HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty (Queen Victoria, chapter thirtynine, and of the Acts therein mentioned that is to say the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter oue hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one huudred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid betore His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the third day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words following, that is to say:-
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned that is to say the Act of the third and fourta years of Her said late Majesty, chapter oue hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Act of the thirtyfirst and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have preparel: and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Saint John the Apostle, Marchwood, in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester.
"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage.of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint John the Apostle, Marchwood, is vested
for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Reverend Charles Lambert Coghlan, of the Vicarage, Marchwood, Clerk in Huly Orders.
"And whereas the said Charles Lambert Coghlan is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint John the Apostle, Marchwood, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Winchester and his successors.
"And whereas the Right Reverend Herbert Edward, now Bishop of Winchester, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the dincese which by the Acts in the bereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.
"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Saint John the Apostle, Marchwood, which is hereinbefore meutioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will render the same benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowsou so recommended and proposed to be trausferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the particular district or new parish of Saint John the Apostle, Marchwood.
" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Charles Lambert Coghlan (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and
propose that upon and from the day of the date of the pnblication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any convevance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole adyowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint John the Apostle, Marchwood, now vested in him, the said Charles Lambert Coghlan. as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same Bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, and by his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.
" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts: and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

## PARISH OF HAMMERSMITH.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Hammersmith;
And to all others whom it may concern.
Whereas by a General Order dated the 14th day of December, 1852, which is in force in the Parish of Hammersmith, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of out-door relief to poor persons :

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Parish.

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows :-

Article I.-The Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Hammersmith may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution
(hereinafter referred to as ! the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Respolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

Article II.-(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse the wife and family of any ablebodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse:
(2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while bis wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.
(3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of subdivision (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time or any part of the time of his absence.

Article III.-This Order shall operate and have effect until the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nive hupndred and nine.
