

Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of South Reston and the church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty, Your heirs and successors, in right of Your said Duchy of Lancaster, and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Lincoln and their successors for ever and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Rushden and the church thereof shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Lincoln and from their

successors and shall become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty Your heirs and successors in right of Your said Duchy of Lancaster and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edmond George, Lord Fitzmaurice, now Chancellor of the said Duchy of Lancaster, and by his successors Chancellors of the same Duchy on behalf of Your Majesty Your heirs and successors in right of Your said Duchy.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fifth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the

Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Tidenham, in the county and diocese of Gloucester.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Tidenham is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Julia Charlotte Higford, of Hartsfield, near Betchworth, in the county of Surrey, widow of the late Higford Higford, formerly of Hartsfield aforesaid, Esquire, and the Honourable Norman Macleod Sinclair, of 12, Palace Gardens-terrace, Kensington in the county of Middlesex (hereinafter called the Trustees) upon the trusts of the will of the said Higford Higford and the said Julia Charlotte Higford would if the said benefice were now vacant be entitled to nominate thereto and under the trusts of the said will Margaret Higford, of Hartsfield aforesaid, spinster, Lilian Sinclair, wife of the said Norman Macleod Sinclair,
