## NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Newcastle upon Tyne Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Newcastle upon Tyne Union, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of outdoor relief to poor persons in the said Union:

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Union:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

Article I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Newcastle upon Tyne Union may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

Article II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse the wife and family of any ablebodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse.

- (2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, norwithout the consent of the Guardians.
- (3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of subdivision (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time or any part of the time of his absence.

Article III.—This Order shall operate and have effect until the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

ORDER of the Local Government Board; Motor Car Act, 1903; Regulations under Section 9 (1).

#### COUNTY OF EAST SUFFOLK.

Parish of Wickham Market.

To the County Council of East Suffolk;—And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas the County Council of East Suffolk, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising part of a main road situate in the parish of Wickham Market, within the county of East Suffolk, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising so much of the main road from Woodbridge to Saxmundham as is situate within the parish of Wickham Market.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come

So much of Shenley-road, in the parish of Elstree, as extends from the western side of the bridge over the Midland Railway to All Saints Church:

The Public Health (Foreign Meat) Regulations, 1908: Order under Article XVI.

LONDON PORT SANITARY AUTHORITY AND STEPNEY BOROUGH COUNCIL.

To the Mayor, Commonalty, and Citizens of the City of London, being the Port Sanitary Authority of the Port of London;— To the Council of the Metropolitan Borough

of Stepney;—

To the Officers of Customs for the Port of London;—

To the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District of the Port of London:—

To the Medical Officer of Health for the Metropolitan Borough of Stepney;—

To all Masters of ships;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Article XVI of the Public Health (Foreign Meat) Regulations, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), it is provided that a Sanitary Authority and a Local Authority, or two or more Sanitary Authorities or Local Authorities shall act together for the purposes of the Regulations in every case in which We, the Local Government Board, by Order, require any such joint action, and that in every such case the Regulations shall, in relation to each Sanitary Authority, to each District of a Sanitary Authority, to each Local Authority, and to each area of a Local Authority to whom and to which the Order applies, have effect subject to such adaptations and modifications as are made by the Order;

And whereas the Mayor, Commonalty, and Citizens of the city of London are the Port Sanitary Authority of the Port of London, and are hereinafter referred to as "the Port Sanitary Authority," and the Port of London is hereinafter referred to as "the Port Sanitary District," and, within the meaning and for the purposes of the Regulations, the Port Sanitary Authority are a Sanitary Authority, and the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Stepney (hereinafter referred to as "the Stepney Council") are a

Local Authority;

And whereas it is expedient that provision be made for joint action by the Port Sanitary Authority and the Stepney Council for the

purposes of the Regulations:
Now therefore, We do, by this Our Order, require that the Port Sanitary Authority and the Stepney Council shall Act together for the

purposes of the Regulations.

For the purpose of such joint action as aforesaid, the Regulations shall, in relation to the Stepney Council, to the area of the Stepney Council, to the Port Sanitary Authority, and to the Port Sanitary District, apply and have effect, subject to the adaptations and modifications made by the several Paragraphs hereinafter set forth.

Paragraph No. 1.—Except in any case to which Paragraph No. 3 relates, the Regulations shall, with respect to foreign meat delivered or landed at any place within the area of the Stepney Council, be executed and enforced by the Stepney Council, by the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Stepney Council, and by any other officer of the Stepney Council, as if the Stepney Council were a Sanitary Authority, and the area of the Stepney Council were a district within the meaning of the Regulations, and in every case in which, in pursuance of this paragraph, the Regulations

are required to be so executed and enforced, the Regulations shall have effect as if there were added to the Regulations the following pro-

visions, that is to say:-

(i.) Where, in pursuance of subdivision (5) of Article III, of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has given a certificate in writing with respect to any foreign meat, nothing in the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Stepney Council, shall empower or require the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Stepney Council to examine the meat except in any case in which he has reason to believe that the meat is diseased, unsound, unwholesome, or unfit for human consumption; and, in that case in relation to the area of the Stepney Council, Article IV and any other provisions of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Stepney Council, which relate to matters connected with, incidental to, or consequent upon any proceeding under that Article shall have effect as if they were, in terms, made applicable to the case.

(ii.) Where, in pursuance of Article III of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has been informed by the Officer of Customs to the effect of a notice with respect to any foreign meat delivered or landed within the area of the Stepney Council, the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Stepney Council shall, after the receipt by him from the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District of any such notice in writing as, in pursuance of subdivision (i) of paragraph No. 2, he is required to give with respect to the meat, proceed in relation to the meat, and for the purpose of any such proceeding and otherwise in relation to the meat, Article III and any other provisions of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Stepney Council, which relate to matters connected with, incidental to, or consequent upon any proceeding under that Article shall have effect, in all respects, as if the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Stepney Council were the Medical Officer of Health whom the Officer of Customs had informed to the effect of the notice.

(iii.) The Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Stepney Council shall give to the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District one copy of every notice or certificate given by the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Stepney Council in pursuance of Article III of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Stepney Council, and of subdivision (ii.) of this Paragraph.

(iv.) All expenses incurred by the Stepney Council in executing and enforcing the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Stepney Council, shall be defrayed out of the rate applicable towards defraying the expenses of the execution of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, in the area of the Stepney

Council.

(v.) For the purposes of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Stepney Council, Section 14 of the London Government Act, 1899, shall have effect in relation to the accounts of the Stepney Council, and of any Committee appointed by the Stepney Council, and of their officers as that Section has effect in relation to the accounts specified in the Section.

Paragraph No. 2.—Except in any case to which paragraph No. 3 relates, the Regulations shall, with respect to foreign meat delivered or landed at a place within the area of the Stepney Council, be executed and enforced by the Port Sanitary Authority, by the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, and by any other officer of the Port Sanitary Authority as if in every case in which in pursuance of this paragraph, the Regulations are required to be so executed and enforced, there were added to the Regulations the following provisions, that is to say:

(i.) Where, in pursuance of Article III of the Regulations as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has been informed by the Officer of Customs to the effect of a notice with respect to any foreign meat delivered or landed at a place within the area of the Stepney Council, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District shall forthwith, by a notice in writing given to the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Stepney Council, state the effect of the information which the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District has received from the Officer of Customs, and shall in the notice, set forth the description of the meat to which that information relates, and such other details as will suffice to identify the particular consignment and the place of

delivery or of landing.
(ii.) The Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District shall keep in his custody, for a period of not less than twelve months, every such copy of a notice or certificate as the Medical Officer of Health for the area of the Stepney Council is required to give to the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District in pursuance of Article III of the Regulations, as applicable to the area of the Stepney Council, by virtue of sub-

division (ii.) of paragraph No. 1.

Paragraph No. 3.—(i.) In every case in which the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, in pursuance of the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, has examined any foreign meat upon a ship within the Port Sanitary District, and has, by a notice in writing, forbidden the removal of the meat for any purpose other than exportation, the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District may, by a notice in writing of which he shall give one copy to the importer, one copy to the Stepney Council, and one copy to the Port Sanitary Authority, declare that, by reason of urgency, or other exceptional circumstances, it is, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, necessary that the Regulations shall apply to all subsequent procedure in the case as if the area of the Stepney Council formed part of the Port Sanitary District.

From and after any such declaration by the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, the Regulations shall have effect and shall be enforced and executed, and all powers and duties conferred or imposed by the Regulations upon any Justice, upon the Sanitary Authority, upon any officer of the Sanitary Authority, and upon any other person shall be exercised and discharged, and the Regulations shall in all other respects apply in relation to the case as if the area of the Stepney Council formed part of the Port Sanitary District.

(ii.) Every notice given by the Medical Officer of Health for the Port Sanitary District, in pursuance of this paragraph, shall set forth the

description of the foreign meat to which the notice relates, and such other details as will suffice to identify the particular consignment; and the notice may be given by properly addressing, prepaying, and posting a letter containing the notice.

Paragraph No. 4.—All expenses incurred by the Port Sanitary Authority for any purpose of Paragraph No. 2 or of Paragraph No. 3 shall be paid out of the funds applicable towards defraying any other expenses of the Port

Sanitary Authority.

Paragraph No. 5.-Except so far as is otherwise provided by or is necessary for a purpose of any preceding paragraph, nothing in the Regulations, as applicable to the Port Sanitary District, shall have effect in relation to the area of the Stepney Council.

And we do hereby further require the Stepney Council to cause this Order to be published

in the London Gazette.

This Order may be cited as "The Stepney (Foreign Meat Regulations) Order, 1908"; and this Order and the Regulations, as having effect subject to the adaptations and modifications made by this Order, shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

LEEDS (CARDIGAN FIELDS) ALLOT-MENT GARDENS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1909.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Premises to which this Order applies.

- 1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the city of Leeds, to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said city and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.
- (2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the said Local Authority.
- (3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

# Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

#### Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies in a float, cart or van to a slaughter-house situate in the city of Leeds, for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of that city, which licence shall be in force for not more than six days inclusive of the day of issue.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained

, by the Inspector.

(3.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(4.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and shall, after their

arrival at the slaughter-house, be there detained until they are slaughtered.

# Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicle used for Conveyance of Swine.

- 4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article, shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the owner of the float, cart or van as follows:
  - (i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then
  - (ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
  - (iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

# Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

- 5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Leeds, which licence shall be in force for not more than six days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Swine may also be moved to any premises to which this Order applies if such movement is authorised by a licence (Form A) granted under and in accordance with the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.
- (3.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.
- (4.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (5.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.
- (6.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (7.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

# Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is

necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

# Local Authority to enforce Order.

7. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

# Offences.

- 8.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any float, cart or van used for the conveyance of swine, the owner, or other person for the time being in charge of the float, cart or van shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his owngacts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (5.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Interpretation.

9. In this Order-

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

"Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Place under any Order of the Board:


