NOTICE is hereby given, that by virtue of an Order given under the seal of office of the Local Government Board, dated October 5th, 1908, it was declared, that on the 16th day of November, 1908, Part 2 (Streets and buildings), Part 3 (Sanitary provisions), and sections 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, and 68 of Part 4 (Infectious diseases), of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the Urban District of Audenshaw, subject as regards sections 25, 27, 35, 38, and 59, to certain conditions and adaptations set out in the Schedule to the said Order.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by virtue of an Order given under the Seal of Office of the Local Government Board, dated October 8th, 1908, it was declared that Part 2 (Streets and buildings), Part 3 (Sanitary provisions), Part 4 (Infectious diseases), Part 5 (Common lodging houses), Part 6 (Recreation grounds), and Part 10 (Miscellaneous) of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the urban district of Lower Bebington, subject, as regards sections 25, 27, 35, 38, 59, and 75 of the said Act, to certain conditions and adaptations set out in the schedule to the said Order.

And it was further declared that this Order should come into operation on the 26th day of November, 1908.

URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF PENARTH

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

NOTICE is hereby given that, by virtue of an Order of the Local Government Board on the 12th day of October, 1908, it was declared, specified and directed, (1) that on and after the 30th day of November, 1908, Part II (Streets and buildings), Part III (Sanitary provisions), Part V (Common lodging houses), Part VI (Recreation grounds), and Part X (Miscellaneous), and sections 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, and 68, comprised in Part IV (Infectious diseases) of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the district of Penarth, and (2) that the several sections mentioned in sub-division (1) of this Article and Part II, Part III, and Part V of the Act of 1907, shall be in force in the district subject to the following conditions and adaptations, that is to say:—

Unless and until the Local Government Board by a further Order, made on such application and after compliance with such requirements as are described and set forth in section 3 of the Act of 1907; otherwise declare, specify, and direct such of the sections mentioned in sub-division (1) of this Article, or comprised in Part II, Part III, or Part V as are also mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order shall, in their

application to the district and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the Local Authority under those sections, have effect as if in the case of each section the words and figures set forth in the second column of the said schedule were added to and formed part of that section.

SCHEDULE.

Parts and Sections. Conditions and Adaptations.

PART II.

Section twenty-five. "The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section one hundred and fifty-seven of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended by section twenty-three of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, with respect to the paving of yards and open spaces in connection with dwelling - houses, shall cease to be exercisable."

Section twenty-seven. "(7) Nothing in this section shall apply to any temporary building erected or set up for use by the Territorial Force."

PART III.

Section thirty-five. "This section, so far as it relates to the deposit of material, shall have effect subject to the first proviso to section ninety-one of the Public Health Act, 1875."

"Bye-laws made in pursuance of section sixteen of the Local Government Act, 1888, for the prevention and suppression of nuisances shall not in relation to any subject matter of this section be of any force or effect within the district."

Section thirty-eight. "Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exercisable by or attaching to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890."

PART IV.

Section fifty-nine. "(6) Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district."

PART V.

Section seventy-five. "(3) The date of the Order of the Local Government Board by which this Part is declared to be in force shall be the beginning of the period within which the Local Authority shall give notice for the purposes of sub-section (1) of this section."
