Motor Car Act, 1903. Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

BALDOCK AND ROYSTON URBAN DISTRICTS.

To the County Council of Hertford :-And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Hertford, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said Subsection putting the above-mentioned provisions of that Sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the Urban Districts of Baldock and Royston, in the County of Hertford, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made. to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads which are specified in the Schedule

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the eighth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

SCHEDULE.

Urban District of Baldock.

So much of Pesthouse-lane as extends for a distance of 50 yards from its junction with Station-road and Royston-road;

So much of Royston-road as extends for a distance of 50 yards from its junction with White Horse-street and Pesthouse-lane;

Station-road;

Bygrave-lane;

So much of Norton-road as extends from its junction with Cemetery-road to the Railway Bridge, and so much of Cemetery-road as extends from its junction with Norton-road to the Orange Tree Inn;

Norton-street and Church-street;

So much of Hitchin street as extends for a distance of 50 yards from its junction with Church-street ;

White Horse-street; and

So much of High-street as extends for a distance of 50 yards from its junction with White Horse-street.

Urban District of Royston.

So much of London-road as extends from the southern entrance to "The Warren" to the junction of the road with High-street, Highstreet, and so much of Kneesworth-street as

extends therefrom to a point in Kneesworthstreet situate 50 yards north of its junction with Lower Back-street;

Lower Back-street; Melbourn-street;

So much of Newmarket-road as extends for a distance of 50 yards from its junction with Melbourn-street and Priory-lane;

So much of Melbourn-road as extends for a distance of 50 yards from its junction with Melbourn-street and Priory-lane;

Priory-lane;

Barkway-street; and

Baldock-street and so much of Baldock-road as extends therefrom to the boundary of the Urban District.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

County of Westmorland.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of Westmorland have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following roads or parts of roads in the county, that is to say:—

Rydal and Loughrigg.

1. The road commonly known as the road under Loughrigg, in the parish of Rydal and Loughrigg, extending from Rothay Bridge, near Ambleside, to Pelter Bridge, Rydal.

11. So much of the road through the parish of Burton as extends from the Old Toll Bar to a point in the road situate 100 yards north of the Church.

Casterton.

12. So much of the main road in the parish of Casterton leading through the village as extends from the Smithy to the gate of "The Grange."

Heversham.

13. So much of the main road leading through the village of Heversham as extends from the Grammar School to Plumtree Hall Gate.

Kirkby Lonsdale.

- 14. So much of the main road leading through the town of Kirkby Lonsdale as extends from Lunefield Gate to the turn (in the road leading to Crooklands) at the Bowling Green.
- 15. So much of the main road to Old Hutton as extends from the Market Square to the National School.

17. So much of the main road through the town of Kirkby Stephen as extends from the Midland Railway Station to the Gas Works.

18. So much of the Arnside to Crooklands road, in the village of Milnthorpe, as extends from Dallam Tower Old Bridge to Owlet Ash entrance.

19. So much of the Lancaster to Kendal road as extends from a point in the road situate 50 yards south of the Wesleyan Chapel to the top house in Church-street.

20. So much of the road leading from Kendal to Kirkby Lonsdale, in the village of Old Hutton, as extends from the top of Bridge End Hill to a point in the road situate 100 yards west of the School.

21. So much of the road leading from Kendal to Windermere, in the village of Over Staveley, as extends from the Eagle and Child Inn, through the village to a point in the road situate 50 yards beyond the Smithy.

A PROCLAMATION.

Isle of Man to wit.

Whereas the infectious disease, commonly called "Foot and Mouth Disease," prevails amongst animals in certain foreign countries:

And whereas in order to prevent the introduction into this Island of such disease, it is considered advisable to prohibit the importation of animals from abroad:

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and in exercise of the powers contained in The Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, do hereby order that from and after the date hereof no animal shall be imported into this Island from any place other than the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Channel Islands.

The expression "Animal" in this Order shall mean cattle and sheep, as defined by section 18 of "The Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1865," and shall also include swine and goats.

Board of Trade (Harbour Department), London, January 25, 1909.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Circular, dated January 13th, issued by the Bulgarian Government, prescribing the following quarantine measures on travellers and goods coming from Russia:—

(1) Travellers coming from Russia will only be admitted to the ports of Varna, Silistria, and Rustchuk after having undergone a medical examination and strict disinfection of their effects and baggage. They will be under surveillance at their houses by the Sanitary Authorities for 5 days.

(2) Goods of all kinds, food stuffs and animal products will be admitted freely into

the country.

(3) Ships coming from Russian ports provided with clean bills of health, which have not had on board any cases of suspected cholera, will receive free pratique in Bulgarian ports after a medical inspection of their crews and passengers, the latter to be submitted to strict disinfection in accordance with paragraph 1.

(4) All regulations contrary to those stated

above have been abolished.
