No applications can be received from gentlemen wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

# ATTENDANCES AND PRESENTATIONS.

All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, of whatever rank, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty. All Civil Officers of the Admiralty will follow the same rule.

Deputy Lieutenants of Counties and all Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Army Special Reserve, Militia, Territorial Force, Yeomanry, or Volunteers, of whatever rank, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall; but Officers of the Household Cavalry or the Brigade of Guards should communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace.

In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the navigation of the River Mersey (V and VI Vic., cap. 110), we, the Mersey Chemical Works Limited, of Bromborough, Cheshire, hereby give you notice that we propose to construct a tank to receive the sewage from the three workmen's dwellings, workmen's latrines and W.C's. generally; such tank to be fitted with a valve for the discharge of the sewage during the first three hours of the ebb tide, the discharge being made through the 20" pipe laid across the foreshore—permission for which was granted on the 14th January, 1909—the position of the line of sewers and tank being shown upon the ordnance map deposited together with this notice.

The valve regulating the discharge will be fitted on a cast iron plate, with indicator showing the state of the valve whether open or closed, this indicator being visible at all times.

It is proposed to commence this work immediately after permission has been granted.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 8TH MAY 1909.)

THE AMERICAN GOOSEBERRY MILDEW ORDER OF 1909.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in Acts, 1877 and 1907, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of the Order.

1. This Order shall apply to Great Britain.

# Definitions.

2. In this Order-

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

The Local Authority" means as regards any District the Local Authority for the District under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

"Disease" means the disease affecting goose-berry and currant bushes which is known as Sphaerotheca mors-uvae or American Gooseberry Mildew; and "diseased" means

affected with disease:
"Garden" includes a plantation or field and a

part of a garden, plantation or field:
"Bush" means a gooseberry bush or currant bush and includes a cutting, stock or seedling, and any part of a bush except the

" Landing " includes introduction through the post:

"Article" means Article of this Order.

# Notification of Disease.

3. The occupier of any premises on which there is a bush which is, or appears to be, diseased shall forthwith notify the fact by post or otherwise to the Board, or to the clerk to the Local Authority, or to an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority, and where practicable a specimen showing the disease shall accompany the notice.

Precautions to be Adopted in case of an Outbreak of Disease or Supposed Outbreak.

- 4.—(1.) The occupier of any garden in which disease exists or appears to exist shall as soon as is practicable spray all the diseased or suspected bushes, and all gooseberry and currant bushes in the garden to which the disease is likely to spread or to have already spread, with a solution of liver of sulphur (containing not less than one pound of liver of sulphur to thirty-two gallons of water); provided that this provision shall not apply to bushes which have shed their leaves.
- (2.) No bush shall be moved from the garden until after the investigation required by the next Article.
- (3.) All diseased fruit and all clippings from diseased or suspected bushes shall be forthwith destroyed on the said garden by burning or other effective method by the occupier of the garden.

### Investigation by Local Authority.

- 5.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving in any manner notice of the existence or apparent existence of disease shall forthwith take such steps as may be necessary to determine in what gardens the disease exists, and shall cause notice of such determination to be served on the occupier of each of such gardens which shall thereupon become "infected premises" and continue to be infected premises until the notice is altered or withdrawn in accordance with Article 10.
- (2.) The notice shall as far as practicable include in the infected premises only those parts of the garden in which there are or them under the Destructive Insects and Pests recently have been diseased bushes.

# Action to be taken by Local Authority after Preliminary Investigation.

- 6.—(1.) The Local Authority may at any time and from time to time by a notice served on an occupier of infected premises require him to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the disease as are authorised by this Article and specified in the notice.
- (2.) A notice under this Article may require the occupier of the premises as regards all or any of the bushes on the premises to adopt any one or more of the following measures:—

(a) to destroy on the infected premises the fruit (if any) on each diseased bush;

(b) to prune the bushes in such manner as may be directed by an Inspector of the Local Authority and to his satisfaction;

(c) at such time or times as may be specified, to spray the bushes thoroughly with a solution of liver of sulphur (containing not less than one pound of liver of sulphur to thirtytwo gallous of water), or with Bordeaux mixture, or with a solution of sulphate of copper, as may be directed by the notice.

(d) to spray in like manner the ground beneath each diseased bush and the site of each bush which has been destroyed on

account of disease.

Provided that nothing in this Order shall prevent the destruction by the owner thereof, by fire or other effective method, of any bush if such destruction takes place on the infected

premises.

- (3.) Where a Local Authority have consented to pay compensation for the destruction of bushes directed by notice served by them, the Local Authority may by a notice under this Article require the occupier of infected premises to destroy by burning or other effective method all or any of the bushes on the premises, and the Local Authority shall pay compensation for such destruction subject and according to the provisions in that behalf of the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907.
- (4.) All clippings arising from any pruning under this Article shall be forthwith destroyed on the infected premises by the occupier by burning or other effective method.
- (5.) A notice under this Article may prescribe the time within which the adoption of any measure thereby prescribed shall be completed.

# Power to Require Adoption of Precautions on Premises in Vicinity of Infected Premises.

7. The Local Authority may by a notice served on the occupier of any garden in which there are bushes to which the disease is likely to spread from infected premises in the vicinity, require such occupier, on or before such date as therein specified, to spray thoroughly all the bushes on such garden with a solution of liver of sulphur (containing not less than one pound of liver of sulphur to thirty-two gallons of water).

# Frecautions against Spread of Disease by Fruit Picking.

8. Where the Local Authority are satisfied that the extent of the disease in any garden is such that the picking of any gooseberry, current, or other fruit crop in the garden would be likely to spread the disease to other premises, the Local Authority may by a notice served on the occupier of the garden prohibit the picking of fruit except upon such conditions as they think necessary for the prevention of the spread of disease.

Precautions against Spread of Disease by Bushes.
9.—(1.) No bush shall be removed from tinfected premises except with, and subject to the

conditions (if any) inserted in, a licence granted by the Board, or an officer of the Board.

(2.) An Inspector of the Local Authority may within the district of the Local Authority, and an Inspector of the Board may elsewhere in Great Britain, by a notice served on the owner or person in charge of any diseased bushes which are being moved or exposed for sale or of any bushes which have been moved in contravention of this Order, or on any person to whom any such bushes have been consigned for sale, prohibit the sale or exposure for sale of such bushes, and require the same either to be destroyed or returned to the premises from which they have been moved in contravention of this Order.

# Withdrawal of Notices of Infected Premises.

10. A notice constituting any premises infected premises may be altered or withdrawn by a notice signed by an officer of the Board. Unless there are special circumstances, a notice shall not be issued as regards any premises until the expiration of the year following that in which the disease has last been seen on the premises, unless the premises are before that date cleared of bushes.

Copies of Notices and Returns of Proceedings to be sent to the Board.

11.—(1.) A copy of every notice served under this Order shall be sent to the Board by the Inspector by whom the notice is signed.

(2.) The Local Authority shall, in a form to be provided by the Board, notify the Board of

any outbreak of disease.

# Powers of Entry.

12. Any Inspector or other officer appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority, may upon production if so required of his appointment or authority enter any premises on which he has reason to believe that disease exists or has recently existed or that there are any bushes landed in contravention of this Order and examine any bush on such premises.

# Prohibition of Importation of Bushes.

13.—(1.) The landing in Great Britain of any bush brought from any place out of Great Britain (except the Channel Islands) is prohibited except as hereinafter provided.

(2.) This Article shall not apply to the landing of any current bush under the authority of a licence authorising such landing previously obtained from the Board of Agriculture and

Fisheries.

# Notification of Order.

14. This Order shall be published by the Local Authority in accordance with any direction given by the Board.

# Powers of the Board and their Inspectors.

15. The powers conferred by this Order on a Local Authority or an Inspector of a Local Authority may be exercised by the Board or an Inspector of the Board respectively and any notice served by a Local Authority or an Inspector of a Local Authority may be altered or revoked by a notice under this Order served by the Board or an Inspector of the Board.

### Offences.

- 16. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who—
  - (1.) knowingly fails to give notification of disease as required by Article 3; or

- (2.) fails to prune or spray in manner prescribed by this Order or by any notice served on him under this Order any bush or other thing required under the Order or notice to be pruned or sprayed by him; or
- (3.) moves any bush in contravention of this Order; or
- (4.) fails to comply with the conditions inserted in a licence granted under this Order; or
- (5.) fails duly to destroy any fruit or clippings required under this Order to be destroyed by him; or
- (6.) fails to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the disease as are specified in a notice served on him under Article 6; or
- (7.) picks or permits to be picked any crop or part of a crop in contravention of a notice served on him under Article 8, or fails to comply with the conditions of any such notice; or
- (8.) sells or exposes for sale any bushes in contravention of a notice served on him under Article 9, or fails either to destroy or return any bushes as required by any such notice; or
- (9.) without the written consent of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, in Great Britain sells, or exposes for sale, or plants any bush which has been landed in contravention of this Order, knowing the same to have been so landed.
- (10.) wilfully obstructs or impedes any Inspector or other officer in the course of his duties under this Order.

# Execution of the Order.

- 17.—(1.) Each Local Authority shall carry into effect this Order within their District, and shall appoint such Inspectors or other officers for that purpose as may be necessary.
- (2.) For the purposes of this Order a notice shall be deemed to be served on a person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his ast known place of abode or business or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there, and a notice or other document purporting

to be signed by the clerk of a Local Authority or an Inspector of the Board shall be prima facie evidence that it was signed by him and duly authorised by the Local Authority or the Board.

### Revocation of Orders.

18.—(1.) The Orders described in the Schedule hereto are hereby revoked; provided that such revocation shall not as regards any such Order—

- (i.) affect the previous operation of the Order or anything duly done or suffered under the Order; or
- (ii.) affect any right, privilege, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under the Order; or
- (iii.) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any offence committed against the Order;
- (iv.) affect any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if this Order had not been made.

- (2.) Every notice served, or licence granted, under any Order hereby revoked shall have effect as if it were a notice or licence under this Order.
- (3.) The Destructive Insects and Pests Order of 1908 shall cease to apply to American Gooseberry Mildew.

### Commencement.

19. This Order shall come into operation on the twentieth day of May, nineteen hundred and nine.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

AYRSHIRE (CARRICK DISTRICT) (MOVE-MENT OF SHEEP) ORDER OF 1909.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

# Application of Order.

1. This Order shall apply to the areas described in the Schedule hereto, each of which is hereinafter referred to as "a Scheduled Area."

Restriction of Movement of Sheep out of Scheduled Areas.

- 2.—(1.) Sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be moved out of a Scheduled Area between the fifteenth day of May and the thirteenth day of November in any year during which this Order is in operation, unless—
  - (i.) they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are when the licence is granted; or
  - (ii.) they are moved direct to a slaughterhouse having previous to such movement been marked by the painting or stamping with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each sheep, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(2.) A licence for movement under this Article shall be granted only

(i.) upon production to the Inspector granting the licence of

(a) a certificate, in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1906 or to the like effect, showing that the sheep to be moved have been thoroughly dipped in an efficient sheep-dip in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District within twenty-eight days of the date on which the application for a licence is made; and

(b) a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1906 or to the like effect, to the effect that the sheep to be moved are sheep referred to in the certificate and that since the dipping the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped; or

(ii.) upon production to the Inspector of

(a) a certificate by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to the effect that he has within ten days before the application for a licence is made examined each of the sheep to be moved, and found it to be free from sheep-scab; and

(b) a declaration signed by the owner of or sent by the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing the same of this purpose, to the effect that since the sheep such examination the sheep have been kept is movement.

separate from other sheep, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground, saleyard or exhibition.

A licence under paragraph (ii.) shall only be granted where, in the opinion of the Inspector granting it, compliance with paragraph (i.) is impracticable or inexpedient.

(3.) A declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting a licence thereon. A certificate shall also be so retained unless it refers to more sheep than are proposed to be moved, in which case a note shall be made thereon and initialled by the Inspector who grants the licence, stating the number of sheep for which the licence is granted.

(4.) The licence shall be in force for six days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the Form C set forth in the First Schedule to the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1906 or to the like effect.

(5.) A copy of a licence under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the licence.

(6.) Sheep moved under this Article to a slaughter-house shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

# Movement of Lambs out of Scheduled Areas.

3. Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any lambs in a Scheduled Area are intended for immediate slaughter and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before movement for such purpose, or that the lambs are to be moved direct to a slaughterhouse, he may, subject to any directions by the Local Authority appointing him, by licence authorise the movement of the lambs to any premises outside the Area subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence, and thereupon the lambs may be moved in accordance with such licence and conditions. Provided that an Inspector of a Local Authority shall not issue any such licence for movement to premises in the District of another Local Authority unless the consent of such Local Authority, either generally or in the particular instance, has been previously obtained. Article does not apply to lambs more than nine months old.

# Provisions as to farms on borders of Scheduled Areas.

4. Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly without a Scheduled Area the provisions of this Order shall apply to the farm or holding and the sheep thereon as if the whole farm or holding were in the Area.

### Certificates of Dipping.

5. Where sheep are dipped in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, he shall give the owner or person in charge of the sheep a certificate in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1906 or to the like effect.

# Licences after Completion of Movement.

6. Where sheep are moved with a licence under this Order, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing the said movement.

# General Provisions as to Movement.

7. Sheep, while being moved under this Order, shall as far as practicable be kept separate from all other sheep, and, if moved with a licence, shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

### Provision for Movement through Scheduled Areas.

8. For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of a Scheduled Area in any case where they are moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the sheep being untrucked within such Area.

## Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 9.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of . a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

# Local Authority to enforce Order.

10. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

### Offences.

- 11.—(1.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted or stamped on any sheep, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the sheep, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If any person fails to deliver up or send licence as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

# · HULL AND BARNSLEY RAILWAY BILL (ADDITIONAL PROVISION).

(Transfer of Powers, &c., relating to new Railways proposed to be authorised by the Bill, and to a Part of Railway No. 2 authorised by Hull and Barnsley and West Riding Junction Railway and Dock (South Yorkshire Extension Lines) Act, 1902, to Hull and Barnsley and Great Central Railway Companies, jointly; Appointment and Powers of Joint Committee; Provisions as to Apportionment of Expenditure by the two Companies; Tolls, &c.; Česser of Certain Powers conferred on the two Companies, jointly, by Hull and Barnsley and Great Central Railway Companies Act, 1906, and Repeal of Portions of that Act; Application of Funds, by Hull and Barnsley and Great Central Companies; Amendment of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament by or on behalf of the Hull and Barnsley Railway Company (in this Notice called "the Company") for leave to amend the above-named Bill now pending in Parliament (in this Notice referred to as "the intended Act" or "the Bill") and to make additional provision therein for effecting the purposes or some of the purposes following (that is to say):—

1. To provide for the transfer to and vesting in the Company and the Great Central Company (in this Notice referred to as "the two Companies") or to and in the Joint Committee of the two Companies hereinafter mentioned upon such terms and conditions as may have been or may be agreed upon between the two Companies or as may be specified in or prescribed by the additional provision of all or any of the property, works, rights, powers, privileges, interests, agreements, and benefit of agreements, obligations, and liabilities of or vested in or attaching

- (a) The railways proposed to be authorized by and described in the Bill (which railways are in this Notice called "the new railways"), and
- (b) So much of Railway No. 2 authorized by the Hull, Barnsley, and West Riding Junction Railway and Dock (South Yorkshire Extension Lines) Act, 1902 (in this Notice called "the Act of 1902"), as will lie between the junctions therewith of Railway No. 3 proposed to be authorized by the Bill and Railway No. 3 authorized by the Rotherham, Maltby, and Laughton Railway Act, 1905 (which portion of railway is in this Notice called "the unabandoned line"),

and to enable the two Companies, or either of them, or the Joint Committee hereinafter mentioned, to exercise all or some of the powers, rights, and privileges of the Company, or which may be conferred on the Company by the intended Act in connection with the new railways and the unabandoned line (which are in this Notice referred to collectively as "the transferred line"), including the power of taking lands, easements, and other property, and all other rights and powers of the Company in connection with the transferred line.

- 2. To provide for the exercise of the powers proposed to be conferred upon the two Companies or upon the Joint Committee hereinbefore mentioned, either by the Great Central and Hull and Barnsley Railways Joint Committee, in-corporated by the Hull and Barnsley and Great Central Railways Act, 1906, or by a new Joint Committee, and if by a new Joint Committee, to provide for the constitution or appointment of a Joint Committee, to consist of persons representing the Company and the Great Central Company respectively, and to prescribe or regulate the nomination, appointment, election, retirement, rotation, removal and remuneration of members of the Joint Committee, and to define the powers, duties, and privileges of the Joint Committee or the members, or any of the members thereof, or any sub-committee or sub-committees thereof, and to incorporate the Joint Committee, and to provide for the appointment of a standing arbitrator if found desirable.
- 3. To provide for the exercise of the powers of the Joint Committee in certain events to be prescribed by the additional provision by the representatives on that Committee of one only of the two Companies.
- 4. To provide for the construction, management, working, maintenance and use of the joint undertaking by the two Companies or the Joint Committee.
- 5. To provide for the contribution and payment to the Joint Committee by the Company and the Great Central Company respectively in such proportions as have been or may be agreed or as may be prescribed by the additional provision of the moneys required for or in connection with the exercise of all or any powers to be conferred upon or vested in the Joint Committee, and for regulating the expenditure of such moneys and the keeping and verifying of accounts by the Joint Committee, and all incidental matters.
- 6. To enable the two Companies and the Joint Committee, or either of them, and the Great

Central Company and the Company respectively as the case may be, to demand, take and recover tolls, rates and duties upon or in respect of the transferred line, or any part or parts thereof, and works connected therewith respectively, and to alter the tolls, rates and duties now authorized to be taken thereon or in respect thereof, and to confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from the payment of any such tolls, rates and duties.

- 7. To provide that the rights and powers conferred by the Hull and Barnsley and Great Central Railway Companies Act, 1906 (hereinafter called "the Act of 1906"), on the Great Central Company and on the Company and the Great Central Company jointly, and on the Great Central Company and the Hull and Barnsley Railways Joint Committee, incorporated by that Act or any Act or Acts amending the same, with respect to or in connection with the unabandoned line, shall cease and to repeal such portions of the Act of 1906 as relate thereto.
- 8. To sanction, confirm, and give effect to any agreements or arrangements which may have been or may be entered into in reference to any of the matters aforesaid.
- 9. To authorize the Company, and the Great Central Company respectively, for the purposes of exercising the powers proposed to be trans-

ferred to or conferred upon them, either jointly or solely, by the additional provision or other the purposes thereof, to apply any capital which they may have power to raise or borrow under any previous Act or Acts.

10. To repeal or amend the provisions or some of the provisions of the local and personal Acts following (that is to say):

43 and 44 Vic. cap. 199, and any other Act or Acts relating to the Company or their undertaking, and

12 and 13 Vic., cap. 81, and any other Act or Acts relating to the Great Central Company or their undertaking.

11. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would in any way interfere with the purposes of the Bill or of the additional provision, and to confer other rights and privileges.
