"HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of October, 1908, in the words following, viz. :-

"Whereas by section three of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions and other allow-ances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

"And whereas the Stewardess borne on the books of Your Majesty's yacht 'Victoria and Albert' is paid at the rate of two shillings and threepence a day under the Order in Couucil of Her late Majesty, bearing date the 6th February, 1882, and receives in addition an allowance of one shilling and sixpence a day in lieu of provisions in kind :

"And whereas it has been found necessary to enter for duty in Your Majesty's yacht Alexandra' a Stewardess for whose pay provision has not yet been made:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment at the rate of three shillings and ninepence a day, to be inclusive of pay and victualling, to any Stewardess whom it may be found necessary to employ in any of Your Majesty's yachts.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."
