ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 26TH MAY 1909.)

TUBERUULOSIS ORDER OF 1909.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Interpretation.

- 1. In this Order-
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Local Authority" means a Local Authority for the purposes of the Act of 1894:
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:
- "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector:
- "Bovine animal" means a bull, cow, ox, heifer or calf:
- "Milk" includes cream and separated or skimmed milk,

Other terms have, where the context so permits, the same meaning and scope as in the Act of 1894.

Notice of Disease.

- 2.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge
 - (i) any cow which is, or appears to be, suffering from tuberculosis of the udder, indurated udder or other chronic disease of the udder; or
 - (ii) any bovine animal which is, or appears to be, emaciated from tuberculosis

shall without avoidable delay give information of the fact to a constable of the police force for the area wherein the animal is, or to an Inspector of the Local Authority, and the constable or Inspector shall transmit the information to the Local Authority, who, if not themselves the Sanitary Authority, shall inform that Authority.

(2.) The person in possession or having charge of the animal shall forthwith take such steps as are necessary to secure compliance with Article 8 (Precautions to be adopted with respect to Milk &c.) and Article 9 (Detention and Isolation of Suspected Animals).

Inspection and Examination of Animals.

3.—(1.) Where a Local Authority, by reason of information received under the preceding Article or otherwise, have reasonable ground for supposing that on any premises in their District there is a cow which is suffering from chronic disease of the udder or giving tuberculous milk, or a bovine animal which is emaciated from tuberculosis, the Local Authority shall with all practicable speed cause such veterinary examination of the bovine animals on such premises to be made by a Veterinary Inspector as in the opinion of the Local Authority is necessary to

- ascertain whether any cow thereon is suffering from tuberculosis of the udder or giving tuberculous milk, or whether any bovine animal thereon is emaciated from tuberculosis. The Inspector may apply the tuberculin test to a bovine animal with the previous consent in writing of the owner thereof or of his agent but not otherwise.
- (2.) For the purpose of such examination, a Veterinary Inspector may at all reasonable hours enter on any part of the premises and examine any bovine animal thereon and require any cowto be milked in his presence and may take samples of the milk, and the milk of any particular teat shall if he so require be kept separate, and separate samples thereof shall be furnished.
- (3.) The Inspector may also take samples of the fæces or urine of any bovine animal on the premises, or of any abnormal discharge from any bovine animal thereon.
- (4.) The occupier of the premises and the persons in his employment shall render such reasonable assistance to the Inspector as may be required for all or any of the purposes of this Article, and any person refusing such assistance shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (5.) The Inspector shall as soon as possible send to the Local Authority a report showing the result of his inspection and examination and of the examination of any sample taken by him. The Local Authority, if not themselves the Sanitary Authority, shall send a copy of the report to that Authority.
- (6.) If the report of the Inspector as to any animal does not show that it is suffering from tuberculosis of the udder, or giving tuberculous milk, or emaciated from tuberculosis, the Local Authority shall forthwith give notice in writing to the owner or person in charge thereof that the provisions of this Order relating to precautions to be adopted with respect to milk and detention and isolation of suspected animals have ceased to apply to the animal.

Slaughter of Diseased Animals.

4.—(1.) Where a Local Authority are satisfied by the report of the Inspector that in their District there is a cow which is suffering from tuberculosis of the udder, or giving tuberculous milk, or a bovine animal which is emaciated from tuberculosis, the Local Authority shall with all practicable speed give notice in writing (in the Form set forth in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect) to the owner or person in charge of the animal and also to the Board and cause the animal to be slaughtered; provided that if the owner of the animal, or any person on his behalf, gives notice in writing to the Local Authority, or to their Inspector or other officer directed to carry out such slaughter, that the owner objects to the animal being slaughtered under the provisions of this Order, it shall not be lawful for the Local Authority to cause the animal to be slaughtered without the special authority of the Board first obtained; provided also that this special authority shall not be given in the case of any animal valued under this Order at more than thirty pounds, if and so long as the animal is detained and isolated, and the milk (if any) is dealt with, in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(2.) If the value of an animal proposed to be slaughtered, as agreed or certified under this Order, exceeds thirty pounds, the Local Authority shall not proceed with its slaughter unless so

directed by the Board.

Valuation for Compensation.

- 5.—(1.) Before the slaughter of an animal the Local Authority shall either agree in writing with the owner of the animal the value thereof in its condition at the time of valuation, or if they shall fail so to agree shall cause such value to be ascertained by a valuer appointed by them or appointed on the application of the Local Authority by the Board but paid by the Local Authority and such valuer shall give to the Local Authority and to the owner a certificate in writing of the said value.
- '(2.) In ascertaining the value of an animal, regard shall be had to any Act, Order, or Regulation dealing with the sale or use of milk, milk products, or carcases for human food.
- (3.) The value shall be ascertained both on the basis of the certificate of examination hereinafter required showing that the animal was suffering from tuberculosis, and also on the basis of its not showing that the animal was suffering from tuberculosis, and the amount to be paid for compensation shall depend on such certificate accordingly.

Post-mortem Examination of Slaughtered Animals.

- 6.—(1.) In the case of every animal slaughtered under this Order, the carcase shall, at the time of slaughter or as soon as practicable thereafter, be examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority, or (if so required by the owner or person in charge of the animal before it is slaughtered) by some other veterinary surgeon, who, failing agreement between the Local Authority and such owner or person, shall be nominated by the Board but paid by the Local Authority.
- (2.) The Veterinary Inspector or other veterinary surgeon shall at the conclusion of his examination give to the Local Authority and to the owner of the animal a certificate of the result of the examination in the Form set forth in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

Compensation.

- 7.—(1.) If the Local Authority fail to carry out the examination required by the preceding Article, or if the certificate of such examination does not show that the animal was suffering from tuberculosis, the Local Authority shall, by way of compensation, pay to the owner thereof a sum equal to the value of the animal as agreed or certified in manner aforesaid and a further sum of twenty shillings.
- (2.) If the certificate of the examination shows that the animal was suffering from tuberculosis (not being advanced tuberculosis), the Local Authority shall, by way of compensation, pay to the owner a sum equal to three-fourths of the value of the animal as agreed or certified in manner aforesaid, after deducting therefrom one-half of their reasonable costs of any valuation of the animal by a valuer appointed by the Board, and of any examination of its carcase by a veterinary surgeon other than the Veterinary Inspector.
- (3.) If the certificate of the examination shows that the animal was suffering from advanced tuberculosis, the Local Authority shall, by way of compensation, pay to the owner a sum equal to one-fourth of the value of the animal, as agreed or certified in manner aforesaid or the sum of two pounds, whichever sum is the greater, after deducting from this compensation one-half of their costs of valuation and examination as in the preceding case.

- (4.) For the purposes of this Order an animal slaughtered under this Order shall be deemed to have been suffering from advanced tuberculosis
 - (a) when there is miliary tuberculosis of both lungs;
 - (b) when tuberculous lesions are present on the pleura and peritoneum;
 - (c) when tuberculous lesions are present in the muscular system, or in the lymphatic glands embedded in or between the muscles;
 - (d) when the carcase is emaciated and tuberculous lesions are present.

Precautions to be adopted with respect to Milk, &c.

- 8.—(1.) The milk produced by any cow which is, or appears to be, suffering from chronic disease of the udder or emaciated from tuberculosis, shall not be mixed with other milk until the cow has been examined by a Veterinary Inspector in accordance with the provisions of this Order, and until the owner or person in charge thereof has been notified that this Article has ceased to apply to the cow; and all milk affected by this Article shall forthwith be boiled or otherwise sterilised, and any utensil in which such milk is placed before being so treated shall be thoroughly cleansed with boiling water before any other milk is placed therein.
- (2.) A Local Authority, or a Veterinary Inspector on their behalf, may by written notice apply the restrictions imposed by this Article to the milk produced by any cow specified in the notice which is suspected of giving tuberculous milk and is being examined under this Order, and such restrictions shall apply accordingly.

Detention and Isolation of Suspected Animals.

- 9.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge any cow which is, or appears to be, suffering from chronic disease of the udder, or any bovine animal which is, or appears to be, emaciated from tuberculosis, shall keep the animal isolated as far as practicable from other bovine animals, and also keep the animal his possession or under his charge, until the animal has been examined by a Veterinary Inspector in accordance with the provisions of this Order and the owner or person in charge thereof has been notified that this Article has ceased to apply to the animal; provided that the animal may at any time be slaughtered by the owner or person in charge.
- (2.) A Local Authority, or a Veterinary Inspector on their behalf, may by written notice apply this Article to any bovine animal specified in the notice which is being examined under this Order, and such Article shall apply accordingly.

Suspected Animals in Markets Fairs and Sales.

- 10.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of a Local Authority may by notice served on the owner or person in charge of a bovine animal exposed in a market, fairground or saleyard which appears to him to be
 - (i) suffering from tuberculosis of the udder, indurated udder or other chronic disease of the udder; or
 - (ii) emaciated from tuberculosis,

require the animal to be removed from the market, fairground or saleyard to the premises from which it was brought thereto, or if the owner or person in charge so desires, to any other suitable premises, to be specified in the

notice, and thereupon the animal shall forthwith be moved by the owner or person in charge to those premises for the purpose of examination under the foregoing provisions of this Order.

(2.) Where the premises to which the animal is required under this Article to be moved, are not in the same District as the market, fairground or saleyard, the Inspector serving the notice shall forthwith send a copy of the notice to the Local Authority of the District in which the firstmentioned premises are situate.

Cleansing and Disinfection.

11. The occupier of any premises on which there has been a cow suffering from tuberculosis of the udder or giving tuberculous milk, or a bovine animal emaciated from tuberculosis, shall if so required in writing by an Inspector of the Local Authority cleanse and disinfect at his own expense, and to the satisfaction of the Inspector. that part of any shed or other erection in which the animal has recently been placed or kept.

Reports to the Board.

12. Every Local Authority and their Inspectors and officers shall send and give to the Board such reports, returns, and information as to their proceedings under this Order as the Board require.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

13. Tuberculosis shall be a disease for the purposes of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Sections nineteen and twenty (slaughter and compensation);

Section forty-three (powers of police); Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure.

Offences.

- 14. Every person who-
- (i) fails to give the notice required by Article 2 of this Order; or

(ii) fails to comply with any provision of this Order, or any direction given by the Board under this Order, relating to precautions to be adopted with respect to milk or relating to detention and isolation of animals; or

(iii) fails to comply with any notice directing removal of an animal from a market fairground or saleyard; or

(iv) fails to cleanse or disinfect any erection which under this Order he is required to cleanse or disinfect;

shall, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Extent.

15. This Order extends to England and Wales and Scotland.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

· 17. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and ten.

Short Title.

18. This Order may be cited as the TUBER-CULOSIS ORDER OF 1909.

SHEEP-SCAB (DENBIGHSHIRE, FLINT-SHIRE, AND MONTGOMERYSHIRE) ORDER OF 1909.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Order.

1. This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping Area") and the Sheep-Scab (North Wales Dipping Areas) Order of 1908, and any Order amending the same shall after the date of this Order cease to apply to the Dipping Area.

PART I.

RETURNS BY OWNERS OF SHEEP.

Returns by Owners of Sheep in Dipping Area on 15th July.

- 2.—(1.) Every owner of sheep in the Dipping Area shall, on the fifteenth day of July in each year, or as soon after that date as may be practicable, send by post or deliver to the Clerk of the Local Authority of any District in which his sheep may be, a return showing the name or description of the farm or holding or other premises in the District upon which the sheep are, the description of his sheep on such farm or holding or other premises, on the fifteenth day of July, and the number of such sheep so far as such number can reasonably be ascertained.
- (2.) The owner of any sheep brought into the Dipping Area between the said date and the first day of November in each year, shall send or deliver a similar return relating to the sheep so brought into the Area.
- (3.) Every return shall be made on a form approved by the Local Authority, who shall provide forms for this purpose to owners of sheep applying therefor.
- (4.) Returns made before the date of this Order under the Sheep-Scab (North Wales Dipping Areas) Order of 1908 shall be treated as sufficient for the current year except as to sheep subsequently brought into the Dipping Area.

COMPULSORY DIPPING.

Dipping of all Sheep in Dipping Area during First Prescribed Dipping Period.

3.—(1.) The owner of any sheep in the Dipping Area between the fourteenth day of July and the first day of September in each year (hereinafter referred to as "the first prescribed dipping period"), shall, subject to Article 6 of

- this Order relating to exemptions from compulsory dipping, cause the same to be dipped between such dates by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip.
- (2.) All sheep after having been dipped shall during the remainder of the prescribed dipping period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so dipped.
- (3.) The occupier of a farm or holding in the Dipping Area on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in that behalf, within fourteen days after the expiration of the first prescribed dipping period, send, in each year, a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep, in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority of the District in which the farm or holding is situate.
- (4.) The Local Authority may in any case where they think such procedure desirable, for the purpose of securing the dipping required by this Order, cause a Notice to be served on the owner or person in charge of any sheep requiring that the sheep shall be dipped at such time and place as is stated in the notice and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and the sheep shall thereupon be dipped in accordance with the requirements of such notice. The notice may be in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

Provisions as to First Prescribed Dipping Period.

- 4. During the first prescribed dipping period the following provisions of this Article shall apply:—
 - (1.) For the purposes of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dipping, whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped under this Order shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:—
 - (i.) the notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such persons as the Local Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sheep in their District.
 - (ii.) the notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping, unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local Authority.
 - (iii.) the notice shall state the time and place of the intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to bedipped.
 - (2.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.
 - (3.) A return in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, shall be sent immediately after each dipping by the owner or person in charge of the sheep dipped to the person appointed to receive such returns by the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are dipped, except in any case in which an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority is present at the dipping.

Dipping of all Sheep in Dipping Area during Second Prescribed Dipping Period.

- 5.—(1.) The owner of any sheep in the Dipping Area between the thirty-first day of August and the first day of November in each year (hereinafter referred to as "the second prescribed dipping period"), shall, subject to the next following Article, cause the same to be dipped between such dates by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip.
- (2.) Dipping shall be carried out on such dates, at such dipping places, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice.
- (3) All sheep after having been dipped shall during the remainder of the prescribed dipping period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so dipped.

Exemptions from Compulsory Dipping.

- 6.—(1.) The provisions of this Order requiring the dipping of all sheep during a prescribed dipping period shall not apply to:—
 - (i.) sheep moved out of the Dipping Area under and in accordance with the provisions of Part II of this Order, or slaughtered within the Area, during the prescribed dipping period; or
 - (ii.) sheep moved through the Area by railway from a place outside the Area to another place outside the Area without unnecessary delay or being untrucked within the Area.
- (2.) The provisions of this Order requiring the dipping of all sheep during the first prescribed dipping period shall not apply to sheep which on or since the sixteenth day of June then last past have been dipped by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District, and since such dipping have been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped.

Powers of Entry and Examination.

7. For the purpose of this part of this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority of any District may, subject to the direction of the Authority appointing him, enter any premises within the District and examine any sheep thereon, and such powers of entry and examination shall be in addition to any other like powers vested in the Inspector by the Act of 1894 or otherwise.

PART II.

Restriction on Exposure at Markets &c. between 14th July and 1st November.

8. Sheep shall not, except as hereinafter provided, be exposed for sale or exhibition in any market, fair, saleyard, or place of exhibition in the Dipping Area, between the fourteenth day of July and the first day of November in each year, unless they shall have within forty-two days before such exposure been dipped by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District where the sheep are dipped.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of Dipping Area between 14th July and 1st November.

9.—(1.) Sheep shall not (except as hereinafter situate the place of destination specified in the provided) be moved out of the Dipping Area licence, if such place is situate in another District.

between the fourteenth day of July and the first day of November in each year, unless-

(i.) they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted under the provisions of this Article by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are when the licence is granted; or

(ii.) they are moved direct to a slaughterhouse having previous to such movement been marked by the painting or stamping with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each sheep thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(2.) A licence for movement under this Article may be granted

(i.) upon production to the Inspector granting the licence of

(a) a certificate, in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect, showing that the sheep to be moved have, within forty-two days before the licence is granted, been dipped by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District: and

District; and

(b) a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect, to the effect that the sheep to be moved are sheep referred to in the certificate and that since the dipping the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped; provided that for movement to a market, fairground or saleyard in the administrative county of Salop, it shall be sufficient if the sheep have been so kept separate while in the Dipping Area.

(3.) A licence for movement under this Article may also be granted upon production to the Inspector of

(a) a certificate by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to the effect that he has within ten days before the licence is granted examined each of the sheep to be moved, and found it to be free from sheep-scab; and

(b) a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, to the effect that since such examination the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground, saleyard or exhibition.

A licence under paragraph (3.) shall only be granted where, in the opinion of the Inspector granting it, compliance with paragraph (2.) is impracticable or inexpedient.

- (4.) A declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting a licence thereon. A certificate shall also be so retained unless it refers to more sheep than are proposed to be moved, in which case a note shall be made thereon and initialled by the Inspector who grants the licence, stating the number of the sheep for which the licence is granted.
- (5.) The licence shall be in force for six days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.
- (6.) A copy of a licence under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the licence, if such place is situate in another District.

(7.) Sheep moved under this Article to a slaughter-house shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Movement of Lambs.

10. Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any lambs in the Dipping Area and in the District for which he is appointed Inspector are intended for immediate slaughter and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before movement for such purpose, or that the lambs are to be moved direct to a slaughterhouse, he may, subject to any directions by the Local Authority appointing him, by licence authorise the movement of the lambs to any market, fairground, saleyard or other premises, whether in the Dipping Area, or not, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence, and thereupon the lambs may be moved in accordance with such licence and conditions, and be exposed for sale in the market, fairground, or saleyard, free from any restrictions imposed by any Order of the Board. Provided that an Inspector of a Local Authority shall not issue any such licence for movement to premises in the District of another Local Authority unless the consent of such Local Authority, either generally or in the particular instance, has been previously obtained. This Article does not apply to lambs more than nine months old.

PART III.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Appointment by Local Authority of Persons to receive Notices, &c.

11. The Local Authority shall appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their District to receive notices, returns, and declarations under this Order, and shall give adequate notice in their District of appointments so made: Provided that any such appointments or notices made or given under the Sheep-Scab (North Wales Dipping Areas) Order of 1908 shall be sufficient for the purposes of this Order.

Provisions as to farms on borders of Dipping Area.

12. Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly without the Dipping Area the provisions of this Order shall, unless otherwise expressly provided by any Order of the Board, apply to the farm or holding and the sheep thereon as if the whole farm or holding were in the Area.

Certificates of Dipping.

13. Where sheep are dipped in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, he shall give the owner or person in charge of the sheep a certificate in the Form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

14. Where sheep are moved with a licence under this Order, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing the said movement.

General Provisions as to Movement.

15.—Sheep, while being moved under this Order, shall as far as practicable be kept separate

from all other sheep, and, if moved with a licence, shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

Provision for Movement through Dipping Area.

16. For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of the Dipping Area in any case where they are moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the sheep being untrucked within such Area, or where they are moved through the Dipping Area under and in accordance with any Order of the Board or any licence issued thereunder.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 17.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

18. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- 19.—(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which its dipping is required by this Order shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted or stamped on any sheep, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the sheep, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order,

fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a licence or return as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Revocation.

20. The Order described in the Third Schedule hereto is hereby revoked.

Interpretation.

- 21. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—
 - "Efficient sheep dip" means a sheep dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab, or purporting to be so approved:
 - "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector:
 - "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
 - "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

PART IV.

Special Provisions as to the Parish of Sealand,
Flintshire.

22. From and after the date of this Order the Sheep-Scab (North Wales Dipping Areas) Order of 1908 and any Orders amending the same shall cease to apply to the parish of Sealand, in the administrative county of Flint, which parish shall thereupon form part of the Dipping Area to which the Sheep-Dipping (England) Order of 1908 applies.


