The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Decree, dated June 5th, and published in the "Moniteur Belge" on June 13th, in which it is stated that in view of the existence of plague in Venezuela, the provisions of Articles 1 to 6 of the Royal Decree of September 26th, 1907 (published in the London Gazette of October 25th, 1907), regarding the sanitary measures to be imposed on arrivals from countries contaminated with plague or cholera, have been applied to that country.

Arrivals from Venezuela by sea will be subjected at the Sanitary Station of the Scheldt, and in the ports of Ostende, Nieuport, Zee Brugge and Selzaete, to the measures stipulated by Heading I, Chapter II, Section III of the Convention of Paris of December 3rd, 1903.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Borough of Richmond (Surrey).

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

INVERNESS-SHIRE (SKYE AND OUTER
ISLANDS) SHEEP-SCAB ORDER OF 1909.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894

to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Order.

1. This Order shall apply to the areas described in the First Schedule hereto, each of which is hereinafter referred to as a Scheduled Area.

PART I.

RETURNS BY OWNERS OF SHEEP.

Returns by Owners of Sheep in Scheduled Areas on 25th July.

2.—(1.) Every owner of sheep in each Scheduled Area shall, on the twenty-fifth day of July in each year, or as soon after that date as may be practicable, send by post or deliver to a Police Constable of the District a return showing the name or description of the farm or holding or other premises in the Scheduled Area upon which the sheep are, the description of his sheep on such farm or holding or other premises, on the twenty-fifth day of July, and the number of such sheep so far as such number can reasonably be ascertained.

(2) The owner of any sheep brought into a Scheduled Area between the said date and the first day of September in each year, shall send or deliver a similar return relating to the sheep so brought into the Area.

(3) Every return shall be made on a form approved by the Local Authority, who shall provide forms for this purpose to owners of sheep applying therefor.

COMPULSORY DIPPING.

Double Dipping of all Sheep in Scheduled Areas between 24th July and 1st September.

3.—(1.) While this Order remains in operation sheep in a Scheduled Area shall be exempt from the provisions of Article 3 of the Sheep-Dipping (Scotland and North of England) Order of 1907, so far as they relate to dipping within the first prescribed dipping period, and shall be subject to the substituted provisions of this Article.

(2.) The owner of any sheep in a Scheduled Area between the twenty-fourth day of July and the first day of September in each year (hereinafter referred to as "the prescribed dipping period") shall cause the same to be dipped twice between those dates, with an interval of not less than ten days between the dippings, by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip.

(3.) Each dipping shall be carried out on such date, at such dipping place, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice.

(4.) All sheep after the earlier dipping shall during the remainder of the prescribed dipping period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so dipped.

(5.) For the purpose of this part of this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, subject to the direction of the Local Authority, enter any premises within a Scheduled Area and examine any sheep thereon, and such powers of entry and examination shall be in addition to any other like powers vested in the Inspector by the Act of 1894 or otherwise.

(6.) The place on any farm or premises in a Scheduled Area which has been used for the dipping of sheep for the purposes of this Order shall, without unnecessary delay after each dipping and before any sheep are placed therein, be thoroughly cleansed by the occupier at his own expense and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and all tufts of wool gathered and disinfected or destroyed.

(7.) This Article shall not apply to the under-mentioned sheep:—

(i.) sheep moved out of a Scheduled Area under and in accordance with the provisions of Article 4 of this Order, or slaughtered within the Area, during the prescribed dipping period; or

(ii.) sheep moved through a Scheduled Area by road from a place outside that Area to another place outside that Area, provided that such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority, in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

(8.) Articles 4 and 7 of the Sheep-Dipping (Scotland and North of England) Order of 1907, so far as they relate to the first prescribed dipping period, shall not apply to sheep in a Scheduled Area.

PART II.

RESTRICTION ON MOVEMENT.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of Scheduled Areas or to Markets within Scheduled Areas, between 24th July and 1st September.

4.—(1.) Sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be moved out of a Scheduled Area, or enter, or be exposed for sale in, any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in a Scheduled Area, between the twenty-fourth day of July and the first day of September in each year unless—

(i.) they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority; or

(ii.) they are moved direct to a slaughter-house having previous to such movement been marked by the painting or stamping with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each sheep thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(2.) A licence for movement under this Article may be granted

(i.) upon production to the Inspector granting the licence of

(a) certificates, in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect, showing that the sheep to be moved have been dipped by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority twice on separate dates, with an interval of not less than ten and not more than twenty-one days between the two dates, and that the second dipping has taken place within twenty-eight days of the granting of the licence; and

(b) a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect, to the effect that the sheep to be moved are sheep referred to in the certificate and that since the earlier

dipping the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped.

(3.) A licence for movement under this Article may also be granted upon production to the Inspector of

(a) a certificate by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to the effect that he has within ten days before the licence is granted examined each of the sheep to be moved, and found it to be free from sheep-scab; and

(b) a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, to the effect that since such examination the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground, saleyard or exhibition.

A licence under paragraph (3.) shall only be granted where, in the opinion of the Inspector granting it, compliance with paragraph (2.) is impracticable or inexpedient.

(4.) A declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting a licence thereon. A certificate shall also be so retained unless it refers to more sheep than are proposed to be moved, in which case a note shall be made thereon and initialled by the Inspector who grants the licence, stating the number of the sheep for which the licence is granted.

(5.) The licence shall be in force for six days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

(6.) A copy of a licence under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the licence, if such place is situate in another District.

(7.) Sheep moved under this Article to a slaughter-house shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

PART III.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Disinfection.

5. The occupier of any premises in a Scheduled Area shall if so required by a notice served on him by an Inspector of the Local Authority, disinfect at his own expense and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority any building, pen or like enclosure on the premises which has been used for sheep.

Certificates of Dipping.

6. Where sheep are dipped in terms of this Order to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, he shall give the owner or person in charge of the sheep a certificate in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

7. Where sheep are moved with a licence under this Order, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing the said movement.

General Provisions as to Movement.

8. Sheep, while being moved under this Order, shall as far as practicable be kept separate from all other sheep, and, if moved with a licence, shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

Provision for Movement through Scheduled Areas.

9. For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of a Scheduled Area in any case where they are moved through such Area by road from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area, provided that such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority, in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

10.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

11. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

12.—(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which its dipping is required by this Order shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted or stamped on any sheep, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the sheep, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a licence or return as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

13. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Efficient sheep - dip” means a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab, or purporting to be so approved:

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector:

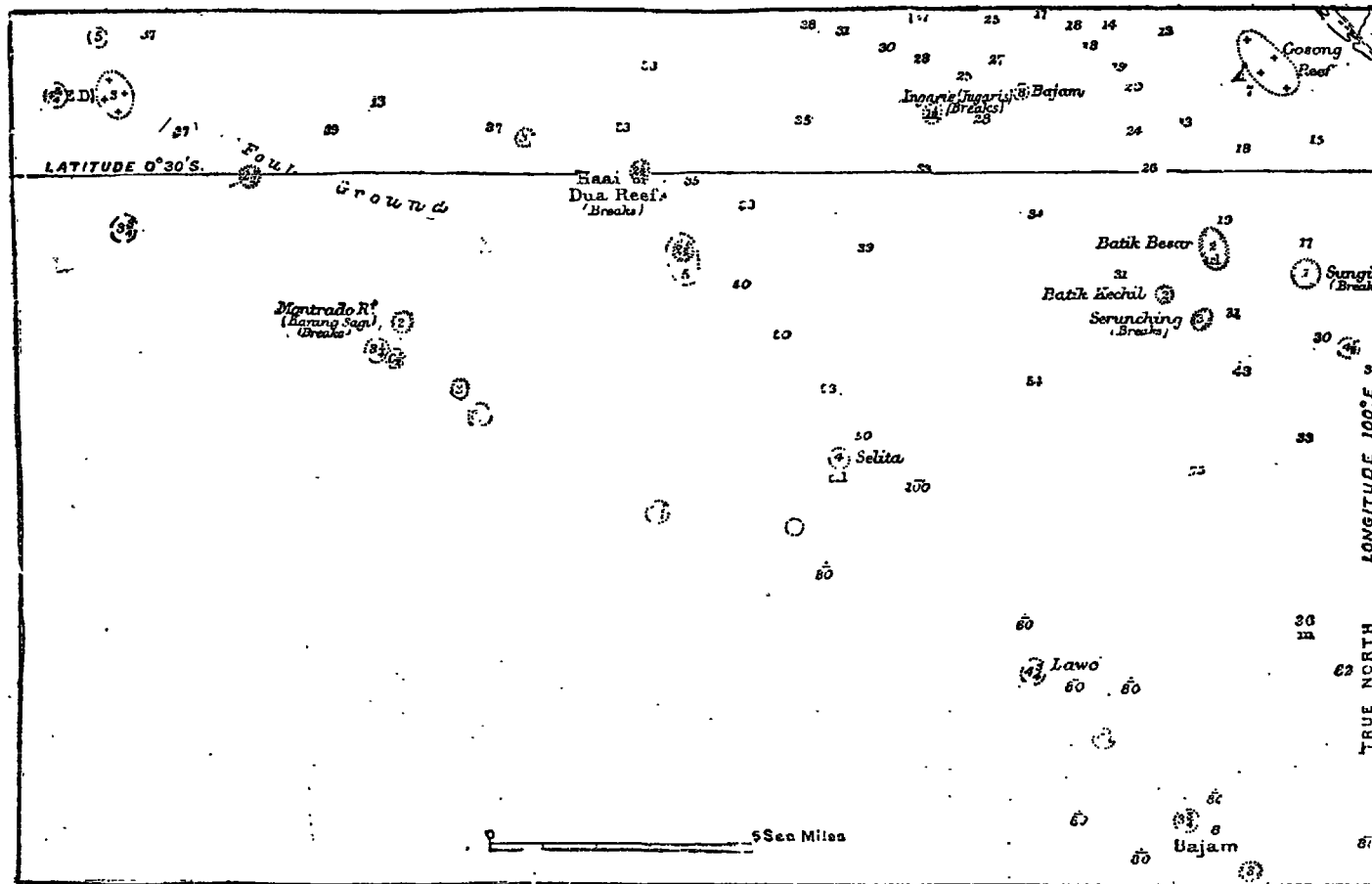
