The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the fifth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the fourteenth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-second day of the same month, a certain part of the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bromley, in the said county of Middlesex and in the said diocese of London, was constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and such district was named, 'The District of All Hallows, East India Docks.'

"And whereas the said district of All Hallows, East India Docks, has become a new parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, shall be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly

represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, shall be altered so that all that portion of the parish of Poplar, in the said county of Middlesex and in the said diocese of London, which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the parish of Poplar, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, and to be annexed to the new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, in the said county and diocese, being all that portion of the said parish of Poplar which is bounded upon the south by the middle of the River Thames, upon the east by the new parish of Saint Luke, Victoria Docks, upon the north by the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Barking-road, both in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans, upon the north-west partly by the last named new parish and partly by the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, from the said parish of Poplar crosses the water's edge of the eastern side of the East India (Import) Dock, and extending thence south-eastward and in a straight line for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to the middle of the north-western end of the lock connecting the East India (Import) Dock Basin, and extending thence first south-eastward along the middle of the said lock, then south-eastward across the western end of the East India Dock Basin (thereby keeping generally at the same distance as before from the water's edge of the western side of the said Basin) and then south-eastward along the middle of the westernmost of the two locks connecting the East India Dock Basin with the River Thames for a distance in all of fifteen chains or thereabouts to the southern end of the last mentioned lock, and extending thence in a straight line due south to a point in the middle of the River Thames upon the boundary which divides the said county of Middlesex from the county of Kent."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby
