

affected with American Gooseberry Mildew (*Sphaerotheca mors-uvae*) he shall forthwith communicate the fact to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries and serve on the occupier of the premises on which the bush is found, a notice prohibiting, until the notice is withdrawn by a like notice, the removal of any gooseberry or currant bush from those premises, and any person who shall remove any bush in contravention of a notice under this Article shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Definitions.

5. In this Order—

"Bush" includes a cutting, stock, or seedling, and any part of a bush, except the fruit;

"Landing" includes introduction through the post.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and eight.

Short Title.

7. This Order may be cited as the AMERICAN GOOSEBERRY MILDEW (PROHIBITION OF IMPORTATION OF BUSHES) AMENDMENT ORDER OF 1908. (No. 2.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of December, nineteen hundred and eight.
