The following Statutes made by the University of Cambridge have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877. 40 and 41 Vict., cap. 48," in relation to the University of Cambridge, which amending Statutes are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We the Chancellor, Masters and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 53rd Section of the said Act, do hereby alter the Statutes framed by the

said Commissioners in relation to our said University in manner following:—

By repealing Section 5 of Chapter IV of Statute A and substituting therefor the following amended Section:—

Section 5. Election of Orator, Registrary and Esquire Bedell.

The nominations and elections of persons to fill the offices of Orator, Registrary, and Esquire Bedell shall be conducted in the same manner as the nomination and election of the Vice-Chancellor, except that the Chancellor shall stand in scrutiny with the two Proctors. The election shall be made in every case within fourteen days (exclusive of any vacation) from the vacancy being known.

By adding the following Section to form Section 5 A of Chapter IV of the said Statute A:—

Section 5 A. Election of Librarian.

1. The election to the office of Librarian shall be made by a Board consisting of the Vice-Chancellor and ten persons elected by the Senate, five of such persons being nominated by the Council of the Senate and five by the Library Syndicate. One of the electors nominated by the Council of the Senate and one of those nominated by the Library Syndicate shall be when elected persons who are not resident in the University nor officially connected with it and of the remaining eight electors the four nominated by the Library Syndicate shall be when elected members of that Syndicate.

2. The first election of the Board shall take place as soon as conveniently may be after the

passing of this Statute; at this election the members who are elected as being not resident in the University nor officially connected with it shall hold office for four years; one of the four other members nominated by the Council of the Senate shall hold office for one year, one for two years, one for three years and one for four years and the four other members nominated by the Library Syndicate from their own body shall hold office for like periods. All other and future elections (save in the case of elections under paragraph 4) shall be for periods of four years. The periods for which office is held (save in the case of elections under paragraph 4) shall be reckoned in all cases from the twentieth day of February next after the date of the election.

3. In case of a vacancy on the Board occurring from any other cause than the expiration of time of tenure a new member shall be elected to fill the vacant place. He shall be nominated by the body which nominated the person whose substitute he is and under the same conditions and he shall continue a member of the Board as long as the person whose substitute he is would have continued.

4. If a member of the Board be a candidate for the office of Librarian he shall be thereby disqualified from acting in the matter of the appointment and the other members of the Board shall have power to act without him.

5. If an election to the Board be made in the interval between the vacancy of the office of Librarian and the election of the new Librarian, the member so elected shall not have any voice in the election of the Librarian, but the person into whose place he was elected, if not a candidate for the office of Librarian, shall retain his right to vote in that election.

6. In the event of a vacancy in the office of Librarian, the Vice-Chancellor shall give public notice of it by fixing a written or printed paper on the door of the Public Schools immediately after the vacancy is made known to him if in term time, or on the first day of the following term if the vacancy is made known to him out of term time; and within fourteen days after the date of the notice of the vacancy the Vice-Chancellor shall in like manner give notice of the day for electing a new Librarian, such day to be not less than twenty-eight days after the date of the notice of the vacancy. The names of candidates shall be sent to the Vice-Chancellor not less than five days before the date of election.

7. In the event of a vacancy in the office of Librarian occurring after the division of any term and before the beginning of the next ensuing term the day for electing a new Librarian shall be some day before the end of the next ensuing term, and in the event of a vacancy occurring after the beginning and before the division of any term the day for electing a new Librarian shall be some day before the division of the next ensuing term.

8. The Board shall have power on any election to adjourn the election for the purpose of considering the qualifications of the persons whose names have been brought before them, or ascertaining whether some other person, whom the Board might prefer, is willing to take the office.

The Board shall also have power to regulate in general its own proceedings, but no election of a Librarian shall be made unless two-thirds at least of the number of the existing Board be present at the time of voting.

9. In the final voting no election shall be made unless a majority of the votes of the

members present be given for some one person; and if no election be made within twelve weeks from the day for electing, the appointment of the Librarian for that turn shall be made by the Chancellor of the University. For the purposes of this section the Vice-Chancellor shall not exercise the power herein given to the Chancellor.

10. The Board shall have power to act notwithstanding one or more vacancies in the number of its members.

11. In the event of a vacancy in the office of Librarian occurring in the interval between the passing of this Statute and the twentieth day of February next after the first election of the Board, the election to the office of Librarian shall be made as if the Statute hereby repealed remained in force.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of New College, Oxford, on the seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eight (and sealed on the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and nine), has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, 40 and 41 Vict., cap. 48, and approved by the late Queen in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to New College, in the University of Oxford, in the matter of Honorary Scholarships, such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and passed by the unanimous votes of those present and voting.

To add the following new Clause to Statute IV:—

Honorary Scholarships.

10. "The Warden and Fellows shall have power to elect to an Honorary Scholarship any Exhibitioner or Commoner of the College who shall have distinguished himself in the examinations of the University, or otherwise. Provided that there shall be no limit of age for such Honorary Scholars, and that they shall be elected only at a stated General Meeting after due notice given.

"Honorary Scholars shall receive no emoluments as Scholars, but shall in all other respects be on the same footing as the other Scholars of the College."

DUMFRIES-SHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS)
ORDER OF 1909.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of either of the Districts specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in

one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

- Section forty-three (powers of police);
- Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the DUMFRIES-SHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1909.

LLANRWST (MARKETS AND SALES)
ORDER OF 1909.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Regulation of Exposure of Animals for sale within the Urban District of Llanrwst.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order—

- (i.) No market or sale of animals shall be held in or upon any market-place, highway, sale-yard or other premises in the urban district of Llanrwst, in the administrative county of Denbigh, until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date on which the premises were previously so used unless the premises, or a part thereof sufficient to accommodate the number of animals usually exposed at such market or sale, are so paved with cement, concrete, asphalt, or other hard material impervious to water, as to permit of the same being effectually cleansed by washing; and
- (ii.) No swine shall be exposed for sale, whether in a vehicle or not, in or upon any part of a street or highway in the urban district of Llanrwst unless such part of the street or highway is so paved with cement, concrete, asphalt, or other hard material impervious to water, as to permit of the same being effectually cleansed by washing.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3. If any pig is exposed for sale, or any market or sale of animals is held, in contravention of this Order, the person exposing the pig or holding the market or sale, and the owner or consignee of each animal exposed at the market or sale, and the person exposing the same, and the purchaser of any animal, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market or sale to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

4. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, and goats, and all other ruminating animals, and swine:

“Person” includes any body of persons corporate or unincorporate:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and nine.

6. This Order may be cited as the LLANRWST (MARKETS AND SALES) ORDER OF 1909.
