**SHEEP-SCAB (NORTH WALES DIPPING
AREAS) ORDER OF 1909.**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Declaration of separate Sheep-Scab Compulsory
Dipping Area in Montgomeryshire.*

1.—(1.) From and after the commencement of this Order the Area described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a separate Compulsory Dipping Area for the purposes of the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1906 (herein referred to as "the principal Order"), and the Sheep-Scab (North Wales Dipping Areas) Order of 1908 and any Order amending that Order, and shall cease to form part of any other Compulsory Dipping Area.

(2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly in this Dipping Area and partly outside this Dipping Area, the whole farm or holding shall for the purposes of the said Orders and this Order be deemed to be inside this Dipping Area.

(3.) For the purposes of the said Orders this Area shall be deemed to be a Dipping Area declared by the Sheep-Scab (North Wales Dipping Areas) Order of 1908.

*Application of Part II of Sheep-Scab (Compulsory
Dipping Areas) Order of 1906.*

2.—(1.) Article 5 (*Restriction of Movement of Sheep out of Compulsory Dipping Area*) of the principal Order shall in the Area described in the First Schedule hereto be in force so long as that Area continues to be a Compulsory Dipping Area, and in that Area the rest of Part II shall in each year be in force only from the fifteenth day of April to the last day of the second prescribed dipping period (including both those days).

(2.) In the Areas described in the Second Schedule hereto Part II of the principal Order shall in each year be in force only during the prescribed dipping periods.

(3.) This Article shall be substituted for Article 4 of the Sheep-Scab (North Wales Dipping Areas) Order of 1908.

Short Title, &c.

3. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP-SCAB (NORTH WALES DIPPING AREAS) ORDER OF 1909, and shall be read with the SHEEP-SCAB (NORTH WALES DIPPING AREAS) ORDER OF 1908.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Dipping Area declared by this Order.

An Area in the administrative county of Montgomery comprising the petty sessional divisions of Machynlleth and Llanidloes Upper, and the parishes of Llanllugan, Llanerfyl, Garthbeibio, Llangadfan, and Llawddyn.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

*Compulsory Dipping Areas to which Article 2
relates.*

I. An Area comprising:—

Those parts of the administrative county of Carnarvon which lie to the east of the river Conway;

The administrative county of Denbigh (except those parts which lie to the west of the river Conway);

The administrative county of Flint, except the petty sessional division of Overton;

The administrative county of Montgomery, except such part as is comprised in the Area described in the First Schedule.

II. An Area comprising the administrative county of Anglesey.

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
