SHORES OR BANKS OF THE SEA AT BLACKPOOL, SOUTH DEVON.

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

Whereas the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, find it necessary for the protection of the Port of Dartmouth to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea between the eastern and western limits of Blackpool Sands, South Devon, being within the said port.

Now the Board of Trade do hereby, by this Order, prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the sea between the limits above mentioned.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Morecambe, in the county Palatine of Lancaster (hereinafter called "the Corporation") intend to apply to the Board of Trade on or before the 23rd day of December, 1908, for a Provisional Order (hereinafter called "the Order") to be confirmed by Parliament in the next Session for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorize the Corporation so soon as they have acquired the tramways in the borough of Morecambe of the Morecambe Tramways Company (hereinafter called the Company) to construct, lay down, reconstruct, form, work, use and maintain the tramways and works hereinafter described with all necessary and proper rails, plates, sleepers, junctions, turntables, turnouts, crossings, passing places, cross overs, stables, carriage sheds, buildings, works and conveniences connected therewith respectively.

Tramway No. 3 (partly a reconstruction of the tramway authorized by the Morecambe Urban District Council Tramways Order, 1897 (hereinafter called "the Order of 1897") and partly a new tramway, commencing in Marine-road by a junction with the proposed tramway No. 2 at the termination thereof, as above described, and passing thence in an easterly direction along Marine-road and Victoria-esplanade and terminating in that Esplanade at a point 2 chains east of the western side of the road leading from the shore to the village of Bare and 2 chains east of the north-easterly corner of the garden of Bare White House.

Tramways Nos. 1, 2 and 3 will be laid as double lines throughout.

Portions of the proposed tramways are intended to be so laid that for a distance of 30 feet or upwards a less space than 9 feet 6 inches will intervene between the outside of the footpath on both sides of the streets or roads hereinafter mentioned and the nearest rail of the tramway between the following points (that is to say):—

Tramway No. 1.—

In Marine-road—

Between the east side of Albert-road and 12 yards east of the gate on the easterly side of the Midland Railway Company's level crossings.

Tramway No. 2.—

In Marine-road—

Between the east side of Green-street and the entrance to No. 2, Eidsforth-terrace.

Between points respectively opposite the easterly gable of Calton Cottage and opposite the entrance to No. 5, Calton-terrace.

Between points respectively opposite the westerly gable of No. 9, Brighton-terrace, and opposite to the entrance to No. 1, East View-terrace.

2. To authorize the Corporation for all or any of the purposes of the proposed tramways and works and of any tramway constructed by the Corporation or now or hereafter belonging to or to be acquired by them (all of which tramways are hereinafter called "the Corporation Tramways") and other the objects and purposes of the Order to purchase and acquire lands and houses, and to erect thereon offices, buildings and other conveniences and to appropriate and use for any of the purposes of the Order any lands vested in them and to enable the Corporation to sell, convey, lease, let, exchange and otherwise dispose of any lands and houses which may be acquired by or vested in them in connection with the Corporation tramways.

3. To authorize and empower the Corporation from time to time to take up and remove any of the Corporation tramways or any part or parts thereof respectively which may have been laid in any street or streets which may hereafter be widened or improved or in which a substituted tramway is to be laid and to relay the same and to use the materials thereof for relaying the same

or for the substituted tramway as the case may be.

4. To authorize and empower the Corporation to enter upon and open the surface of and to alter and stop up, remove and otherwise interfere with streets, highways, public roads, ways, footpaths, watercourses, railways, tramways, level crossings, bridges, sewers, drains, pavements, thoroughfares, water pipes, gas pipes, electric pipes, tubes, wires and apparatus in any parish or place mentioned in this Notice for the purpose of constructing, maintaining, repairing, removing, renewing, altering or reinstating the Corporation tramways or for the purposes of the intended Order.

5. To empower the Corporation, with such consents and subject to such conditions (if any) as may be prescribed or provided for by the intended Order, to take up and remove from time to time any of the Corporation tramways and to relay the same in such part of the road as the Corporation may think fit to lay double lines in lieu of single or interlacing lines or interlacing lines in lieu of double or single lines on any of the tramways for the time being belonging to the Corporation or to be constructed under the intended Order or any other Order or Act of Parliament.

7. To empower the Corporation from time to time to make such crossings, passing places, sidings, loops, junctions and other works in addition to those particularly specified in this Notice as may be necessary for the efficient working of the Corporation tramways or any of them, or for providing access to any stables or carriage sheds or works connected with such tramways or for effecting junctions with any other tramways.

8. To enable the Corporation when by reason of the execution of any work affecting the surface or soil of any street, road or thoroughfare or otherwise it is expedient to remove or discontinue the use of any of the Corporation tramways or any part thereof, to make in the same or any adjacent street, road or thoroughfare in any parish or place mentioned in this Notice and maintain so long as occasion may require a temporary tramway or temporary tramways in lieu of the tramway or part of a tramway so removed or discontinued to be used or intended so to be.

9. To authorize the Corporation to reconstruct and to make such alterations in the tramways constructed in the borough of Morecambe, under the powers of the Act of 1886, the Order of 1892 and the Order of 1897, or any part or parts thereof, and to execute all such works of and in connection therewith and in, over or under the streets or roads on which the same are laid as may be necessary or expedient.

17. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might interfere with the objects of the intended Order and to confer other rights and privileges.

To empower the Council to sell and let on hire or otherwise deal in, fix and repair meters, pipes, fittings, engines, stoves, lamps, slot-meters, cookers, heating and other apparatus incidental to the supply, use or consumption of gas, and to exclude the same from liability to distress or to be taken in proceedings in bankruptcy.

7. To authorize the Council to purchase and take on lease lands, houses and buildings, and to hold, sell and dispose of the same, notwithstanding the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, and to erect and maintain dwelling-houses for persons in their employ.

8. To empower the Council to levy and recover rates, rents and charges for the supply of gas and for the sale and hire of meters, stoves and fittings, and to alter existing rates, rents and charges.

9. To empower the Council and any local authority, company or person within or beyond the limits of the intended Act, to enter into and fulfil contracts and agreements in relation to the supply of gas by the Council in bulk or otherwise.

10. To alter, vary or extend the provisions of the Prestatyn Water Act, 1901, and the Prestatyn Water Order, 1881, so as to secure to the Council a larger and more regular supply of water from the Ffynnon Asaph Spring and in particular to alter, vary or repeal all or any of the provisions of sections 20 and 21 of that Act.

11. To raise or require the raising of the gauge at the Ffynnon Asaph Spring so as to allow the passing of water through the pipe constructed under the powers of the Prestatyn Water Act, 1901, at all times.

12. To authorize the Council to acquire, by compulsion or agreement, the lands shown on the deposited plan and described in the deposited book of reference hereinafter referred to and to erect and furnish a town hall with offices and conveniences thereon, to alter existing buildings, to let the same for concerts and entertainments or other purposes, and to advertise the same.

fences, to prevent sand from being blown off the seashore, and to require landowners to take proper means to prevent sand being blown off their lands.

14. To make it unlawful for persons to throw rubbish or filth on the seashore or to take sand or shingle therefrom, and to provide that the seashore shall be deemed to be a public street or place for certain police purposes.
