HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES.

THEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Commission dated the second day of March, one thousand nine hundred and nine, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, in His Majesty's absence from His Realm in Foreign Parts, to hold, on His Majesty's behalf, His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His approval of any matter or thing whereunto His Royal Highness should be so authorized by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, and to do further, on His Majesty's behalf, any matter or thing for the purposes of the said Commission whereunto His Royal Highness should be authorized in manner aforesaid:

And whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fourth day of March, in the year one

At the Court at St. James's, the 2nd day of thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words following, that is to say :-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Margaret and All Hallows, situate at Orford, in the new parish (sometime particular district) of Christ Church, Padgate, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Liverpool.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Margaret and All Hallows, situate at Orford as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Francis James, Bishop of the said diocese of Liverpool (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Christ Church, Padgate, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan thereuted annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Margaret and All Hallows, situate at Orford as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Margaret and All Hallows, Orford.'

"And, with the like consent of the said Francis James, Bishop of the said diocese of Liverpool (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Margaret and All Hallows, situate at Orford as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Margaret and All Hallows, Orford, being:—

"All that part of the new parish (sometime particular district) of Christ Church, Padgate, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Liverpool, which is bounded upon the north-east and upon the north by the parish of Winwick, upon the west partly by the last named parish and partly by the new parish of Saint Michael, Burton Wood, upon the south partly by the new parish of Saint Ann, Warrington, and partly by the parish of Warrington, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Warrington from the said new parish of Christ Church, Padgate, at the centre of the bridge which carries the northern line of the Cheshire Lines Railway across Padgate Brook, and extending thence first north-westward, then northeastward, and then northward along the middle of Padgate Brook (thereby following the Parliamentary boundary of the borough of Warrington) for a distance of sixty-seven chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church, Padgate, from the said parish of Winwick.'

And whereas the said representation has been approved at the Council held under the authority of the said Commission: Now, therefore, His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, being authorized thereto by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, doth hereby, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on behalf of His Majesty, ratify the said representation, and order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Royal Highness doth further, on behalf of His Majesty, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Liverpool.

Whereas the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city of Manchester, acting by the Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Local Authority"), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the urban sanitary district of Manchester (hereinafter referred to as "the district"), have, in pursuance I Town Hall, Louth.

of section 3 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1907"), applied to us, the Local Government Board, to declare Part V of the Act of 1907 to be in force in the district;

And whereas proof has been given to our satisfaction of the advertisement required by sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Act of 1907. and at least one month has elapsed after the

date of that advertisement:

Now therefore, in the exercise of our powers in that behalf, we by this Order declare, specify, and direct as follows, that is to say:

Article I.—(1) On and after the day on which this Order comes into operation, Part V of the Act of 1907 shall be in force in the district.

(2) Section 75 of the Act of 1907 shall be in force in the district, subject to the following conditions and adaptations; namely:

The said section in its application to the district and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the Local Authority under that section, shall have effect as if the following sub-section were added to and formed part of the section; that is to say,

"(3) The date of the Order of the Local Government Board by which this Part is declared to be in force shall be the beginning of the period within which the Local Authority shall give notice for the purpose

of sub-section (1) of this section."

Article II.—Within the period of three weeks immediately following the date of this Order, or, where in our opinion the circumstances so require, within such later period as we by Order prescribe, the Local Authority shall cause this Order to be published, by advertising the same once at least in one or more of the newspapers circulating in the district, and shall also cause a statement of the effect of this Order to be published in the London Gazette.

Article III.—This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of May, one

thousand nine hundred and nine.
