The following are the rules to be observed:

ATTENDANCES AND PRESENTATIONS.

All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, of whatever rank, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty. All Civil Officers of the Admiralty will follow the same rule.

Deputy Lieutenants of Counties and all Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Army Special Reserve, Militia, Territorial Force, Yeomanry, or Volunteers, of whiatever rank, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall; but Officers of the Household Cavalry or the Brigade of Guards should communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace.

All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the Colonies possessing responsible Government, who will apply to the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall, for their cards for attendance or for presentation by the Inspector-General. The application must in all cases be supported by

a credential from the Governor or Officer com-

manding the local Forces of the Colony.

Recorders, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and all Gentlemen connected with the Home Office, are requested to make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Home Secretary.

Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, are requested to make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

Similarly, all Gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office, Civil Staff of the War Office, or any Government Department, will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation at Levées from the Department under which they serve.

Peers, Bishops, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all Gentlemen other than the above mentioned, will be good enough to communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace, when they will each be furnished with a card of admission for use at the Levée.

The names, both for attendance and presentation at this Levée, must be received at the various Offices above indicated not later than Tuesday, the 16th instant.

Acknowledgment of applications will not be made, but cards of admission will be sent as soon as possible to the addresses given.

LLANDOVERY FAIR.

Whereas on the 6th November, 1908, a representation was made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department. by the Llandovery Town Council to the effect that a Fair has been held annually at Llandovery on the 2nd day of August, except when Sunday has fallen on that day, when the Fair has been held on the following Monday, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should in future be held on the 10th day of August in each year, or on the following Monday when August 10th is a Sunday:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when the same would be taken into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of the Fairs Act, 1873:

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should in future be held on the 10th day of August in each year, or on the following Monday when August 10th is a Sunday:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1873, do hereby order that the Fair which has been held annually at Llandovery on the 2nd day of August, except when Sunday has fallen on that day, when the Fair has been held on the following Monday, shall in future be held on the 10th day of August in each year, or on the following Monday when August 10th is a Sunday.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Glamorgan) Order, 1909.

Dated 28th January, 1909.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Glamorgan, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Glamorgan) Order, 1909."

Birds.

Close Time for Wild Duck and Woodcock varied.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Glamorgan shall be varied so far as concerns Wild Duck and Woodcock, so as to be for Wild Duck between the 1st day of February and the 1st day of July in any year, and for Woodcock between the last day of January and the 1st day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County of Glamorgan to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Common Buzzard, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Kestrel, Kite, House Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Raven, Siskin.

Certain Birds protected throughout the County during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Glamorgan:—

Bittern, Common Buzzard, Chough, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Common Guillemot, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Wood Lark, House Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Osprey, Little Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny Owl (Brown Owl, Wood Owl), White or Barn Owl, Puffin, Raven, Razorbill, Siskin, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Birds protected during the whole of the Year within a Certain Area.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied, so far as Wild Duck and Woodcock are concerned, by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited on the Promontory known as Worms Head, in the County of Glamorgan.

All Birds protected on Sundays in Certain Districts.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied, so far as Wild Duck and Woodcock are concerned, by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in all the Rural Districts in the County of Glamorgan, and in all the Urban Districts, except Neath Borough, Bridgend, Briton Ferry and Aberavon.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Glamorgan:—

Bittern, Common Buzzard, Chough, Kentish Dotterel, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Common Guillemot, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Wood Lark, House Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Water Ouzel, Oyster Catcher, Little Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny Owl (Brown Owl, Wood Owl), White or Barn Owl, Stormy Petrel, Puffin, Raven, Razorbill, Siskin, Lesser Tern, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Eggs protected within a Certain Area.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited on the

Promontory known as Worms Head, in the County of Glamorgan, for a period of five years from the date of this Order.

Repeal of former Order.

IX. The Order of the 24th April, 1908, is hereby repealed.

COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

HARPENDEN RURAL, MARKYATE AND REDBOURN PARISHES.

To the County Council of Hertford:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Hertford, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said Subsection putting the above-mentioned provisions of that Sub-section in force within the limits comprising parts of certain roads situate within the parishes of Harpenden Rural, Markyate and Redbourn, in the County of Hertford, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the

matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of Sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the parts of roads within the said parishes which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the eighth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

SCHEDULE.

Parish of Markyate.

So much of the main road from St. Albans to Dunstable, passing through the parish as extends from a point in the said road situate 360 yards or thereabouts north-west of its junction with Luton-road to a point in the road situate 4 furlongs and 60 yards or thereabouts south-east of its junction with Hicks-road.

Parishes of Redbourn and Harpenden Rural.

So much of the main road from St. Albans to Dunstable as extends from the Bridge over the River Ver to Scout Farm.

And whereas the County Council of Bucking-ham have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following roads or parts of roads within the Urban District of Slough, that is to say:—

So much of the Bath-road (including Highstreet) as extends from its junction with the road leading to Langley Marish to the Mission Church at Salt Hill at the western boundary of the Urban District;

So much of Uxbridge-road as extends from its junction with High-street to the bridge over the Grand Junction Canal;

So much of Windsor-road as is comprised within the Urban District;

William-street and so much of Stoke-road as extends therefrom to a point opposite the terminal basin of the Grand Junction Canal;

Ragstone-road and Ledger's-lane with the piece of cross-road connecting them under the railway bridge.

And whereas notice of the said application and of the time and manner in which objections should be made to any such regulation appeared in the London Gazette of the 15th day of December, 1908, in the "Slough, Eton and Windsor Observer" of the 19th day of December, 1908, and in the "Windsor and Eton Express" of the 19th and 26th days of December, 1908.
