WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Brecon) Order, 1909.

Dated 24th June, 1909.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Brecon, I hereby make the following Order :-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Brecon) Order, 1909."

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Brecon to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act :-

Chiffchaff, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Turtle Dove, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldcrest, Hobby, Kite, House Martin, Sand Martin, Richard's Pipit (Richard's Lark), Rock Lark), Tree Lipic, Robin, Redstart, Great Woodchat f (Rock Pipit Quail, Water Rail, Robin, Redstart, Great Grey Shrike, Red-backed Shrike, Woodchat Shrike, Barn Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wag-tail, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Grass-hopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whitethroat Locasor Whitethroat Wrong Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wren.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the year.

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Brecon :-

Bittern, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Kite, Owl (all species), Woodpecker (all species).

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

IV. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Brecon, viz. :-Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Common Creeper, Curlew, Dotterel, Turtle Dove, Wild Duck, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldcrest, Goldfinch, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Wood Lark, Sand Martin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Water Ouzel, Owl (all species), Tree Pipit, Quail, Water Rail, Owl (all species), Tree Pipit, Quait, Water Dath, Redstart, Sandpiper or Summer Snipe, Shrikes, Snipe, Stonechat, Swift, Teal, Bearded Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Pied Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Grass-hopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Widgeon, Woodpecker (all species), Wryneck.

(2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly without the Scheduled Area the provisions of this Order shall, notwithstanding anything contained in any prior Order, apply to the farm or holding and the sheep thereon as if the whole farm or holding were in the Scheduled Area.

Compulsory Double Dipping.

Restriction on Movement out of Scheduled Area.

Double Dipping of all Sheep between 31st August and 4th October.

1.-(1.) All sheep-except those exempted by an exemption granted under Article 3 of the Sheep-Dipping (South Wales and Monmouth) Order of 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order")—which are on any lands to which this Article applies at any time between the thirtieth day of June principal lands to the thirtieth day of June nineteen hundred and nine and the fourth day of October following, shall be caused to be dipped by the owner or person in charge thereof on those lands twice between the thirty-first day of August nineteen hundred and nine and the fourth day of October following, which for the purposes of such sheep shall be the prescribed dipping period, by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep dip, with an interval of not less than ten days between the dippings. Each dipping shall be carried out on such date, at such dipping place, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District wherein the sheep are, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice. Sheep which are on any lands to which this Article applies on the first day of September, nineteen hundred and nine, shall be exempt from the general dipping required by the principal Order between the fourteenth day of July and the first day of September.

(2.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by the preceding paragraph the owner and person in charge of the sheep on the third day of October, nineteen hundred and nine, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) Articles 4 and 7 of the principal Order shall not apply to sheep affected by this Article.

(4.) This Article shall apply to the lands described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any lands in the neighbourhood to which it may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the lands described in such Notice.

(5.) This Article shall cease to apply to any lands upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.

(6.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Sheep shall not between the thirtieth day of June nineteen hundred and nine and the fourth day of October following be moved out of an Area comprising the parishes of Traian-Glâs, Glyntawe, Ystradgynlais Higher, and Ystradgynlais Lower, in the administrative county of Brecknock, and the parishes of Llanddeusant, Llangadock, Llandilo Fawr Rural, and Quarter Bach, in the administrative county of Garmarthen, unless such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are at the date when application is made for such licence.

(2.) Unless the Inspector is satisfied (a) that the sheep are to be moved direct to a slaughterhouse for immediate slaughter there, or (b) that the sheep are not sheep that are required to be dipped by the preceding Article, a licence shall not be granted unless the Inspector is satisfied that the sheep have been twice dipped by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip with an interval of not less than ten days between the dippings, and since the second dipping have not been permitted to come in contact with other sheep upon lands to which the preceding Article applies.

(3.) This Article shall not apply to sheep moved through the said Area by road or by rail if they are not permitted to come in contact with other sheep during the movement through the said Area.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the BLACK MOUNTAIN DISTRICT (SHEEP-DIPPING) ORDER OF 1909, and shall be read with the Sheep-Dipping (South Wales and Monmouth) Order of 1908.
