Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of The University of London Act, 1898, that the following amendment of the Statutes of the University of London has been made by the Senate, and that copies can be obtained on application to the Secretary to the Seuate, University of London, South Kensington, S.W.

To repeal Statute 125 of the Statutes of the University, and to substitute therefor the following: following :-

125. Except as hereinafter provided no person shall be admitted to a first degree in the University as an Internal Student unless and until he has completed an approved course of study comprising all the subjects in which he presents himself and extending over not less than three years. Such three years shall be calculated from a date not earlier than matriculation unless the Senate shall either generally by regulation or in special cases allow the same to be calculated from a date not exceeding four months before matriculation. Any person who has passed the intermediate examination before he is registered as an Internal Student may be allowed to take the final examination for the first degree before the end of a three years' course provided that subsequently to passing the intermediate examination he shall have attended for two years an approved course of study for the final examination. If he passes that examination he shall be admitted to the degree without further examination but not until he shall have completed three years of October 21st, 1908.

study as an Internal Student by attending subsequently to passing the final examination a further approved course of study and not unless the Authorities of the School or Institution at which such course is held have certified that his attendance and progress have been satisfactory. Provided that

- (1) A person who has presented himself for a final examination for a first degree as an Internal Student and has failed may be permitted to present himself on a subsequent occasion for such final examination as an Internal Student in subjects other than those in which he presented himself on the first occasion after such further course if any as the Senate shall generally by regulation or in special cases determine.
- (2) A course of study extending over not more than one year taken in another University approved for the purpose subsequently to the passing of the intermediate examination may be accepted in lieu of an approved course of study taken in this University subject to such regulations as the Senate may from time to time prescribe.

For the purposes of this Statute the date of matriculation shall be taken to be the first day of the matriculation examination at which the Candidate passed or in respect of which he was registered.

TEMPORARY ORDER of the Local Government Board: Relief to able-bodied Meu, their Wives and Families:-

PARISH OF FULHAM.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Fulham ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order dated the 14th day of December, 1852, which is in force in the Parish of Fulham, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of out-door relief to poor persons:

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Parish:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows :-

Article I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Fulham may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution" the effect that the powers conferred by this Secretary in His Majesty's Diplomatic Service. | Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

Article II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse the wife and family of any ablebodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse.

(2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.

(3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of subdivision (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time or any part of the time of his absence.

Article III.—This Order shall operate and have effect until the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine bundred and nine.

METHWOLD AND FELTWELL DRAINAGE.
(Incorporation of Drainage Board for the District
comprising a portion of the Parishes of Methwold and Feltwell, in the County of Norfolk;
Transfer of Property and Liabilities of the
Feltwell and Methwold Separate District
Drainage Board and Dissolution of that
Board; Power to Levy Drainage Taxes and
Recovery of same; Defining Qualifications
and Membership of Board; Conferring Powers

and Penalties; Borrowing Powers; Incorporation, Amendment and Repeal of Acts.)

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the Feltwell and Methwold Separate District Drainage Board (in this Notice referred to as "the Feltwell Board") for an Act for all or some of the following purposes (that is

to say) :---

1. To alter the constitution of the Board and to provide for the incorporation of a new Board (in this Notice referred to as the Board) to define the drainage district and generally to confer increased powers upon the Board.

2. To make provision for the appointment and qualification of the members of the Board, to provide that the existing members of the Feltwell Board shall continue in office until some date to be fixed by the Bill and then vacate their offices, and that all property vested in that Board shall be transferred to and vested in the Board to be incorporated by the Bill.

- 6. To define the general powers of the Board with regard to the construction, maintenance and repair of sluices, drains, ditches, tunnels, dams, headings, outlets, forelands, stanches, culverts, banks, engines, pumps, machinery, bridges, buildings and other works and conveniences, the cleansing, scouring, deepening, improvement or alteration of the course of any existing banks, ditches, drains or watercourses within the drainage district, the entry on and use of public drains and other drains or banks, the power to dig earth or soil therefrom and remove trees and other obstructions, the abandonment and stopping up of any drains which they may consider unnecessary, the making of surveys, the laying out, construction, repair and maintenance of droves or occupation roads, the use and disposal of any materials excavated or becoming useless or unnecessary, the fencing of works, watercourses and drains, the provision of watering places for cattle, the irrigation of farms and other lands, the power to enter on lands and generally all necessary powers for rendering more efficient the drainage or irrigation of the drainage

7. To provide that the Board shall do as little damage as possible and make compensation for any damage done by the Board, and that when new drains are completed the rights of drainage through the old channels shall cease.

- 8. To require the owners and occupiers of lands within the drainage district to keep open and properly deepened, widened, scoured, cleansed and repaired the several outring dykes, division dykes, droveway dykes, interior dykes and ditches and to empower the Board on any failure or default on the part of any owner or occupier to execute any necessary works and recover the cost thereof and expenses from such owner or occupier.
- 9. To authorize the Board to assess and levy a drainage tax for general drainage purposes of the Board and an additional tax in respect of the raising and pumping water from the drainage district into the River Wissey and the construction and maintenance of engines, mills and other works in connection therewith.
- 10. To prescribe the form of assessment, the mode of levying, the form of order and the notices to be given of the making of any such drainage tax, to provide that such tax shall be levied on

the acreage instead of rateable value and may be retrospective or prospective and by whom it is to be paid and making other provisions with regard to the collection and recovery thereof, including power to sue for the same and to distrain on the goods or chattels (wherever situate) of any person failing to pay the tax and power to sell or let the lands in respect of which the tax is in arrear.

11. To impose penalties for encroachments on the Board's property or any drain or watercourse in the drainage district, for cutting turves, hods or sesses or firing on or near the banks of any drain or watercourse, cutting, ditches or soak dykes, and to prevent the feeding or driving of cattle on the banks of any drain or watercourse.

14. To provide for the accounts of the Board being audited by a chartered accountant.
