**MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.**

County of Buckingham.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of Buckingham have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the

following roads or parts of roads within the urban district of Slough, that is to say:—

So much of the Bath-road (including High-street) as extends from its junction with the road leading to Langley Marish to the Mission Church at Salt-hill at the western boundary of the urban district;

So much of Uxbridge-road as extends from its junction with High-street to the bridge over the Grand Junction Canal;

William-street and so much of Stoke-road as extends therefrom to a point opposite the terminal basin of the Grand Junction Canal;

Ragstone-road and Ledger's-lane with the piece of cross road connecting them under the railway bridge.

Now, therefore, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do by this Instrument under our common seal, with the consent (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said John William, Bishop of Carlisle, and of the said John Eustace Prescott and of the said William Sully Unwin, hereby declare that the said new church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate within the said new parish of Saint John, Plumpton Wall, and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be and the same is hereby substituted for the said old parish church of Saint John the Evangelist, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said new parish of Saint John, Plumpton Wall, in lieu of the said old parish church of Saint John the Evangelist, as fully in all respects as if the said new church of Saint John the Evangelist, so hereby substituted, had been originally the parish church of the same new parish; and we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as hereinafter mentioned) do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church of Saint John the Evangelist, or of or belonging to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof, to the said new church of Saint John the Evangelist (now being by virtue of these presents the parish church of the said new parish of Saint John, Plumpton Wall) and to the Vicar or Incumbent thereof and his successors for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have set our common seal, and the said John William, Bishop of Carlisle, has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal and the said John Eustace Prescott and the said William Sully Unwin have respectively set their hands and affixed their seals, this nineteenth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight.
