"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Christ Church, Ainsworth (otherwise Cockey), is vested in the Reverend Thomas Ebenezer Cleworth, an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Manchester, and the present Rector or Incumbent of the rectory of Middleton, in the said county of Lancaster and in the said diocese of Manchester, in right of his said rectory.

"And whereas the said Thomas Ebenezer Cleworth is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Christ Church, Ainsworth (otherwise Cockey), now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester, in right of his See.

"And whereas the said Edmund Arbuthnott,

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninetyfour, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the parish of Kentish Town and the parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town, both in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-seventh day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and published in the London Gazette on the twentyeighth day of the same month a part of the parish of Saint Pancras, in the said county of Middlesex and in the said diocese of London, was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church called or known as Kentish Town Chapel, situate within the said parish of Saint Pancras, and the said district chapelry was named 'the District Chapelry of Kentish Town.'

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the second day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and published in the London Gazette on the fourth day of the same month, a separate district was constituted for spiritual purposes, and the said district was named 'the District of Saint Benet and All

Saints, Kentish Town.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Kentish Town and the said district of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town, have become new parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirtysecond and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the said district chapelry and district have under the pro-visions of the Saint Paneras Ecclesiastical Regulation Act, 1868, taken the names of 'the Parish of Kentish Town' and 'the Parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town,' and

are hereinafter called by those titles.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said parish of Kentish Town and of the said parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town, should be altered in the

manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said parish of Kentish Town and of the said parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town, shall be altered so that (firstly) all that portion of the said parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town, which is described in the first schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said parish of Kentish Town; and (secondly) all that portion of the said parish of Kentish Town which is described in the second schedule hereunder written delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town; and we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, and to be annexed to the parish of Kentish Town, in the same county and diocese, being :-

"All that portion of the said parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town, which is bounded upon the south and upon the southwest by the said parish of Kentish Town, upon the north-west and upon the north-east by the parish of Saint Mary, Brookfield, in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-east, by an

imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Mary, Brookfield, from the said parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town, crosses the middle of Fortess-road near its junction with Dartmouth Park-hill and Brecknock-road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Fortess-road for a distance of ten chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Lady Somerset-road upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town, from the said parish of Kentish Town.

"THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said parish of Kentish Town and to be annexed to the said parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town, being:—

"All that portion of the said parish of Kentish Town which is bounded upon the north, upon the north-east, and upon the east by the said parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the south-west, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town, from the said parish of Kentish Town at the junction of road called Willingham-terrace Leighton-road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Leighton-road for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lady Margaret-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Lady Margaretroad for a distance of five chains and threequarters or thereabouts to its junction with Falkland-road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Falkland-road for a distance of eleven chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Fortess-road, and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of Fortess-road for a distance of fourteen chains and a half or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Kentish Town from the said parish of Saint Benet and All Saints, Kentish Town.

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively

signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eightly years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirtythird years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Nuthurst cum Hockley Heath, in the county of Warwick and

in the diocese of Birmingham.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the fourteenth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, and published in the London Gazette upon the twenty-third day of the same month, a consolidated chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church situate in the hamlet of Nuthurst, within the limits of the parish of Hampton in Arden, in the said county of Warwick and at that time in the diocese of Worcester, but now in the said diocese of Birmingham, and the said consolidated chapelry was named 'the Consolidated Chapelry of Nuthurst cum Hockley Heath.

"And whereas the said consolidated chapelry of Nuthurst cum Hockley Heath has, under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Birmingham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Nuthurst cum Hockley Heath shall be altered so that all that part of the parish of Lapworth, in the said county of Warwick and in the said diocese of Birmingham, which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to aud shall in future form part of the said new parish of Nuthurst cum Hockley Heath.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the parish of Lapworth, in the county of Warwick and in the diocese of Birmingham, and to be annexed to the new parish of Nuthurst cum Hockley Heath, in the said county and diocese, being:—

"All that part of the said parish of Lapworth which is bounded upon the north-west, upon the south-west, and upon the south by the said new parish of Nuthurst cum Hockley Heath, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Nuthurst cum Hockley Heath from the said parish of Lapworth at the centre of Lapworth Bridge which carries the Stratford-road across Lapworth Brook, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the Stratford-road for a distance exceeding one mile to a point near the place where the Stratford-road is joined by the road leading from Saint Thomas's Church, at which point the boundary which divides the said parish of Lapworth from the said new parish of Nuthurst cum Hockley Heath crosses the middle of the Stratford-road."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Birmingham.

LONDON (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF 1909.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Definition of Parasitic Mange.

1. The expression "parasitic mange" in this Order means sarcoptic mange or psoroptic mange.

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

2.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected; and (b)with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or suspected, either to an Inspector of the Local 'Authority, or to a constable of the police force for the police area wherein the horse, ass, or mule so affected or suspected is.

(2.) A constable receiving a notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(3.) An Inspector of the Local Authority who receives information of the existence or supposed existence of parasitic mange shall forthwith report the fact to the Local Authority.

Veterinary Inquiry by Local Authority as to existence of Parasitic Mange.

(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of the existence, or supposed existence, of parasitic mange shall forthwith cause inquiry

to be instituted as to the correctness of such information with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be a Veterinary Inspector.

(2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a horse affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this Article, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Detention of Animals.

4.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority may serve a Notice (in the Form A set forth in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect) on the occupier of any stable, shed, field or other premises in which there is a horse, ass, or mule, which in his opinion is affected with parasitic mange, and thereupon the following restrictions shall take effect:

(i.) The horse, ass, or mule so affected shall not be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises specified in the Notice, except with the written authority, and under the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and only to some other place of detention; and during the detention it shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, be treated by the owner thereof with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;

(ii.) No other horse, ass, or mule shall be moved out of the stable, shed, field, or other premises, unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority.

(2.) A Notice under this Order shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served on the occupier of the premises by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and 1 and this Order, including such sections as relate Disinfection.

- 5.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:
 - (i.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange:
 - (ii.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to effected:
 - (iii.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or
 - (iv.) For requiring the removal by the owner from contact with horses, asses, or mules, of litter used for or about any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange.
- (2.) The mode of disinfection shall be one of those prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (3.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, or to remove any litter, in accordance with any such Regula-tion, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, to be cleansed and disinfected, or to remove such litter, and to recover summarily the expenses thereby incurred from such person.
- (4.) Where the power conferred by the preceding provisions of this Article is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occu-pier of the place to be cleansed and disinfected shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

- -(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Order.
- (2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

7. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (powers of police); Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections

to offences or procedure.

Exemption of Army Veterinary Service and Veterinary Colleges.

8. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass, or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Service, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

Offences.

- 9.—(1.) If a horse, ass, or mule is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice under this Order, the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the consignee of other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as afore-said, and the occupier of the place from which the horse, ass, or mule is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of this Order, or of any Regulation made thereunder, the owner and the lessee and the occupier and the person in charge of any place or thing in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any owner, occupier, or person in charge -of premises requiring to be cleansed and disinfected fails to give the facilities to a Local Authority required under this Order he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
