The measures against Taganrog and Kherson (five days quarautine and disinfection) remain unaltered. The measures applied to pilgrim ships from any Russian port also remain unaltered.

The latest news of cholera in Persia is more reassuring, and the Constantinople Board of Health have consequently removed all restrictions in connection with the admission of carpets to Turkey from Persia.
