Nsples, Offeber 27. This day arrived here the Spanish Armada, consisting of 19 Men of War, several Fireships, and 20 G. Liegtown, Novemb. 1. On the 30th of the last month the Count a'Efiree app and off of this place with 14 Ven of War and Fireships; and after having converred with the Free ca Consul residing here, who went an board him, he set sail again, taking his Course back towards Toulon.

The Regiment of Nontecuculi p sted through this City on the 3d instant, with that of Pals, who are going to Mantua, and the Regiment of Commercy to Parma. The two Bayarian Regiments encamped two or three days no fir from this place, and on the 4th marched towards Genary; though they advance but slowly, for that they expect to be countermanded. The Spanish Forces are returned to the Milanexe.

Peter Waradin, October 28. The Imperial forces continue encamped near this place, to observe the Enemy, who lie still about Belgrade: But there being no prospect of any Action, and the Scason obliging the Trosps on both sides togo into their Winter-quarters, Prince Lewis of Buden has left the Army under the Command of the Duke de Cray, and is returned to Figura. A strong Budy of the Enamics Forces have pissed the Danube, with Orders to supply Tem forces, and their other Garisons in Upper Hungary, with Provisions, and all other Nec states for their Detence and Substitence during the Winter; upon which, a Reinforcement has been sent to General Viteraui, who commands on the frontiers of Transstant, in order to oppol, their Deign. This day arrived here a Turkish Express, named Mustapha Sipahi, from Belgrade, with Letters from the Heer Van Heemskerke, Ambassador from the States General of the United Provinces, giving an Account of his having had Audiance of the Grand Visier, and of the good disposition he found him in towards a Peace.

We understand by Letters from the Dutch Ambassador at Besgrade, of the 25th past, That he has had Audit nee of the Visier, who received him very well, and shewed an inclination to a Peace; sending his Proposals by an Express to the Port, and desiring he would go with him to idvianable. In the mean time, the Preparations for the War are made here with great application, and several Conserences have been held about selling the new Levics which the Emperor has resolved to make against the next Spring. The Auxiliary Troops of Bavaria and Munster are returning from Hungary, to serve on the Rhine, whither they will be followed by several Imperial Regiments. My Lord Paget, Ambassadid from Their Marsties of Great Britain, intends to set out from hence next Monday on his Journey towards Turkey.
