

Crown Lands or of Crown Mineral Rights on such terms and conditions as he may think fit subject to any directions received from one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

IV. This Order shall be published in the Gazette of the High Commissioner for South Africa and shall thereupon commence and come into operation and the High Commissioner shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such a manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within Swaziland.

V. His Majesty may at any time add to, alter, or amend this Order.

VI. The Swaziland Crown Lands Order in Council, 1907, shall continue in force until the commencement of this Order, and shall thereupon be revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder.

VII. This Order may be cited for all purposes as the Swaziland Crown Lands and Minerals Order in Council, 1908.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the nineteenth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of a part or share of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of East Haddon, in the county of Northampton and in the diocese of Peterborough.

"Whereas two one-third parts or shares of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of East Haddon, that is to say, every turn or right of nomination or presentation to the said benefice which shall occur or arise on a vacancy of the said benefice happening after the date hereof for ever (with the exception of the next such turn or right of nomination or presentation and of every third succeeding turn or

right of nomination or presentation thereafter) are vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Right Reverend William Edmund, Bishop of Lebombo, Cyril Randolph Smyth, of Santa Monica, California, Ethel Mary Julia Smyth, of Firwood, Chalford, near Stroud, in the county of Gloucester, Spinster, and Edith Laura Smyth, also of Firwood, Chalford aforesaid, Spinster, as tenants in common.

"And whereas the said William Edmund, Bishop of Lebombo, Cyril Randolph Smyth, Ethel Mary Julia Smyth, and Edith Laura Smyth, are desirous that the two one-third parts or shares of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of East Haddon now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Peterborough.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Carr, now Bishop of Peterborough, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of East Haddon which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of East Haddon.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said William Edmund, Bishop of Lebombo, Cyril Randolph Smyth, Ethel Mary Julia Smyth, and Edith Laura Smyth (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme), and with the consent of the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the two one-third parts or shares of and in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of East Haddon, that is to say every turn or right of nomination or presentation to the said benefice which shall occur or arise on a vacancy of the said benefice happening after the date hereof for ever (with the exception of the next such turn or right of nomination or presentation and of every third succeeding turn or right of nomination or presentation thereafter) which said two one-third parts or shares of and in the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage are now vested in them the said William Edmund, Bishop of Lebombo, Cyril Randolph Smyth, Ethel Mary Julia Smyth, and Edith Laura Smyth as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough, and his successors in the same Bishoprick and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough, and by his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from
