**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-fifth day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned that is to say the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called ‘the said benefice’) of Saint Mary,

Hawkshaw Lane, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

“Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hawkshaw Lane, is vested in the Right Reverend Edmund Arbutnott, Bishop of Manchester, in right of his See.

“And whereas Frederick Whowell, of Croich Hey, Tottington, in the county of Lancaster, Bleacher, has provided a benefaction of five hundred pounds in favour of the benefice of Saint Mary, Hawkshaw Lane, upon the understanding and condition that the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hawkshaw Lane, shall be transferred to him and his heirs and assigns as is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas the said Edmund Arbutnott, Bishop of Manchester, is willing in consideration of the benefaction aforesaid, that the proposed transfer of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hawkshaw Lane, now vested in him as aforesaid, as such Bishop, should be made to the same Frederick Whowell and his heirs and assigns and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Edmund Arbutnott, Bishop of Manchester, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

“And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, is consenting to the transfer of patronage hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, and in token of his consent thereto (which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is in this

case made necessary) he, the said Archbishop, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

“And whereas in the circumstances thus set forth it appears to us that the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hawkshaw Lane, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the new parish of Saint Mary, Hawkshaw Lane.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said Edmund Arbutnott, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his archiepiscopal seal), and with the consent of the said Frederick Whowell (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Mary, Hawkshaw Lane, now vested in him, the said Edmund Arbutnott, Bishop of Manchester, as such Bishop, shall be transferred from him, the said Bishop, and from his successors in the same Bishoprick, to the said Frederick Whowell, his heirs and assigns, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Frederick Whowell and his heirs and assigns for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts: and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called ‘the said benefice’) of Llandyfodwg, in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Llandaff.

“Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Llandyfodwg is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrance in certain trustees upon trust in the first place for John Picton Turbervill, of Ewenny Priory, Ewenny, Bridgend, in the county of Glamorgan, a retired Colonel, late of the Madras Staff Corps of Your Majesty's Army, during his life with remainder to his eldest son, Charles Grenville Turbervill, of Bradestone House, Brundall, in the county of Norfolk, Esquire, in tail male, and the said John Picton Turbervill is therefore the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant.

“And whereas the said John Picton Turbervill and Charles Grenville Turbervill are desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Llandyfodwg should be transferred to the Bishop of Llandaff and his successors.

“And whereas the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard, now Bishop of Llandaff, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

“And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Llandyfodwg which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will render the same benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Llandyfodwg.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said John Picton Turbervill being the person whose consent as patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the first and second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and six (in testimony of which consent he has signed

and sealed this scheme), with the consent of the said Charles Grenville Turbervill (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), and with the consent of the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage and presentation to the said benefice of Llandyfodwg shall be transferred to the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff, and his successors in the same Bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff, and by his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts: and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Llandaff.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eighteenth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the parish of Loughborough, in the county of Leicester and in the diocese of Peterborough.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said parish of Loughborough is a cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of Loughborough which is hereinafter mentioned and described

should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purpose of Divine worship.

"And whereas by a certain Indenture bearing date on or about the eighteenth day of March in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts 1843, 1844, and 1856' or some or one of them between the Reverend Thomas Pitts, Rector or Incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Loughborough and Honorary Canon of Peterborough Cathedral, of the first part, the Master, Fellows and Scholars of Emmanuel College, Cambridge, the Patrons of the said rectory of the parish of Loughborough, of the second part, the Right Reverend Edward Carr Glyn, Bishop of Peterborough, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners of the fourth part (which Indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said Thomas Pitts did, with the consent of the said Master, Fellows and Scholars of Emmanuel College, Cambridge, as such Patrons as aforesaid, and also with the consent of the said Edward Carr Glyn, Bishop of Peterborough, grant and confirm unto the Minister (so soon as a Minister shall have been licensed) of the district hereinafter recommended, to be constituted and to his successors Ministers or Incumbents thereof for the time being one perpetual clear yearly rentcharge or net annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds to be payable quarterly on the usual quarter days in every year free from and clear of all deductions, taxes, charges, rates, assessments and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any), and to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon all those the sums of one thousand and forty-one pounds seventeen shillings and sevenpence Metropolitan Consolidated Three per Centum Stock, eight hundred and seventy-three pounds nine shillings and sixpence Bank of England Stock, one thousand one hundred and eighty-one pounds sixteen shillings and threepence Bank of Ireland Stock, one thousand and eighty pounds Deferred Annuity Capital Class D in the East India Railway Company and an Annuity Class B of one hundred and twenty-three pounds in the Scinde, Punjab and Delhi Railway Company standing in the name of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the credit of the rectory of Loughborough, and upon the investments for the time being representing the same the first payment of the said yearly rentcharge or net annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds to be paid on the quarter day next after the said Minister shall have been licensed and to be a proportion thereof calculated up to such quarter day.

"And whereas the said yearly rentcharge or net annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds has been granted as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the said Thomas Pitts has nominated the said Edward Carr Glyn, Bishop of Peterborough, as the person to whom and to whose successors he desires that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district shall be assigned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Edward Carr Glyn, Bishop of Peterborough (in

testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Loughborough which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Peter, Loughborough.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish then of such new parish and of the nomination of an Incumbent thereto, shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edward Carr Glyn, Bishop of Peterborough, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The district of Saint Peter, Loughborough, being:—

All that part of the parish of Loughborough, in the county of Leicester and in the diocese of Peterborough, which is bounded upon the south by the parish of Emmanuel, Loughborough, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the north-west, upon the north-east, and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Emmanuel, Loughborough, from the said parish of Loughborough at the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries Ashby-road across Burleigh Brook, and extending thence generally northward along the middle of the said brook for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries Thorpe-lane across such brook, and extending thence westward along the middle of Thorpe-lane for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Charnwood Forest Branch Line of the London and North-Western Railway across such lane and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of sixty chains or thereabouts to its terminus, and continuing thence north-eastward in the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Derby-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Derby-road for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with Broad-street, and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the middle of Broad-street for a distance of twelve chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Ashby-road upon the boundary which divides the said

parish of Loughborough from the said parish of Emmanuel, Loughborough."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the parish of Loughborough out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Peterborough.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fourth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Luke, New Brompton, situate within the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Mark, New Brompton, in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, and of the parish of Gillingham, in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parish and parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, and of the said parish of Gillingham, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same

should be assigned to the said church of Saint Luke, New Brompton, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, as such Bishop, with the consent of the Reverend William Henry Robins, Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Gillingham, and as such Vicar or Incumbent the Patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, and with the consents of Charles Leopold Samson, of number 23, Lancaster-gate, London, W., Solicitor, and of John Brownlee Lonsdale, of number 13, Princes-gate, London, S.W., a Member of the Commons' House of Parliament, as the Patrons of the said vicarage of the parish of Gillingham (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, and of the said parish of Gillingham, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Luke, New Brompton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, New Brompton.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The consolidated chapelry of Saint Luke, New Brompton, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the new parish (some-time district) of Saint Mark, New Brompton, in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Rochester, which is bounded upon the west partly by the new parish of Brompton, partly by the parish of Chatham, and partly by the new parish of Saint Philip and Saint James, Upnor, upon the north and upon the north-east by the parish of Hoo, upon the east by the parish of Gillingham, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Gillingham from the said new parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, at the junction of Burnt Oak-terrace with Saunders-street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Saunders-street and along the middle of Church-road for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the junction of Church-road with Fox-terrace, and extending thence westward along the middle of Fox-terrace for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Mill-road, and extending thence in a straight line due west (thereby crossing Black Lion Field) for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, from the said new parish of Brompton.

"II. And also all that portion of the said parish of Gillingham which is bounded upon the north-east by the said parish of Hoo, upon the west and upon the south-west by the said new parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east and upon the east, by an imaginary

line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark, New Brompton, from the said parish of Gillingham, at the junction of Saunders-street with Victoria-street, and extending thence northward along the middle of Victoria-street for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Burnt Oak-terrace, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Burnt Oak-terrace for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Garfield-road and the roadway leading to Gillingham Church, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway or footpath leading to Corporation-road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of such roadway or footpath for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Corporation-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Corporation-road for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Pier-road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Pier-road for a distance of twelve yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the White House Public House, and extending thence northward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets White House Wharf, and continuing thence northward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line to a point in the middle of the River Medway upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Gillingham from the said parish of Hoo."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eighteenth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of

the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Emmanuel, New Brighton, situate in the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint James, New Brighton, in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Emmanuel, New Brighton, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Francis James, Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Saint James, New Brighton, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Emmanuel, New Brighton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Emmanuel, New Brighton.'

"And with the like consent of the said Francis James, Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Emmanuel, New Brighton, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Emmanuel, New Brighton, being:—

"All that part of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint James, New Brighton, in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester, which is bounded upon the north-east by the middle of the River Mersey, upon the south-east by the new parish of Saint Mary, Liscard, upon the south-west and upon part of the west by the parish of Wallasey, both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the west and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Wallasey from the said new parish of Saint James, New Brighton, at the point in the middle of Mount Pleasant-road where it is joined by the footpath leading from Earliston-road, and extending thence

north-eastward along the middle of Mount Pleasant-road for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Wentworth-avenue, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Wentworth-avenue for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to the wall or fence at its northern end, and extending thence north-eastward along the said wall or fence for a distance of eight yards or thereabouts to the centre of the passage leading from Wentworth-avenue to Grafton-road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said passage for a distance of eleven yards or thereabouts to the point where such passage meets the southern end of Grafton-road, and extending thence first north-eastward to and then north-westward along the middle of Grafton-road for a distance of three chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with Field-road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Field-road for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Rowson-street, and extending thence first northward, then north-eastward, and then again northward along the middle of Rowson-street for a distance of nine chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Molyneux-drive, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Molyneux-drive for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Green-avenue at the entrance to the Tower Grounds, and continuing thence north-eastward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line (thereby passing through the Tower Grounds) for a distance of sixty-five chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Mersey upon the boundary of the said new parish of Saint James, New Brighton."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chester.

The following Statute made by the University of Oxford has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Whereas the University of Oxford Commissioners under and by virtue of all and every the powers in that behalf enabling them contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, did by an Instrument under their seal dated the ninth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one make a Statute for the University of Oxford concerning the Nomination of Examiners.

And whereas the said Statute was approved by Her late Majesty in Council on the eighteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

And whereas clause 2 of the said Statute was in the words following that is to say:—

"2. Every nomination shall be made by a Committee of not fewer than six persons of whom three shall be the Vice-Chancellor and Proctors for the time being and three others shall be elected by one or more of the Boards of Faculties within the University."

And whereas the said Statute forms § 2 of Sectio 1 E of Titulus VI of the Statutes of the University and the said clause 2 thereof is referred to in the amending Statute hereinafter mentioned as Statt Tit VI Sect 1 E § 2 cl 2.

And whereas the Chancellor Masters and Scholars of the University of Oxford on the eleventh day of May one thousand nine hundred and nine have made the following amending Statute that is to say:—

Whereas it is expedient that the elected members of the Committees for the nomination of Examiners in the Honour Schools of English Language and Literature and of Modern Languages should be chosen by the Boards of Studies to which the supervision of the Examination in those Schools respectively is entrusted The University enacts as follows:

1. In Statt Tit VI Sect 1 E § 2 cl 2 (p 176 ed 1908) after the words "Boards of Faculties" the words "or Boards of Studies" shall be inserted and at the end of the clause the words "as is hereinafter provided in § 3" shall be added.

2. Ibid § 3 (l) (p 178) the words "two by the Board of the Faculty of Arts (Literae Humaniores) and one by the Board of the Faculty of Arts (Modern History)" shall be struck out and the words "by the Board of Studies for the examination in the Final Honour School of English Language and Literature" shall be substituted.

3. Ibid § 3 (m) the words "two by the Board of the Faculty of Arts (Literae Humaniores) and one by the Board of the Faculty of Arts (Modern History)" shall be struck out and the words "by the Board of Studies for the Final Honour School of Modern Languages" shall be substituted.

Now we the said Chancellor Masters and Scholars in pursuance of the provisions of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do hereby submit the aforesaid amending Statute to the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council and humbly pray that the same may be approved and confirmed.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulations under Section 9 (1):—

#### COUNTY OF BUCKINGHAM.

##### URBAN DISTRICT OF ETON.

To the County Council of Buckingham;—  
And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas We have received and duly considered an application from the County Council of Buckingham for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising parts of certain roads situate within the urban district of Eton, in the county of Buckingham:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the urban district of Eton which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nine.

##### SCHEDULE.

High-street, extending from the boundary of the urban district at Windsor Bridge to the Timbralls; and

So much of Keate's-lane as extends from its junction with High-street to its junction with

Eton Wick-road, and so much of Eton Wick-road as extends from its junction with Keate's-lane to the boundary of the urban district at Folly Bridge.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: (Altering General Accounts Order): Appointment of Stocktaker:—

#### STOKE-UPON-TRENT UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Stoke-upon-Trent Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, which are in force in the Stoke-upon-Trent Union, it is required that in relation to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, the Accounts, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of those Accounts certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness of the said Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse, and at any House (whatever be its designation or description) which belongs to the Guardians, in which any poor person is lodged and maintained, and to which the Orders hereinbefore mentioned apply, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, in the exercise of Our powers in that behalf, We do hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Stoke-upon-Trent Union, as and when they shall think fit to do so, may appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth, and may revoke that appointment. Any appointment of a Stocktaker by the Guardians shall be notified to Us forthwith.

ARTICLE II.—Every appointment of a Stocktaker shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being as to the appointment of Officers by the said Guardians, and a person appointed to the Office of Stocktaker shall receive such remuneration as may from time to time be assigned to him by the said Guardians.

ARTICLE III.—No person, except with Our consent, shall be appointed to the office of Stocktaker while holding any other office under the Guardians.

ARTICLE IV.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse, and at any House such as is hereinbefore described, and compare the said stores with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account," or in such additional Accounts as may be kept under the directions of the Guardians.

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse, and at any House such as is hereinbefore described, and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account," and shall compare the various articles enumerated in the Inventory Books of the before-mentioned establishments, and see that the said articles are distributed in accordance with the entries therein.

ARTICLE V.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article IV, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the balanced Accounts in the following form:—

"Submitted to me this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 19\_\_\_\_, and found to be correct as regards the quantities of stock remaining in store.

"Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such alteration in the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VI.—The Master of the Workhouse, and the Master, Steward or Superintendent of any such House as aforesaid, shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article IV, submit to him the stores and accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VII.—The Master of the Workhouse, and the Master, Steward or Superintendent of any such House as aforesaid, shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by any General Order or by any other Order applicable to the Stoke-upon-Trent Union.

1907, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, the Public Health Act, 1896, and the Public Health Act, 1904, and every other power enabling Us in that behalf, made certain regulations (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), with respect to Cholera, Yellow Fever, and Plague;

And whereas by Article VI of the Regulations it is provided that every Port Sanitary Authority and every other Sanitary Authority within whose district persons are likely to be landed from any ship coming from a foreign port shall, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the port, fix some place where the Master of any ship certified under the Regulations to be an infected ship or a suspected ship within the meaning of the Regulations shall, as required by Article X of the Regulations, moor or anchor the ship; and it is further provided by Article VI that the place to be fixed as aforesaid shall be some place within the jurisdiction or district of the Sanitary Authority, unless We otherwise consent; in which case the place so fixed shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to be within that jurisdiction or district;

And whereas the Council of the Borough of Aldeburgh being a Sanitary Authority within the meaning of the Regulations, and hereinafter referred to as "the Sanitary Authority," propose, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the Port of Ipswich, to fix the place hereinafter referred to, and indicated by a circle drawn in red on the map or chart in the Schedule to this Order, as the place where any ship certified as aforesaid may be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article X of the Regulations, and such place being situate without their jurisdiction or district, have made application to Us for Our consent in the matter:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by the said Acts and by the Regulations, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, We do hereby Declare, Order, and Direct as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—We consent to the Sanitary Authority fixing, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the Customs Port of Ipswich, the waters included within the circle drawn in red on the Map or Chart in the Schedule to this Order as the place where any ship, bound to any place within the District of the Sanitary Authority, and certified as aforesaid, shall be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article X of the Regulations.

ARTICLE II.—The jurisdiction of the Sanitary Authority shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to extend, and the Regulations shall apply, to any ship certified as aforesaid which, in pursuance of the Regulations or of any directions given thereunder, shall be moored at the place so fixed as a Mooring Station as hereinbefore mentioned, and to any such ship so certified which shall be on its way thither for the purpose of being so moored.

IMPORTATION OF CANINE ANIMALS ORDER OF  
1909.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Application of Order.*

1.—(1.) This Order applies only to wolves, jackals, foxes, wild dogs and other animals of the canine tribe (except the domestic dog), and such animals are herein referred to as "canine animals."

(2.) The restrictions on the importation of domestic dogs are not affected by this Order.

*Restriction on Importation of Canine Animals.*

2.—(1.) An imported canine animal, that is to say, a canine animal which is brought to Great Britain from any other country, except Ireland the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, shall not be landed in Great Britain unless its landing is authorised by a licence of the Board previously obtained,

and when landed it shall be detained or otherwise dealt with in accordance with such conditions as may be inserted in any licence authorising its landing.

(2.) If a canine animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If the conditions or provisions of a licence are not complied with, the owner of the animal to which it relates, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Withdrawal of licences in certain cases.*

3.—(1.) In any case in which the Board think it necessary to do so for the purposes of this Order, the Board, or an Inspector of the Board, may give notice to the owner or person in charge of an imported canine animal requiring either that it shall be moved to a vessel for exportation, or that it shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and in either case specifying the time within which the movement is to be carried out.

(2.) A notice under this Article may in accordance with instructions issued by the Board, be given by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(3.) If the owner or person in charge of the animal, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the animal as required by the notice, or otherwise fails to comply with the provisions of the notice, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Proceedings under Customs Acts for Unlawful Landing.*

4.—(1.) If any person lands or attempts to land a canine animal in contravention of this Order, he shall be liable, under and according to the Customs Acts, to the penalties imposed on persons importing or attempting to import goods the importation whereof is prohibited by or under the Customs Acts, without prejudice to any proceedings against him under the Act of 1894 for an offence against that Act.

(2.) The animal in respect whereof the offence is committed shall be forfeited under and according to the Customs Acts in like manner as goods the importation whereof is prohibited by or under the Customs Acts.

*Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.*

5. Canine animals shall be animals, and rabies shall be a disease, for the purposes of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

- Section forty-three (powers of police);
- Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);
- Section fifty-six (unlawful landing);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections.

and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

6. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Interpretation.*

7. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

“Master” includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Power to make Regulations.*

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

*Confirmation of Regulations.*

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have

been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

*Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.*

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

*Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.*

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);

Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

To transfer to and vest in the Company the powers conferred on the Dolter Electric Traction Limited by the Torquay Tramways Act, 1904, with regard to the making, formation, laying down, working, using and maintenance of so much of Tramway No. 3, authorized by that Act, as lies between its commencement at Castle Circus and its junction with Tramway No. 8, authorized by the said Act, and so much of Tramway No. 5, authorized by the said Act, as lies between its junction with Tramway No. 10, authorized by the said Act, and its termination, and Tramways 4, 4a and 5a, authorized by the said Act.

2. To extend the time limited by the Act of 1904 for constructing the said portion of Tramway No. 3 and Tramways Nos. 4, 4a and 5a to

enable the Company to construct so much of Tramway No. 4, authorized by the Act of 1904, as lies between a point two chains west of the intersection of Belgrave-road with Falkland-road and its junction with Tramway No. 1, authorized by the said Act, on the overhead system of electric traction.

3. To vary the period of purchase prescribed by the Act of 1904 in regard to the tramways and portion of tramway described in paragraph 1 of this notice, and to make provision for the purchase by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Torquay (hereinafter called "the Corporation") of the existing tramways, and the tramways described in paragraph 1 of this notice, and Tramway No. 1 proposed to be authorized by the Bill at one and the same time.

4. To enable and require the Corporation in the event of the Urban District Council of Paignton (hereinafter called "the Council") not purchasing Tramway No. 2, proposed to be authorized by the Bill, to purchase such tramway and all lands, buildings, works, materials and plant of the Company suitable to and used by them for the purposes of the undertaking within the urban district of Paignton on the same terms and conditions and at the same time as they purchase Tramway No. 1, proposed to be authorized by the Bill, subject to the right of the Council, under the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, as proposed to be amended by the Bill, to repurchase such tramway and all lands, buildings, works, materials, and plant suitable to be used for the purposes of the undertaking within the urban district of Paignton, and to provide that in the event of the Corporation purchasing Tramway No. 2 they shall be deemed to be the promoters of such last mentioned tramway.

5. To vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would in any manner impede or interfere with the objects of the intended Additional Provision, and to confer, vary, and extinguish other rights and privileges.

6. To alter, amend, extend, or repeal all or some of the provisions of the Torquay Tramways Act, 1904, and any other Act or Order relating to the Company or their undertaking.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Aston Manor, acting by the Council as the Local Authority, and as the Promoters under the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, and by virtue of the said Act did, on the 5th day of May, 1909, make the following Bye-laws and Regulations with respect to Tramways within the Borough, namely:

**ASTON MANOR CORPORATION  
TRAMWAYS.**

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Aston Manor, acting by the



Council as the Local Authority for the said Borough, and as the Promoters of the Tramways authorised to be constructed therein with respect to Tramways within the said Borough, under the powers conferred on them by Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

#### Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the mayor, aldermen and burgesses of the borough of Aston Manor; the word "Tramways" means the system of tramways worked by the Corporation or their lessees situate within the borough of Aston Manor; the word "Car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation or their lessees having charge of, or helping in the charge of, a car; and the word "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation or their lessees driving or helping to drive the car.

#### Entering and Leaving Cars.

2. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

All persons desiring to mount a car for the purpose of travelling thereon, shall first permit all persons to alight who may be intending to do so.

#### Smoking.

3. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars, or cigarettes in or upon any car, except in a compartment or on seats specially set apart for the purpose.

#### Playing Musical Instruments.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while riding in or upon any car, sing or play or perform upon any musical instrument.

#### Objectionable Persons.

5. Any person who is in a state of intoxication, or who from that or any other cause is in the opinion of the conductor unfit to be a passenger on a car shall not be allowed to board or enter upon any car, and may be prevented from mounting or entering any car; and if any such person be found in or upon any car he shall forthwith at the request of the conductor leave the car, or may be removed upon the instructions of or by the conductor.

#### Notice Regarding Spitting.

6. No person shall spit in or upon any car.

#### Offensive Language or Conduct, &c.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station, or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car, waiting rooms, premises or buildings used in connection with the tramways.

#### Damaging Cars.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch

any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, to pay the amount of any damage so done.

#### Offensive Clothing.

9. Any person whose dress or clothing will, in the opinion of the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation or their lessees, soil or injure the seats, lining, or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or any person who may for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be allowed to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from mounting or entering such car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall, on the request of the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation or their lessees, leave the car upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned.

Provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a carriage under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

#### Payment of Fares.

10. Each passenger shall upon demand, and whether the fare shall have been demanded or not, before leaving the car, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation or their lessees, the fare legally payable for his journey, and obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey. Any passenger who desires to take advantage of a through fare must ask for and obtain a ticket issued in respect of such through fare.

No child under 5 years of age, who is sitting on the lap of a passenger, shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child accompanying any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger shall pay the full fare legally demandable for the distance travelled by such child.

Any passenger paying for a stage less than the whole journey run by the car, shall be deemed to have completed his journey at the end of the stage paid for; if the passenger remains on the car he shall pay the fare legally payable for the remainder of his journey as a new passenger.

#### Tickets.

11. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to any officer or servant of the Corporation or their lessees, and shall also when required so to do (except in the case of workmen's return tickets, which are available for a second or homeward journey) either deliver up his ticket, or in default thereof pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Tickets shall not be transferable, and shall only be available for the car on which they are issued.

#### Luggage.

12. Any person entering or mounting upon any car and having any luggage (including the tools of an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer), shall, if so requested by the conductor, place such luggage upon either of the platforms, and shall not take or place the same in the interior

or on the upper deck of the car unless permitted by the conductor so to do.

No person shall bring on to any car luggage of a size or bulk, which, in the opinion of the conductor, is likely to cause inconvenience, hindrance or annoyance to passengers.

#### Travelling on Steps, &c.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation or their lessees shall travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand on the upper deck, or sit on the railings, buffers, or guards of any carriage, and any person so travelling, standing, or sitting, shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage.

15. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the carriage with the consent of the conductor. The expression "interior" does not include the upper deck of covered carriages.

#### Entering Full Cars.

When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

#### Disabled Cars.

16. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same; and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be entitled to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares.

#### Interference with the Duties of the Conductor or Driver.

17. No person, other than the conductor or driver, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, platform chains, or any part of a car or its equipments, or signal a car to start. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, to pay the amount of any damage done.

#### Entering or Leaving a Car when in Motion.

18. No person shall enter, board or leave, or attempt to enter, board or leave, any car whilst in motion.

#### Dogs.

19. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

#### Firearms.

20. No person shall travel in or on any car with firearms, or dangerous articles or things, provided that nothing contained in this Bye-

law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Territorial, Reserve, or other of His Majesty's Forces carrying unloaded firearms.

#### Obstructing Officers in Exercise of their Duties.

21. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation or their lessees in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or any of the tramways.

#### Impeding Traffic.

22. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on any of the tramways.

#### Persons Suffering from Disease not to Travel on Cars.

23. No person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter, or travel on any car, or attempt so to do, and no driver or conductor shall wilfully or knowingly suffer or permit any such person so to do.

#### Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offence.

24. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any car, any legal offence, or any breach of these bye-laws, shall in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

#### Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws.

25. Every conductor or driver shall to the best of his ability enforce these bye-laws and regulations, and prevent the breach thereof.

#### Penalty.

26. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these bye-laws and regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

#### Copy of Bye-laws to be Hung on Cars.

27. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these bye-laws and regulations.

28. These bye-laws and regulations shall come into force on the \*day of \*, 1909.

29. From and after the said \*day of \*, 1909, the bye-laws and regulations relating to tramways which were made by the City of Birmingham Tramways Company Limited, with respect to the tramways belonging to the Company outside the city of Birmingham, which bye-laws and regulations were respectively confirmed by the Board of Trade on the 25th day of June, 1887, shall be severally repealed so far as they relate to tramways worked by the Corporation or its lessees within the borough of Aston Manor.

**Derbyshire.**—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Derby, Appletree, Repton, Swadlincote, and Ashbourne (except the parishes, and any detached parts thereof, of Hartington Town Quarter, Hartington Nether Quarter, Eaton and Alsop, Parwich, and Ballidon), in the administrative county of Derby; and also comprising the county borough of Derby (3 May, 1909).
