The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs thinks it desirable to call attention to the requirements of the French Conscription Law of June, 1889, under which the sons, born in France, of British subjects born elsewhere than in France, must, in order to obtain exemption from military service, decline French nationality within the year following the attainment of their majority if, at that time, they are deemed to be resident in France. Such persons should communicate with the British Consular Officer residing nearest to their place of birth, who will inform them of the precise formalities required.

# WATFORD URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

(Conferring further Powers upon the Watford Urban District Council in relation to their Water and Electric Lighting Undertakings; New Waterworks; Rates and Charges; Discounts; Provisions as to Supply; Bye-laws and Regulations; Extension of Area of Supply for Electric Lighting Purposes; Supply of Fittings; Free Wiring; Supply to Houses outside District; Further Powers as to Streets, Buildings, Watercourses and Sanitary Matters; Borrowing Powers; Refuse Destructor; Manufacture and Sale of Slabs; Incorporation, Amendment and Repeal of Acts; and other Provisions in connection with the Local Government of the District.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the Urban District Council (in this Notice referred to as the Council) of Watford, in the county of Hertford (in this Notice referred to as the District), for an Act for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

## Water.

1. To define the limits of supply within which the Council may supply water for public and private purposes.

2. To authorize the Council to make and maintain the waterworks and other works herein-after described, wholly in the county of Hertford (that is to say):—

Work No. 1.—A well, borehole and pumping station, to be situate in an enclosure of land belonging to the Council, wholly within the district and adjoining the existing well and pumping station of the Council, the centre of such well being at a point 550 feet, or thereabouts, drawn in a south-westerly direction from the centre of the existing well of the Council, and an auxiliary borehole, to be situate in the same enclosure, the centre of such borehole being at a point 400 feet, or thereabouts, drawn in a westerly direction from the centre of the existing well of the Council.

Work No. 2.—A reservoir, to be situate in the parish of Bushey, in the county of Hertford, in the northern portion of the enclosure numbered 403 on the Ordnance Map of the said parish (scale 1:25,000, second edition, 1898).

Work No. 3.—A conduit or line of mains or pipes, commencing in the above-mentioned well forming part of Work No. 1, in the parish of Watford Urban, and passing through the parishes of Oxhey and Bushey and terminating in the last-named parish in Work No. 2.

Work No. 4.—A conduit or line of mains or pipes, commencing in Work No. 2 and passing through the parishes of Bushey, Oxhey and Watford Urban and terminating in the last-named parish at the centre of the junction of High-street and St. Albans-road.

3. To authorize the Council on any lands belonging to them or in respect of which they have or may acquire any easement to make, maintain, alter, renew and repair cuts, channels, catchwaters, aqueducts, culverts, tunnels, adits, shafts, drains, junctions, sluices, gauges, wells, tanks, basins, filter beds, filters, embankments, retaining walls, roads, approaches, engines, pumps, valves, machinery, buildings, appliances, softening plant apparatus, works and conveniences.

4. To enable the Council to deviate from the lines and levels of the proposed works.

5. To empower the Council to take, appropriate, impound and use all such waters as may be intercepted or obtained by means of their existing works or the works proposed to be authorized by the Bill.

6. To authorize the Council to impose rates and charges for the supply of water for domestic, trade and other purposes, to define what are to be deemed domestic purposes, to compel the owners of small houses to pay the water rates and charges, to allow discounts or rebates, to make provision for supply to houses partly used for trade and for supply for building purposes.

7. To empower the Council to make bye-laws for the prevention of waste of water, to sell or let meters and fittings, to lay pipes in streets not dedicated to public use and to make provision for notice being given of connecting or disconnecting meters and to prevent injury to meters and also for the supply of water in bulk.

## Electricity.

8. To extend the area of supply of the Council for electric lighting and power purposes so as to include so much of Cassiobury Park, in the parish of Watford Rural, in the county of Hertford, as lies to the south of the footpath leading from Watford Lodge in Rickmansworth-road to the River Gade and east of the said river, being bounded on the south by the urban district of Watford, which area is delineated on the map which will be deposited with the Board of Trade in respect of this Bill and is thereon coloured red.

9. To enable the Council to undertake the free wiring of houses for electric lighting power or heating purposes, and to make such charges therefor as may be fixed by the Council or prescribed by the Bill.

10. To authorize the Council to supply, fix, repair, and remove electrical fittings of all kinds and all materials and work necessary in connection therewith and to take such remuneration and make such terms and conditions as they may think fit.

11. To require any person who has a separate supply from any installation other than that of the Council to pay a minimum charge for any supply he may require from the Council and to enable the Council to impose other terms and conditions in connection with such supply.

12. To require electric lighting consumers to give notice to the Council before removing from any premises supplied with electric current by the Council, to provide that the Council may refuse to supply electric energy to persons owing money to the Council, and to authorize the Council to allow discounts or rebates on electric lighting and power accounts.

13. To enable the Council to enter into and fulfil agreements for the supply of electric energy in bulk or otherwise to the local authorities, companies or persons outside the district and particularly to empower the Council to supply energy to any consumer whose premises are within 200 yards (or such other distance as the Bill may prescribe) of any electric main or cable of the Council.

14. To authorize the Council on the one hand and any local authority, company or person on the other to enter into and fulfil agreements for the supply of electric energy for traction purposes and to execute any necessary works for the carrying of any such agreement into effect.

15. To make further provisions for the better carrying on of the electric undertaking of the Council.



## Streets and Buildings.

16. To confer further powers upon the Council in reference to the laying out of new streets, the erection of new buildings and the construction of sewers.

17. To prevent the formation of culs-de-sac, to enable the Council to define the future line of streets, to prevent the washing of sand and soil on the streets from adjoining property, or the flowing of water on to footpaths, to prune trees and shrubs overhanging streets, to require intersecting streets, and to provide that the continuation of existing streets shall be deemed to be new streets, that no building is to be allowed in any new street unless such street has been sufficiently defined and that the elevation of all buildings erected on lands which by reason of any public improvement becomes front land shall be subject to the approval of the Council.

18. To authorize the Council to require separate sewers for surface water and for sewage, with further provisions consequent thereon, to require the construction of enlarged sewers under certain circumstances, to require that all communications with existing sewers of the Council be made by the Council at the expense of the owner or occupier of the premises concerned, to amend and extend the provisions of section 19 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, to empower the Council to order that two or more houses are to be drained by means of a combined drain, and to provide for the payment of the cost thereof and to exempt, if thought fit, the buildings of railway companies from this part of the Bill.

19. To provide that a watercourse which may be choked or silted up shall be deemed to be a nuisance under the Public Health Acts and to prevent the throwing of solid matter into any stream and to enforce and recover penalties in respect thereof.

## Sanitary Provisions.

20. To make further provision for improving the sanitary condition of the district and particularly to require plans to be submitted to the Council on the reconstruction of drains, to impose penalties for the improper construction or repair of water closets or drains and for wilful damage to drains, water closets, privies or ash-pits or apparatus connected therewith, to enforce the provision of sanitary dustbins, to extend the provisions of section 112 of the Public Health Act, 1875, so as to include fish friers as offensive traders, to impose penalties for selling diseased food both on the vendor and on any person who may have previously sold the same, to require a certificate to be given in the case of a person dying of infectious disease, and to make regulations as to the conveyance of the body of any such person by railway or other conveyance, to prohibit the blowing or inflation of carcasses and to make provision with regard to the manufacture and sale of ice creams and other similar commodities and the inspection of premises in connection therewith.

## Financial Provisions.

21. To enable the Council to borrow further moneys for any of the purposes of the Bill upon security of any of the revenues of the Council and the district fund and general district rate and to provide for the repayment of such moneys and the suspension of the sinking fund or instalments of principal.

22. To provide that all moneys borrowed or to

be borrowed for the purposes of the Bill or for the purposes of water supply or electric lighting shall not be reckoned in the limit of borrowing fixed by the Public Health Act, 1875.

23. To authorize the Council to re-borrow and to borrow under the Local Loans Act.

24. To enable the Council to use one form of mortgage for all purposes and to prescribe such form and to make further provisions with regard to the borrowing powers of the Council.

25. To provide for the application of the water revenue of the Council the provision of a reserve fund and that any deficiency may be made good out of the general district rate.

## Miscellaneous.

26. To authorize the maintenance of a refuse destructor and works in connection therewith upon the lands hereinafter mentioned (namely):—

All that piece of land (two acres in extent) situate in the parish of Watford urban, in the county of Hertford, forming part of the sewage farm of the Council and being part of the enclosure numbered 145 on the Ordnance Map of the said parish (scale 1/2500, second edition, 1898).

27. To empower the Council to manufacture, use and sell slabs of artificial stone, bricks, concrete, mortar and other materials from clinkers or other refuse or surplus material and erect and use machinery and plant in connection therewith.

28. To make such further provision with regard to the evidence of appointments of officers of the Council, the confirmation of bye-laws, the recovery of demands and penalties, the right of appeal, the authentication and service of notices, the application of penalties, the indemnification of persons acting under the powers of the Act, imposing penalties on an occupier refusing execution of Act, by whom informations are to be laid, powers of Act to be in addition to other powers, the saving for indictments and that justices shall not be disqualified.

29. To incorporate with or without amendment the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Waterworks Clauses Acts 1847 and 1863, the Electric Lighting Acts and the Watford Electric Lighting Orders 1897 and 1904, and any other Act or Order relating to the Council, and to vary or extinguish any rights or interests affected by the Bill.

And notice is hereby given, that duplicate plans and sections, describing the lines, situations and levels of the proposed works and the lands which may be taken under the powers of the Bill, together with a book of reference to such plans, containing the names of the owners and lessees or reputed owners and lessees and of the occupiers of such lands, and also a copy of this Notice as published in the London Gazette will, on or before the 30th day of November instant, be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Hertford at his office at Hertford and also with the Clerk to the Urban District Council of Bushey, at his office at Bushey, and with the Clerk to the Council at his office at Watford.
