Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these Presents authorize and appoint you, the said Richard Frederick Cavendish (Chairman); Edmund, Baron Lochee; Edwin Samuel Montagu; Sir Francis John Stephens Hopwood; Sir Charles Norton Edgcumbe Eliot; William Pember Reeves; and John Walter Hills to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said enquiry:

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever:

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid:

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this, Our Commission, shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from

time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in your inquiries We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved Charles Donald Robertson, Esquire, of the Treasury, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of Middlesex.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

FOREIGN MEAT REGULATIONS.

To the Mayor, Commonalty, and Citizens of the city of London, being the Port Sanitary Authority of the Port of London;—
 To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled;—
 To the Officers of Customs for the Port of London;—
 To the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District of the Port of London;—
 To the Medical Officer of Health for the City of London;—
 To all Masters of Ships;—
 And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Article XVI of the Public Health (Foreign Meat) Regulations, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), it is provided that a Sanitary Authority and a Local Authority, or two or more Sanitary Authorities or Local Authorities shall act together for the purposes of the Regulations in every case in which We, the Local Government Board, by Order, require any such joint action, and that in every such case the Regulations shall, in relation to each Sanitary Authority, to each District of a Sanitary Authority, to each Local Authority, and to each area of a Local Authority to whom and to which the Order applies, have effect subject to such adaptations and modifications as are made by the Order;

And whereas the Mayor, Commonalty, and Citizens of the City of London are the Port Sanitary Authority of the Port of London and are hereinafter referred to as "the Port Sanitary Authority," and the Port of London is hereinafter referred to as "the Port Sanitary District," and, within the meaning and for the purposes of the Regulations, the Port Sanitary Authority are a Sanitary Authority, and the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London in Common

Council assembled (hereinafter referred to as "the Common Council") are a Local Authority;

And whereas it is expedient that provision be made for joint action by the Port Sanitary Authority and the Common Council for the purposes of the Regulations.

Now therefore, We do, by this Our Order, require that the Port Sanitary Authority and the Common Council shall act together for the purposes of the Regulations.

For the purpose of such joint action as aforesaid, the Regulations shall, in relation to the Common Council, to the area of the Common Council, to the Port Sanitary Authority, and to the Port Sanitary District, apply and have effect, subject to the adaptations and modifications made by the several Paragraphs hereinafter set forth.

Paragraph No. 1.—Except in any case to which Paragraph No. 3 relates, the Regulations shall, with respect to foreign meat delivered or landed at any place within the area of the Common Council, be executed and enforced by the Common Council, by the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common Council, and by any other Officer of the Common Council, as if the Common Council were a Sanitary Authority, and the area of the Common Council were a District within the meaning of the Regulations, and in every case in which, in pursuance of this Paragraph, the Regulations are required to be so executed and enforced, the Regulations shall have effect as if there were added to the Regulations the following provisions; that is to say:—

(i.) Where, in pursuance of subdivision (5) of Article III of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has given a certificate in writing with respect to any foreign meat, nothing in the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Common Council, shall empower or require the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common Council to examine the meat, except in any case in which he has reason to believe that the meat is diseased, unsound, unwholesome, or unfit for human consumption; and, in that case, in relation to the area of the Common Council, Article IV, and any other provisions of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Common Council, which relate to matters connected with, incidental to, or consequent upon any proceeding under that Article shall have effect as if they were, in terms, made applicable to the case.

(ii.) Where, in pursuance of Article III of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has been informed by the Officer of Customs to the effect of a notice with respect to any foreign meat delivered or landed within the area of the Common Council, the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common Council shall, after the receipt by him from the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District of any such notice in writing as, in pursuance of subdivision (i.) of Paragraph No. 2, he is required to give with respect to the meat, proceed in relation to the meat, and for the purpose of any such proceeding and otherwise in relation to the meat, Article III and any other provisions of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Common Council, which relate to matters connected with, incidental to, or consequent upon any proceeding under that Article shall have effect, in all respects, as if the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common

Council were the Medical Officer of Health whom the Officer of Customs had informed to the effect of the notice.

(iii.) The Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common Council shall give to the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District one copy of every notice or certificate given by the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common Council in pursuance of Article III of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Common Council, and of subdivision (ii.) of this Paragraph.

(iv.) All expenses incurred by the Common Council in executing and enforcing the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Common Council, shall be defrayed out of the general rate of the City of London.

Paragraph No. 2.—Except in any case to which Paragraph No. 3 relates, the Regulations shall, with respect to foreign meat delivered or landed at a place within the area of the Common Council, be executed and enforced by the Port Sanitary Authority, by the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, and by any other officer of the Port Sanitary Authority, as if in every case in which, in pursuance of this Paragraph, the Regulations are required to be so executed and enforced, there were added to the Regulations the following provisions; that is to say:—

(i.) Where, in pursuance of Article III of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has been informed by the Officer of Customs to the effect of a notice with respect to any foreign meat delivered or landed at a place within the area of the Common Council, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District shall forthwith, by a notice in writing given to the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common Council, state the effect of the information which the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has received from the Officer of Customs, and shall, in the notice, set forth the description of the meat to which that information relates, and such other details as will suffice to identify the particular consignment and the place of delivery or of landing.

(ii.) The Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District shall keep in his custody, for a period of not less than twelve months, every such copy of a notice or certificate as the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common Council is required to give to the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District in pursuance of Article III of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Common Council, by virtue of subdivision (ii.) of Paragraph No. 1.

Paragraph No. 3.—(i.) In every case in which the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, in pursuance of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, has examined any foreign meat upon a ship within the Port Sanitary District, and has, by a notice in writing, forbidden the removal of the meat for any purpose other than exportation, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District may, by a notice in writing, of which he shall give one copy to the importer, one copy to the Common Council, and one copy to the Port Sanitary Authority, declare that, by reason of urgency, or other exceptional circumstances, it is, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, necessary that the Regulations shall apply to all subsequent procedure in the case, as if the area of the Common

Council formed part of the Port Sanitary District.

From and after any such declaration by the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, the Regulations shall have effect and shall be enforced and executed, and all powers and duties conferred or imposed by the Regulations upon any Justice, upon the Sanitary Authority, upon any officer of the Sanitary Authority, and upon any other person, shall be exercised and discharged, and the Regulations shall in all other respects apply in relation to the case as if the area of the Common Council formed part of the Port Sanitary District.

(ii.) Every notice given by the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, in pursuance of this paragraph, shall set forth the description of the foreign meat to which the notice relates, and such other details as will suffice to identify the particular consignment; and the notice may be given by properly addressing, prepaying, and posting a letter containing the notice.

Paragraph No. 4.—All expenses incurred by the Port Sanitary Authority for any purpose of Paragraph No. 2 or of Paragraph No. 3 shall be paid out of the funds applicable towards defraying any other expenses of the Port Sanitary Authority.

Paragraph No. 5.—Except so far as is otherwise provided by or is necessary for a purpose of any preceding paragraph, nothing in the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, shall have effect in relation to the area of the Common Council.

And We do hereby further require the Common Council to cause this Order to be published in the London Gazette.

This Order may be cited as "The City of London (Foreign Meat Regulations) Order, 1908"; and this Order, and the Regulations, as having effect subject to the adaptations and modifications made by this Order, shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

Whereas by Article XII of the Public Health (First Series: Unsound Food) Regulations, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), it is provided that a Sanitary Authority and a Local Authority, or two or more Sanitary Authorities or Local Authorities shall act together for the purposes of the Regulations in every case in which We, the Local Government Board, by Order, require any such joint action, and that in every such case the Regulations shall, in relation to each Sanitary Authority, to each District of a Sanitary Authority, to each Local Authority, and to each area of a Local Authority to whom and to which the Order applies, have effect subject to such adaptations and modifications as are made by the Order;

And whereas the Mayor, Commonalty, and Citizens of the City of London are the Port Sanitary Authority of the Port of London and are hereinafter referred to as "the Port Sanitary Authority," and the Port of London is hereinafter referred to as "the Port Sanitary District," and, within the meaning and for the purposes of the Regulations, the Port Sanitary Authority are a Sanitary Authority, and the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled (hereinafter referred to as "the Common Council") are a Local Authority;

(i.) Nothing in the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Common Council, shall confer any power or impose any duty with respect to the examination of an article of food while it is on board a ship, or after it has been

delivered overside, and before it has been landed, or, except so far as subdivision (iii.) of this paragraph otherwise provides, with respect to any matter connected with, incidental to, or consequent upon any such examination of an article of food.

(ii.) Where, in pursuance of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has examined an article of food while it was on board a ship, or after it had been delivered overside, and before it had been landed, and, as the result of his examination, is satisfied that the article of food is sound, wholesome, and fit for human consumption, he shall, at the request of the importer, in any case in which the article of food is delivered or landed at a place within the area of the Common Council, by a notice in writing given to the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common Council, state the result of the examination of the article of food, and shall, in the notice, set forth the description of the article of food, and such other details as will suffice to identify the article of food and the place at which it has been, or will be, delivered or landed.

Where the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common Council has received any such notice in relation to an article of food delivered or landed at a place within the area of the Common Council, and has no reason to believe that the article of food, since the delivery or landing, has become unsound, or unwholesome, or unfit for human consumption, nothing in the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Common Council, shall empower or require the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common Council to examine the article of food, or to take, in relation to the article of food, such further action as might or should otherwise be taken in pursuance of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Common Council.

(iii.) Where, in pursuance of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has examined an article of food, while it was on board a ship, or after it had been delivered overside, and before it had been landed, and by a notice in writing has required that, until the article of food has been examined by a Justice, it shall not be removed from a place which is within the area of the Common Council and is specified in the notice, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District shall forthwith give one copy of the notice to the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common Council, and the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common Council, after the receipt of the copy, shall proceed in relation to the article of food and the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Common Council, shall have effect in relation to every proceeding with respect to the article of food as if the notice had been given by the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Common Council.

(iv.) All expenses incurred by the Common Council in executing and enforcing the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Common Council, shall be defrayed out of the general rate of the City of London.

Paragraph No. 2.—(i.) In every case in which the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, in pursuance of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, has

examined an article of food on board a ship within the Port Sanitary District, and, by a notice in writing, has required that, until the article of food has been examined by a Justice, the article of food shall not, without the permission of the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, be removed from the place at which he has examined it, or from any other place which he has specified in the notice, and which is within the area of the Common Council, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District may, by a notice in writing, of which he shall give one copy to the importer, one copy to the Master of the Ship, one copy to the Common Council, and one copy to the Port Sanitary Authority, declare that, by reason of urgency or other exceptional circumstances, it is, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, necessary that the Regulations shall apply to all subsequent procedure in the case as if the area of the Common Council formed part of the Port Sanitary District.

From and after any such declaration by the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, the Regulations shall have effect and shall be enforced and executed, and all powers and duties conferred and imposed by the Regulations upon any Justice, upon the Sanitary Authority, upon any Officer of the Sanitary Authority, and upon any other person, shall be exercised and discharged, and the Regulations shall in all other respects apply in relation to the case, as if the area of the Common Council formed part of the Port Sanitary District.

(ii.) Every notice given by the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District in pursuance of this Paragraph may be given by properly addressing, prepaying, and posting a letter containing the notice.

Paragraph No. 4.—Except so far as is otherwise provided by, or is necessary for a purpose of any preceding paragraph, nothing in the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, shall have effect in relation to the area of the Common Council.

And We do hereby further require the Common Council to cause this Order to be published in the London Gazette.

And whereas it is expedient that provision be made for joint action by the Port Sanitary Authority and the Southwark Council for the purposes of the Regulations:

Now therefore, We do, by this Our Order, require that the Port Sanitary Authority and the Southwark Council shall act together for the purposes of the Regulations.

For the purpose of such joint action as aforesaid, the Regulations shall, in relation to the Southwark Council, to the area of the Southwark Council, to the Port Sanitary Authority, and to the Port Sanitary District, apply and have effect, subject to the adaptations and modifications made by the several Paragraphs hereinafter set forth.

Paragraph No. 1.—Except in any case to which Paragraph No. 3 relates, the Regulations shall, with respect to foreign meat delivered or landed at any place within the area of the Southwark Council, be executed and enforced by the Southwark Council, by the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council, and by any other officer of the Southwark Council, as if the Southwark Council were a Sanitary Authority, and the area of the Southwark Council were a district within the meaning of the Regulations, and in every case in which, in pursuance of this paragraph, the Regulations

are required to be so executed and enforced, the Regulations shall have effect as if there were added to the Regulations the following provisions, that is to say:—

(i.) Where, in pursuance of subdivision (5) of Article III, of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has given a certificate in writing with respect to any foreign meat, nothing in the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Southwark Council, shall empower or require the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council to examine the meat except in any case in which he has reason to believe that the meat is diseased, unsound, unwholesome, or unfit for human consumption; and, in that case in relation to the area of the Southwark Council, Article IV and any other provisions of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Southwark Council, which relate to matters connected with, incidental to, or consequent upon any proceeding under that Article shall have effect as if they were, in terms, made applicable to the case.

(ii.) Where, in pursuance of Article III of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has been informed by the Officer of Customs to the effect of a notice with respect to any foreign meat delivered or landed within the area of the Southwark Council, the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council shall, after the receipt by him from the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District of any such notice in writing as, in pursuance of subdivision (i) of paragraph No. 2, he is required to give with respect to the meat, proceed in relation to the meat, and for the purpose of any such proceeding and otherwise in relation to the meat, Article III and any other provisions of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Southwark Council, which relate to matters connected with, incidental to, or consequent upon any proceeding under that Article shall have effect, in all respects, as if the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council were the Medical Officer of Health whom the Officer of Customs had informed to the effect of the notice.

(iii.) The Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council shall give to the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District one copy of every notice or certificate given by the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council in pursuance of Article III of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Southwark Council, and of subdivision (ii.) of this Paragraph.

(iv.) All expenses incurred by the Southwark Council in executing and enforcing the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Southwark Council, shall be defrayed out of the rate applicable towards defraying the expenses of the execution of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, in the area of the Southwark Council.

(v.) For the purposes of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Southwark Council, Section 14 of the London Government Act, 1899, shall have effect in relation to the accounts of the Southwark Council, and of any Committee appointed by the Southwark Council, and of their officers as that Section has effect in relation to the accounts specified in the Section.

Paragraph No. 2.—Except in any case to which paragraph No. 3 relates, the Regulations shall, with respect to foreign meat delivered or landed at a place within the area of the Southwark Council, be executed and enforced by the Port Sanitary Authority, by the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, and by any other officer of the Port Sanitary Authority as if in every case in which, in pursuance of this paragraph, the Regulations are required to be so executed and enforced, there were added to the Regulations the following provisions, that is to say :—

(i.) Where, in pursuance of Article III of the Regulations as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has been informed by the Officer of Customs to the effect of a notice with respect to any foreign meat delivered or landed at a place within the area of the Southwark Council, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District shall forthwith, by a notice in writing given to the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council, state the effect of the information which the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has received from the Officer of Customs, and shall in the notice, set forth the description of the meat to which that information relates, and such other details as will suffice to identify the particular consignment and the place of delivery or of landing.

(ii.) The Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District shall keep in his custody, for a period of not less than twelve months, every such copy of a notice or certificate as the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council is required to give to the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District in pursuance of Article III of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Southwark Council, by virtue of subdivision (i.) of paragraph No. 1.

Paragraph No. 3.—(i.) In every case in which the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, in pursuance of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, has examined any foreign meat upon a ship within the Port Sanitary District, and has, by a notice in writing, forbidden the removal of the meat for any purpose other than exportation, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District may, by a notice in writing of which he shall give one copy to the importer, one copy to the Southwark Council, and one copy to the Port Sanitary Authority, declare that, by reason of urgency, or other exceptional circumstances, it is, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, necessary that the Regulations shall apply to all subsequent procedure in the case as if the area of the Southwark Council formed part of the Port Sanitary District.

From and after any such declaration by the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, the Regulations shall have effect and shall be enforced and executed, and all powers and duties conferred or imposed by the Regulations upon any Justice, upon the Sanitary Authority, upon any officer of the Sanitary Authority, and upon any other person shall be exercised and discharged, and the Regulations shall in all other respects apply in relation to the case as if the area of the Southwark Council formed part of the Port Sanitary District.

(ii.) Every notice given by the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, in pursuance of this paragraph, shall set forth the

description of the foreign meat to which the notice relates, and such other details as will suffice to identify the particular consignment; and the notice may be given by properly addressing, prepaying, and posting a letter containing the notice.

Paragraph No. 4.—All expenses incurred by the Port Sanitary Authority for any purpose of Paragraph No. 2 or Paragraph No. 3 shall be paid out of the funds applicable towards defraying any other expenses of the Port Sanitary Authority.

Paragraph No. 5.—Except so far as is otherwise provided by or is necessary for a purpose of any preceding paragraph, nothing in the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, shall have effect in relation to the area of the Southwark Council.

And we do hereby further require the Southwark Council to cause this Order to be published in the London Gazette.

This Order may be cited as "The Southwark (Foreign Meat Regulations) Order, 1908"; and this Order and the Regulations, as having effect subject to the adaptations and modifications made by this Order, shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

Where, in pursuance of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has examined an article of food while it was on board a ship, or after it had been delivered overside, and before it had been landed, and, as the result of his examination, is satisfied that the article of food is sound, wholesome, and fit for human consumption, he shall, at the request of the importer, in any case in which the article of food is delivered or landed at a place within the area of the Southwark Council, by a notice in writing given to the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council, state the result of the examination of the article of food, and shall, in the notice, set forth the description of the article of food, and such other details as will suffice to identify the article of food and the place at which it has been, or will be, delivered or landed.

Where the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council has received any such notice in relation to an article of food delivered or landed at a place within the

area of the Southwark Council, and has no reason to believe that the article of food since the delivery or landing, has become unsound, or unwholesome, or unfit for human consumption, nothing in the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Southwark Council, shall empower or require the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council to examine the article of food, or to take, in relation to the article of food, such further action as might or should otherwise be taken in pursuance of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Southwark Council.

(iii.) Where, in pursuance of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has examined an article of food, while it was on board a ship, or after it had been delivered overside, and before it had been landed, and by a notice in writing has required that, until the article of food has been examined by a Justice, it shall not be removed from a place which is within the area of the Southwark Council and is specified in the notice, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District shall forthwith give one copy of the notice to the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council, and the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council, after the receipt of the copy, shall proceed in relation to the article of food and the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Southwark Council, shall have effect in relation to every proceeding with respect to the article of food as if the notice had been given by the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Southwark Council.

No. 1.—I. CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING BRITISH PORTS.

(1) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that circumstances may arise in which it may be necessary, on account of periodical exercises, manœuvres, or otherwise, to forbid all entrance to the Naval Ports at night, this is to give notice that on approaching the shores of Great Britain, or any port of the British Empire, if search lights are observed to be in constant operation, the Naval Ports should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist outside, or that the entrances may be altogether closed.

(2) If an entrance to a port is closed, three red vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, and as far as possible notice of this fact will be given by look-out vessels in the offing.

In this case vessels must either proceed to the position marked “Examination Anchorage” on the Admiralty Charts, and anchor there, or keep the sea.

II. EXAMINATION SERVICE.

(1) In the event of relations becoming strained between this country and any Naval Power, it may become necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter the ports or localities in the United Kingdom and His Majesty's Possessions abroad, mentioned at the end of this Notice.

(2) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (4) will be charged with the duty of examining

ships which desire to enter the ports and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor.

(3) As the institution of the Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, at such times of strained relations, to keep a sharp look out for any vessel carrying the above mentioned flags or lights, and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun.

(4) By day the distinguishing flags of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border) and a blue ensign.

Also, three red vertical balls if the port is closed.

By night the steamer will carry:—

(a) Three red vertical lights if the port is closed.

(b) Three white vertical lights if the port is open.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show an unbroken light around the horizon.

(5) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any of these ports when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions as to entry given to them by the Examination Steamer. In the absence of any instructions from the Examination Steamer they must proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty Charts and anchor there.

(6) In case of fog, masters of vessels are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the Examination Anchorage itself should be approached with caution.

(7) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.
