The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Decree, dated June 5th, and published in the "Moniteur Belge" on June 13th, in which it is stated that in view of the existence of plague in Venezuela, the provisions of Articles 1 to 6 of the Royal Decree of September 26th, 1907 (published in the London Gazette of October 25th, 1907), regarding the sanitary measures to be imposed on arrivals from countries contaminated with plague or cholera, have been applied to that country.

Arrivals from Venezuela by sea will be subjected at the Sanitary Station of the Scheldt, and in the ports of Ostende, Nieuport, Zee Brugge and Selzaete, to the measures stipulated by Heading I, Chapter II, Section III of the Convention of Paris of December 3rd, 1903.
