We, considering that it is desirable that Wednesday, the seventh day of July next, should be observed as a Bank Holiday in the City of Birmingham, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, appoint Wednesday, the seventh day of July next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the City of Birmingham, under and in accordance with the said Act, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (session two) chapter twenty-six, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the tenth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words | and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (session two), chapter twenty-six, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing certain improvements at the episcopal house of residence belonging to the See of Chester, which is known as The Palace, Chester.

"Whereas the Right Reverend Francis John, now Bishop of Chester, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said episcopal house of residence, and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have approved the same.

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the said improvements a sum of five hundred pounds (being a sum which together with the amount of the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by the borrowing of the same sum by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands, tenements and hereditaments, endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishoprick of Chester.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Francis John, Bishop of Chester (testified by his having affixed his signature and episcopal seal to this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding five hundred pounds, and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands, tenements and hereditaments, and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by deed for the term of twenty years or until the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid with the interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof shall be fully paid and satisfied, and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following: that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term, computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable, but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly, at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter, pay to the said Governors, their successors or assigns, one fifteenth part of the said principal sum until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same twenty-second day of April, in the year one

shall become due, it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors, their successors and assigns, to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by dis-tress and sale in the like manuer as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale, and that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Francis John, now Bishop of the said diocese of Chester, as every succeeding Bishop of the same diocese, until the principal money and interest, costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and that the receipt of our Joint Treasurers for the time being endorsed on the said mortgage deed shall be a good and sufficient discharge of the said Governors and their successors for the same, who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the episcopal house of residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts: and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirteenth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the new parish (sometime district) of Darnall, in the county of

York and in the diocese of York.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said new parish of Darnall is a cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said new parish of Darnall which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purpose

of divine worship.

"And whereas in pursuance of the power and authority given by an Order of the High Court of Chancery dated the first day of August, in . the year one thousand eight hundred and fiftyfour confirming a scheme for the future application of the income of the trust property of the Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of the town and parish of Sheffield, in the said county of York, and of an Order of the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales, dated the fourth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four in partial variation of the scheme established by the said first mentioned Order, the said Burgesses and Commonalty have proposed to appropriate the sum of two hundred pounds per annum out of that part of the income of their trust property which is applicable to ecclesiastical purposes in and towards the endowment of the district herein proposed to be constituted.

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have signified by a writing bearing date the sixth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, under our common seal our approval of and consent to the proposed endowment of the said proposed

district."

"And whereas the said endowment of two hundred pounds per annum has been so appropriated as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned to the

Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of Sheffield aforesaid.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Magdalen College, Oxford, on the 1st day of February, and the 26th day of May, 1909, amending certain of the Statutes of the College, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of Magdalen College in the University of Oxford, duly made at General Meetings of the President and Fellows especially summoned for this purpose on the first day of February and the twenty-sixth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and nine respectively, and passed at such meetings by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Statute for Magdalen College made by the College under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

Preliminary.

This Statute is supplementary to the existing Statutes of the College, that is to say, the Statutes dated the 16th day of June, 1881, made for the College by the University of Oxford Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as the Statutes of 1881), as altered by the Statutes dated the 10th day of August, 1888, the Statutes dated the 7th day of March, 1899 (hereinafter referred to as the Statutes of 1899), the Statutes dated the 15th day of September, 1902, and the Statutes dated the 10th day of May, 1905, made by the College under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

Chapel Services.

So much of the clause numbered 3 of the Statutes of 1881 as to Chapel Services as relates to the right of Chaplains to occupy rooms in College rent free is hereby repealed, but such repeal shall not affect such right of any Chaplain appointed before the date of the approval of this Statute by His Majesty in Council. The President and Fellows may if they so think fit assign rooms rent free to any Chaplain.

Pensions.

Every Tutor appointed after the date of the approval of this Statute by His Majesty in Council shall vacate his Tutorship on attaining the age of 60 or, if he shall not then have completed fifteen years of service, so soon thereafter as he shall have completed that term, and shall

thereupon be entitled to a pension on the scale authorised by the Statute as to Pensions in the Statutes of 1899, provided that such pension shall in no case be less than one half the maximum amount therein authorised.

THE SUMMARY JURISDICTION (CHILDREN ACT) RULES, 1909, DATED 27TH MAY, 1909.

I. The security which a Court of Summary Jurisdiction may, under section 99 (2) Security for of the Children Act, 1908, require a parent or guardian to give for the good behaviour sensor of the Children Act, 1908, require a parent or guardian to give for the good behaviour of of a child or young person shall be given by way of recognizance; and the forms relating child or to recognizances prescribed by the Summary Jurisdiction Rules, 1886, or forms to the young person. like effect, shall be applicable thereto with such variations as circumstances may require.

II. When an order is made by a Court of Summary Jurisdiction for a contribution Copy of order to the maintenance of a child under section 75 of the Children Act, 1908, the Clerk of on parent to the Court of Summary Jurisdiction shall within three days from the date of the order contribute to send by post to the Chief Inspector of Reformatory and Industrial Schools a copy of the Chief order.

III. An order made under section 75 of the Children Act, 1908, on a parent or other Service on person liable to maintain a child or young person, may be served by any Constable or parent of School Attendance Officer or Agent of the Chief Inspector of Reformatory and Industrial order to Schools by delivering a copy of such order to the person on whom it is made or by leaving contribute. Schools by delivering a copy of such order to the person on whom it is made, or by leaving the same at such person's last known place of abode with some other person for him.

VI. The forms in Schedule A hereto, or forms to the like effect, may be used with Forms. such variations as circumstances may require for the purposes of the Children Act, 1908,

and for the purposes of the Elementary Education Act, 1876.

Forms 3, 5, 6, 7, and 8 may be used, as circumstances require, in substitution for Forms 10, 11, 12, 14, and 15 in the Schedule to the Summary Jurisdiction Rules, 1886.

Where a young person is committed to prison on remand or commitment for trial (under section 97 of the Children Act, 1908) or upon conviction of an offence or in default of payment of a fine, damages, or costs (under section 102 of the Children Act, 1908), the Court shall certify, in using Forms 10, 11, 12, or 15 in the Schedule to the Summary Jurisdiction Rules, 1886, either that "the young person is of so unruly a character that he cannot be detained in a place of detention," or that "he is of so depraved a character that he is not a fit person to be detained in a place of detention."

VII. These Rules may be cited as the Summary Jurisdiction (Children Act) Rules Title and 1909; and are in substitution for the Rules made and declared urgent on the 23rd March, repeals. 1909, and gazetted on the 26th March following, which latter Rules are hereby
