the Bishop's notice under the Benefices Act, 1898, of intention to collate, institute or admit, turnish to the Secretary particulars in writing of the gross amount of the annual value of the Benefice and of the deductions to be made as aforesaid in estimating the net annual value thereof, and if thereupon the Incumbent and the Secretary mutually agree as to such net annual value such agreement shall be conclusive and the fee shall be computed and paid accordingly; but if the Incumbent omits to send to the Secretary such particulars as aforesaid, or if the Secretary claims that the Benefice is of a higher net annual value than the Incumbent estimates it to be, the Secretary shall furnish to the Incumbent a statement in writing of the gross and net annual values as computed by the Secretary and of the fee claimed, and if the Incumbent is not satisfied he shall transmit his own and the Secretary's statements of annual value to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, who shall thereupon in a summary manner and upon such estimate as they may in their uncontrolled judgment think proper determine the amount of the fee to be paid, and their decision shall be final and conclusive and binding upon all parties, and a certificate under the hand of the Secretary or Acting Secretary for the time being of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall be sufficient evidence and record of such decision.

The net annual value of a Benefice in cases under the Incumbents Resignation Acts shall be the amount thereof as computed by the Commissioners appointed pursuant to the Incumbents Resignation Act, 1871, in ascertaining the amount of the pension to be allowed to the retiring Incumbent.

Ordination.

3. The Registrar's fee is for registering the names and titles of the candidates in the Register Books of the Diocese. REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for Clerkships in the Second Division of the Civil Service.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

1. Open Competitive Examinations of Candidates for Clerkships in the Second Division of

the Civil Service will be held from time to time at such places as may be deemed expedient.

2. These examinations are open, under such general restrictions as may be laid down, to all natural-born or naturalized British subjects, being of the prescribed age and of good health and character; but a candidate will not be eligible for assignment or appointment to the Admiralty, the War Office, or the Colonial Office unless he is a British subject and the son of a father also a British subject, except by special permission from the Head of the Department concerned; and no candidate will be eligible for assignment to the Foreign Office unless he be a natural born British subject and born within the United Kingdom of parents also born therein, except when special permission is given to the Civil Service Commissioners by the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs. The undermentioned special conditions are at present in force:—

- (i.) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say:—
 - (a) Persons actually serving in the Army.
- (b) Persons actually serving in the Navy. No person actually serving in the Army will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Army Council.
- No person actually serving in the Navy will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

(ii.) The following classes of persons will not be eligible unless they obtain the permission of the authorities of their department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition, viz.:—(a) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service, (b) Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy, and Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards.

(iii.) Persons who have been trained in Training Colleges at the public expense will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

3. The limits of age are 17 and 20. If an examination begins in one of the first six months of any year candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of March in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of September in that year.

THE AMERICAN GOOSEBERRY MILDEW (SHROPSHIRE) ORDER OF 1908.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of the Order.

1. This Order shall apply to the districts which are by the Schedule hereto declared to be affected.

Definitions.

In this Order—

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

'The Local Authority" means as regards any District described in the first column of the Schedule hereto, the council mentioned in the second column of that Schedule:

"Disease" means the disease affecting goose-berry and current bushes which is known as Sphaerotheca mors-uvae or American Gooseberry Mildew; and "diseased" means affected with disease:

"Bush" includes a cutting, seedling, or other

plant:

"Article" means Article of this Order

Notification of Disease.

3. The occupier of any premises on which there is a bush which is diseased or suspected of being diseased shall forthwith notify the fact to the clerk to the Local Authority, or to some person authorised by the Local Authority to receive such notices, and where practicable a specimen showing the disease or suspected disease shall accompany the notice.

Preliminary Investigation by Local Authority.

4.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving in any manner notice of the existence or supposed existence of disease shall forthwith take such steps as may be necessary to determine on what premises the disease exists, and shall cause notice of such determination to be served on the occupier of each of such premises which shall thereupon become "infected premises" and continue to be infected premises until the notice is altered or withdrawn by the Local Authority in accordance with Article 10.

(2.) The notice shall as far as practicable include in the infected premises only such plantations, gardens or fields as contain bushes which are or recently have been diseased.

Precautions to be Adopted in case of an Outbreak of Disease or Supposed Outbreak.

5.-(1.) The occupier of any plantation, garden or field on which there is a diseased bush shall as soon as is practicable spray all the diseased bushes and all gooseberry and currant bushes on the plantation, garden or field to which the disease is likely to spread with a solution of liver of sulphur (containing not less than one pound of liver of sulphur to thirty-two gallons of water) or with some other fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority for that purpose; provided that this provision shall not apply to bushes which have shed their leaves.

(2.) No bush shall be removed from any plantation, garden or field on which there is a bush which is diseased or suspected of being diseased, and clippings from diseased or suspected bushes shall be forthwith destroyed by burning or other effective method by the occupier of the premises.

Action to be taken by Local Authority after Preliminary Investigation.

6.—(1.) The Local Authority shall as soon as is practicable cause a notice to be served on each occupier of infected premises requiring him to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the disease as are specified in the notice.

(2.) A notice under this Article shall require the occupier of the premises as regards each diseased bush on the premises and every bush immediately adjoining such bush—

(a) to destroy by burning or other effective method and by a date to be specified in the notice, either the whole bush or, if the occupier so prefer, all diseased wood, which wood shall for that purpose be pruned to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority;

(b) to spray thoroughly the site of each bush which has not shed its leaves as soon as possible with a solution of liver of sulphur (containing at least one pound of liver of sulphur to twenty-four gallons of water) or with some other fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority for that purpose;

Provided that if the occupier shall fail to carry out the destruction required by the notice by the date therein specified the Local Authority may cause their officers to carry out the work by either of the alternative methods prescribed

by the notice.

(c) And also as soon as is practicable, and thereafter while the notice remains in force, if and when so directed by an Inspector of the Local Authority, to prune or spray as may be directed all gooseberry and currant bushes on the infected premises whether the same have been diseased or

(3.) All clippings arising from any pruning under this Article shall be forthwith destroyed by the occupier by burning or other effective method.

Power to Require Adoption of Precautions on Premises in Vicinity of Infected Premises.

7. The Local Authority may cause a notice to be served on the occupier of any plantation, garden or field on which there are gooseberry or currant bushes to which the disease is likely to spread from infected premises in the vicinity requiring such occupier, on or before such date as therein specified, to spray thoroughly all the gooseberry and current bushes on such plantation, garden or field with a solution of liver of sulphur (containing not less than one pound of liver of sulphur to thirty-two gallons of water) or with some other fungicide approved by or on behalf of the Local Authority. Provided that this provision shall not apply to bushes which have shed their leaves.

Precautions against Spread of Disease by Fruit Picking.

8. Where the Local Authority are satisfied that the extent of the disease in any plantation, garden or field is such that the picking of the crop would be likely to spread the disease to other premises, the Local Authority may by notice served on the occupier of the plantation, garden or field prohibit the picking of the crop either absolutely or subject to such conditions as they think necessary for the prevention of the spread of disease by such picking.

Precautions against Spread of Disease by Bushes.

9.—(1.) No gooseberry or current bush shall be removed from infected premises except with, and subject to the conditions (if any) inserted in,

a licence granted by the Board.

(2.) An Inspector of the Local Authority may within the district of the Local Authority, and an Inspector of the Board may elsewhere in Great Britain, by notice served on the owner or person in charge of any bushes which have been removed in contravention of this Order or on any person to whom they have been consigned for sale prohibit the sale or exposure for sale of such bushes, and require the same to be either destroyed or returned to the infected premises.

Withdrawal of Notices of Infected Premises.

10. A notice constituting any premises infected premises shall not be altered or withdrawn by the Local Authority, except with the approval of the Board, until the expiration of the year following that in which the disease has last been seen on the premises, unless the premises are before that date cleared of gooseberry and currant bushes and the sites of the diseased bushes and the bushes immediately adjoining them are disinfected in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

Copies of Notices and Returns of Proceedings to be sent to the Board.

11.—(1.) A copy of every notice served under this Order shall be sent to the Board by the

Inspector by whom the notice is signed.

(2.) The Local Authority shall, in a form to be provided by the Board, notify the Board of any outbreak of disease, and shall as soon as may be after the expiration of each year report to the Board the proceedings taken in the preceding year by the Local Authority under this Order.

Powers of Entry.

12. Any Inspector or other officer appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority, and any Inspector of the Board, may upon production if so required of his appointment or authority enter any land on which he has reason to believe that disease exists or has recently existed and examine any gooseberry or current bush on such land.

Notification of Order.

13. This Order shall be published by the Local Authority by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district of the Local Authority or in such other manuer as the Local Authority consider best fitted to insure publicity for the

Offences.

14. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who-

(1.) knowingly fails to give notification of disease as required by Article 3; or

(2.) fails to prune or spray in manner prescribed by this Order or by any notice served on him under this Order any bush or other thing required under the Order or notice to be pruned or sprayed by him; or

(3.) removes any bush in contravention of this

Órder; or

(4.) fails to destroy any clipping required under this Order to be destroyed by him; or

(5.) fails to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the disease as are specified in a notice served on him under Article 6: or

(6.) picks or permits to be picked any crop or part of a crop in contravention of a notice served on him under Article 8, or fails to comply with the conditions of any such notice; or

(7.) sells or exposes for sale any bushes in contravention of a notice served on him under Article 9, or fails either to destroy or return any bushes as required by any such

notice; or

(8.) wilfully obstructs or impedes any Inspector or other officer in the course of his duties under this Order.

Execution of the Order.

15.—(1.) The Local Authority of any district mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall carry into effect this Order within that District, and shall appoint such Inspectors or other officers for that

purpose as may be necessary.

(2.)
