The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 which require movement of swine in a float, cart or van shall not apply to movement along, over or across any street in the county borough of Cardiff.

Extension of Limits of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The limits of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by Order of the Board dated the twenty-fifth day of September, nineteen hundred and eight, are hereby extended so as to comprise the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area so described is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of October, nineteen hundred and eight.

An Area in the administrative county of Essex comprising the petty sessional division of Lexden and Winstree (except the parishes of West Mersea, and East Mersea); the petty sessional division of Tendring (except the parishes of Manningtree, Mistley, Bradfield, Wrabness, Ramsey, Wix, Great Oakley, Little Oakley, Beaumont cum Moze, Kirby le Soken, Walton le Soken, and Frinton); and also comprising the borough of Colchester.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 29TH OCTOBER 1908.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything in any Order of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries any animals now being brought from Baltimore to the port of London by the steamship "Minnesota" may be transhipped to the steamship "Taurus" for detention thereon while the said steamship "Minnesota" is in any dock within the said port, and for subsequent reshipment on that steamship.

2. The animals shall be transhipped and, if not landed at the Foreign Animals Wharf, Deptford, shall be reshipped in the presence, and under the supervision and control, of an Officer of Customs, and while on board the steamship "Taurus" the animals shall remain in charge of such an Officer and also of an Officer of the Corporation of the city of London.

3. An Inspector of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries shall be permitted to examine the animals at such time or times as he may require while the animals are in the port of London.

4. While the animals are on board the steamship "Taurus," no person shall enter a pen in which the animals are kept, except an Inspector of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries or a person authorised in this behalf by any such Inspector.
