THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

LLANDOVERY FAIR.

Whereas on the 6th November, 1908, a representation was made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Llandovery Town Council to the effect that a Fair has been held annually at Llandovery on the 2nd day of August, except when Sunday has fallen on that day, when the Fair has been held on the following Monday, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should in future be held on the 10th day of August in each year, or on the following Monday when August 10th is a Sunday:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when the same would be taken into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of the Fairs Act, 1873:

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should in future be held on the 10th day of August in each year, or on the following Monday when August 10th is a Sunday:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1873, do hereby order that the Fair which has been held annually at Llandovery on the 2nd day of August, except when Sunday has fallen on that day, when the Fair has been held on the following Monday, shall in future be held on the 10th day of August in each year, or on the following Monday when August 10th is a Sunday.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Glamorgan) Order, 1909.

Dated 28th January, 1909.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Glamorgan, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Glamorgan) Order, 1909."

BIRDS.

Close Time for Wild Duck and Woodcock varied.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Glamorgan shall be varied so far as concerns Wild Duck and Woodcock, so as to be for Wild Duck between the 1st day of February and the 1st day of July in any year, and for Woodcock between the last day of January and the 1st day of August in any year.
