

intended works to any extent as defined by the Bill or prescribed by Parliament.

7. To authorize the Corporation to dredge and deepen the bed of the River Severn so that for a distance of five miles up the river from the dam or weir above mentioned there may always be a minimum depth of water in the river of 5 feet.

8. To make such provisions as may have been or may be agreed upon, or as may be thought proper by Parliament, to be prescribed or authorized by the Bill for the protection of the Severn Commissioners or for the protection and benefit of landowners and other bodies and persons whose property, rights and interests will or may be affected by the intended works, and to authorize, confirm or give effect to any agreements or arrangements which may be entered into between the Corporation and such landowners, bodies or persons, or some or any of them.

9. To require the Corporation under certain circumstances to construct a lock in the said dam or weir, and to provide for the levy of tolls and charges and the raising of money for such purpose and in such event and other provisions in connection therewith.

10. To authorize the Corporation to take, levy, demand and recover tolls, rates, dues or other payments upon or in respect of boats or other craft using the boat rollers or upon or in respect of foot passengers using the new road (Work No. 6), or in respect of any services to be rendered or performed by the Corporation or their agents or servants, and to confer exemptions from time to time and to compound for any such tolls, rates, dues or other payments.

11. To require that all boats or other craft using the River Severn within the borough shall be registered, annually or otherwise, and for the payment of a fee on registration.

12. To make and enforce bye-laws, rules and regulations with regard to boats or craft using the River Severn within the borough or the boat rollers or trough, and for the conduct and safety of persons using the same and also with regard to persons using or walking on the banks of the River Severn within the borough or passing over either of the footbridges or the new road (Work No. 6) above-mentioned, and to impose, enforce and recover penalties for the breach or non-observance of any of such bye-laws, rules and regulations.

13. To prevent any encroachment on the banks of the River Severn within the borough or the tipping of refuse or other matter into the river or upon its banks, and to make such further provision as may be prescribed by the Bill for keeping the waters of the river clean and free from obstruction or pollution.

14. To confirm with or without amendment any agreement entered into between the Corporation and any railway company with reference to the new road (Work No. 6), and to enable the Corporation to bear the expense of providing booking clerks and other officials in connection therewith.

15. To constitute the Corporation the burial authority for the borough, to dissolve the Shrewsbury Burial Board, to transfer to and vest in the Corporation as such burial authority the cemetery and other lands and property now belonging to the Board, to confer on the Corporation all the necessary powers for the management, control and maintenance of such

cemetery when vested in them and any extension thereof, to reserve any rights of burial in such cemetery or any extension thereof for the inhabitants of the parish of Meole Brace, to transfer all debts and liabilities of the Board to the Corporation as such burial authority and to pay compensation to the officers of the Board.

16. To empower the Corporation to purchase and take by compulsion or agreement the following lands in the parish of Meole Brace, in the county of Salop, for the enlargement of the cemetery (namely):—

All that field numbered 192 on the Ordnance Map of the said parish of Meole Brace (scale 1:25,000, Second edition, 1902).

17. To authorize the Corporation to lay out and maintain the same as part of the cemetery, and to erect mortuary chapels and other buildings and fences thereon.

18. To empower the Corporation to undertake the maintenance and care of graves and the preservation of tombstones, tablets and other memorials and generally to provide for the care of the cemetery and the orderly conduct of persons frequenting the same.

19. To authorize the Corporation to purchase, take over and use by compulsion or agreement the field or enclosure of land in the parish of Holy Cross and St. Giles, in the borough of Shrewsbury, and numbered 173 on the Ordnance Map of that parish (scale 1:25,000, Second edition, 1902) and to lay out the same as a recreation ground or for ornamental purposes, and to do all such acts as may be necessary for laying out, improving and maintaining the same and for preserving the river banks which bound the said field or enclosure.

20. To enable the Corporation to provide entertainments in any public park or recreation ground belonging to them, and to advertise the same.

21. To empower the Corporation to sell, demise or otherwise dispose of any lands which they may not require and to enact that the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts shall not apply to any such sale or disposal.

22. To enable the Corporation to undertake the free wiring of houses for electric lighting purposes, and to make such charges therefor as may be fixed by the Corporation or prescribed by the Bill.

23. To authorize the Corporation to supply, fix, repair, and remove electrical fittings of all kinds and all materials and works necessary in connection therewith and to take such remuneration and make such terms and conditions as they may think fit.

24. To require any person who has a separate supply from any installation other than that of the Corporation to pay a minimum charge for any supply he may require from the Corporation and to enable the Corporation to impose other terms and conditions in connection with such supply.

25. To require electric lighting consumers to give notice to the Corporation before removing from any premises supplied with electric current by the Corporation, to provide that the Corporation may refuse to supply electric energy to persons owing money to the Corporation, and to authorize the Corporation to allow discounts or rebates on electric lighting and power accounts.
