WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of the Isle of Ely) Order, 1909.

Dated 21st June, 1909.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of the Isle of Ely, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of the Isle of Ely) Order, 1909."

BIRDS.

Close Time varied.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act

of 1880, shall be varied throughout the Administrative County of the Isle of Ely, so as to be between the 14th day of March and the 1st day of September in any year.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 15th day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of the Isle of Ely:—

Bullfinch, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Owl (all species), Woodpecker (all species).

Duration of Order.

IV. This Order shall not remain in force after the expiration of five years from the date hereof.

Repeal of former Order.

V. The Order of the 24th July, 1906, is hereby repealed.

LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

Crewkerne, South Petherton and Martock Light Railway Order.

In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the navigation of the River Mersey (V and VI Vic., cap. 110), we, Joseph Crosfield and Sons Limited, Soap and Chemical Manufacturers, Warrington, hereby give you notice that we propose to construct at Warrington, in accordance with plans and sections deposited at the office of the Mersey Conservancy, two landing stages to provide means for a ferry across the River Mersey between our works, which are situated part on the Lancashire side of the river and part on the Cheshire side. The landing stage on the Lancashire side would consist of a small wooden platform with a flight of wooden steps, and would not project beyond the wharf face. That on the Cheshire side would consist of a sloping wooden gangway constructed on wooden posts driven into the sloping beach.

The work will commence as soon as the sanction of the Acting Conservator of the Mersey has been received, and will be completed in about two months afterwards.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas We have received and duly considered an application from the County Council of Hertford for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the

above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising part of a certain road situate within the urban district of Stevenage, in the county of Hertford:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising so much of High-street, Stevenage, as extends from a point therein situate 25 yards south of its junction with Albert-street to a point therein situate 25 yards north of the northern extremity of Middle-row.
