

to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Paul, situate at Broughton as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that so long as the Reverend Evan Worthington Powell, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the said new parish of Brymbo, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization, or performance at the said church of Saint Paul, situate at Broughton as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said Evan Worthington Powell, and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Broughton, being:—

"All that part of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Brymbo, in the county of Denbigh and in the diocese of Saint Asaph, which is bounded upon the south-west and upon the south-east by the parish of Wrexham, upon the east and upon the north-east by the parish of Gwersyllt, both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Gwersyllt from the said new parish of Brymbo, at the centre of the bridge which carries the Bryn-Mally and Ffrwd Branch Line of the Wrexham, Mold and Connah's Quay Railway across the road leading from Ffôs-y-go to Ffrwd Inn, and extending thence south-westward in a straight line for a distance of thirty-one chains or thereabouts to the junction of Clayton-road with the road leading from Halcock-row to Bryn-Mally Colliery, and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the middle of Clayton-road for a distance of thirty-seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Long-lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Long-lane for a distance of seventy-four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Pool Mouth to Broughton Colliery, and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Forge-road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Forge-road for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading past the northern side of the Solway Coke Works, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the point where such footpath meets the fence on the eastern side of the Wrexham and Minera Branch Line of the Great Western Railway, and

extending thence south-westward in a straight line (thereby crossing the said line of railway and the road leading from Tan-y-fron to Southsea) for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the lines of railway leading to the Plas Power Colliery across the River Gwenfro upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Brymbo from the said parish of Wrexham."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Asaph.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fourteenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Stephen, Springfield, situate in the new parish (sometime particular district) of Saint Mary, Wolverhampton, in the county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Stephen, Springfield, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Honourable and Right Reverend Augustus, Bishop of the said diocese of Lichfield (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new
