PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by section three of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we have had under our consideration the rates of full and half pay at present applicable to Commanders in Your Majesty's Naval Service:

"And whereas we are of opinion that these rates are no longer adequate:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following proposals to take effect from the first April, one thousand nine hundred and nine:—

"I. Full pay of Commanders to be at the rate of twenty-two shillings a day:

"II. Half-pay to be at the rate of elevenshillings and sixpence a day for the first one hundred and eighty-five Commanders on the list and ten shillings a day for the remainder.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Chester) Order, 1909.

Dated 13th March, 1909.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Chester, I hereby make the following Order:-

Title.

I, This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Chester) Order, 1909."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

H. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds or any of them, is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended, throughout the County of Chester, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 13th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order shall apply within the whole of the County of Chester to the Heron and Kestrel as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act.

- Other Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, shall apply within the area named in Clause V of this Order to the following species of Wild Birds as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:-

Common Bunting, Reed Bunting, Chiffchaff, Spotted Flycatcher, Meadow Pipit (Titlark), Red-backed Shrike, Missel Thrush, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Golden-crested Wren. Wren.

All Birds Protected during the Whole of the Year within a Certain Area (Market-Garden Lands excepted).

Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited within the undermentioned area:

.The portion of the Hundred of Wirral embracing the low-lying lands and sandhills situate between the estuaries of the Rivers Dee and Mersey, of which the boundaries shall commence to the south at a point of the main highway of the county of Chester 200 yards to the west of the Dock Cottages near "Docks" Railway Station of the Wirral Railway, run along the main highway to Bidston Village, and then turn in a northerly direction and run to Bidston Railway Station of the same railway, then turn in a westerly direction and run along the Wirral Railway until it reaches the Meols Station of such railway, then run along the highway near to the Meols Railway Station in a northerly direction to the Irish Sea, then on the north along the margin of high-water mark of the Irish Sea to a point at New Brighton where the Yellow Noses joins the said Irish Sea, and then run in a southerly direction to "Warren Drive" or road, and along "Warren Drive" to the most northerly house and grounds on the west side of such drive, then along the western boundary of the houses and premises situate along the western side of such drive or road to a point 100 yards or so from Grove-road, then turning in a westerly direction along the northern boundaries of the houses and premises in Grove-road, Wallasey, until it reaches the Wirral Railway, then turning in a southerly direction along the Wirral Railway until it reaches the Wallasey Marsh, then along the edge of the marsh in a southerly direction until it reaches the Poulton Halfpenny Bridge, then turning in a westerly direction on the edge of the said marsh until it reaches along the edge of the marsh the main highway leading from Poulton to Meols.

Provided that such parts of the area aforesaid as are market-garden lands are excepted from the operation of this Clause and of Clauses $\mathbf{I}^{\mathbf{V}}$ and XI of this Order.

The area aforesaid (except market-gardet. lands, which are left uncoloured) is coloured. pink and outlined in red on a map sealed with the seal of the Secretary of State, dated the 13th March, 1909, and deposited in the office of the County Council.

Further Protection for all Birds.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Pro-tection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited in such portions of the Rivers Dee and Mersey as are within the district of the Administrative County of Chester.

Additional Protection for the Gull and Tern.

VII. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Pro-tection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not apply, the killing or taking of the Gull and Tern is prohibited throughout the County of Chester.

Certain Districts Exempted from the Operation of Clause VII.:

VIII. I hereby exempt from the operation of Clause VII of this Order so much of the County of Chester as does not lie within the parishes of V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Gayten, Heswall-cum-Oldfield, Thurstaston, Caldy, Hoylake cum-West Kirby, Wallasey, Lower Bebington, Bromborough, Eastham Hooton, Netherpool, Whitby, Stanlow, Ince, Great Stanney, Frodsham Lordship, Weston, Runcorn, Halton, Norton, Moore, Acton Grange, Walton Inferior, including therein so much of the estuaries of the Rivers Dee and Mersey as lie within the Administrative County of Chester.

· Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

IX. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880" (as extended by Clause II of this Order), does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Chester:—

Bittern, Shoveller Duck, Goldfinch, Great Grested Grebe, Little Grebe or Dabchick, Heron, Kingfisher, Brown Linnet, Nightjar (Goat Sucker), Owl, Lesser Redpole, Siskin, Twite, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

EGGs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

X. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County of Chester:—

Bittern, Dunlin, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe or Dabchick, Black-headed Gull, Hawfinch, Heron, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Nightjar, (Goat Sucker), Owl, Oyster Catcher, Redshank, Sandpiper, Sheldrake, Shrike, Common Tern, Twite, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Eggs Protected within a Certain Area (Market-Garden Lands excepted).

XI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited within the area named in Clause V for a period of five years from the date of this Order.

Repeal of former Order.

XII. The Order of the 14th March, 1904, is hereby repealed.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Anglesey) Order, 1909.

Dated 15th March, 1909.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Anglesey, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Anglesey) Order, 1909." BIRDS.

Close Time for Certain Birds varied.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be varied throughout the County of Anglesey so far as concerns the undermentioned birds, so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of October in any year:—

Auk, Avocet, Bee-eater, Bittern, Cornish Chough, Cuckoo, Stone Curlew (Thick-knee), Dotterel, Dunlin (Ox Bird, Ploverspage, Purre or Sea Lark), Fulmar, Gannet or Solan Goose, Godwit, Grebe, Greenshank, Guillemot (Marrot, Murre, Scout or Willock) Gull or Seamew (except Black-backed Gull), Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Loon or Diver, Merganser, Nightingale, Nightjar (Night-Hawk, Goat-Sucker, Fern Owl), Oriole, Owl, Oyster Catcher, Petrel, Pharlarope, Puffin (Coulterneb or Sea Parrot), American Quail or Colin, Razorbill, Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shearwater, Sheldrake, Skua or Bonxie, Smew, Spoonbill, Stint, Stonehatch, 'Tern or Sea Swallow, Tystey, Whaup, Whimbrel, Woodpecker.

The Goldfinch protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the Goldfinch is prohibited throughout the County of Anglesey.

Eccs.

The Eggs of the Goldfinch and Lapwing protected.

IV. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the Goldfinch is prohibited throughout the County of Anglesey, and also (after 15th April in each year) the eggs of the Lapwing, Peewit or Green Ployer.

Repeal of Former Order.

V. The Order of the 2nd May, 1887, is hereby repealed.

. 7. FOREST OF BOWLAND (MOVEMENT OF SHEEP) ORDER OF 1909.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, أعديمه والحرار as follows:

Premises to which this Order applies.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to

any adjoining premises to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

(2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the said Local Authority.

(3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep from Premises to which this Order applies.

2.—(1.) Sheep shall not be moved from any premises to which this Order applies unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are when the licence is granted.

(2.) Unless the Inspector is satisfied

(a) that the sheep are intended for immediate slaughter and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the sheep should in accordance with the provisions of this Order be dipped before movement for such purpose, or

(b) that the sheep are to be moved direct to

a slaughterhouse,

a licence for movement under this Article shall be granted only for sheep which have, within twenty-eight days before the licence is granted, been thoroughly dipped twice, with an interval of not less than ten, and not more than fourteen, days between the dippings, in an efficient sheep-dip in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District; and have since the first dipping been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

3.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other

officer.

Effect of Order.

4. The restrictions on movement of sheep imposed by this Order shall be in addition to any other restrictions in force which affect such movement.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority,

Offences.
