Bills falling due on the 17th instant. 2. The Bills will be in amounts of $\pounds 1,000$, $\pounds 5,000$, or $\pounds 10,000$. They will be dated the 17th February, 1909, and will be payable at six months after date, viz. :--on the 17th August, 1909.

3. The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker. 4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the

Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Saturday, the 13th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Wednesday, the 17th February, 1909. 6. MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. Borough of Bexhill.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is enacted that the Local Government Board may by regulations made under section 6

of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or ou which ordinary motor car traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous :

Notice is hereby given, that the Council of the Borough of Bexhill have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made under section 6 of the Act of 1896 and section 8 of the Act of 1903, for restricting to five miles per hour the speed at which any motor car may be driven upon the highway known as Barnhorn-road, extending from the Wheatsheaf Inn at Little Common to the boundary of the Borough.

Notice is hereby further given, that objections to the making of any such regulations may be sent in writing to the Local Government Board, at their office, Whitehall, London, S.W., on or before the twenty-second day of February, 1909.
