The following Addresses were presented to The King on the occasion of His Majesty's visit to Rugby on Saturday, the 3rd July, to open the new Speech Room at Rugby School:—

Address of the Urban District Council pre-nted on His Majesty's Arrival at Rugby sented on Station:-

To His Most Gracious Majesty King Edward VII.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, the Members of the Urban District Council of Rugby, on behalf of our fellow townsmen, respectfully beg to tender to Your Majesty a most loyal and hearty welcome.

Although Rugby has been a market town since 1255, when "that good Lord King Henry III" granted it a Charter, its name till the middle of last century was known to the

the middle of last century was known to the world at large chiefly in connection with its famous School

Since that date the extensive works of the London and North Western Railway-its importance as a railway centre—and the establishment of great engineering and other works in its neighbourhood have made Rugby as well known to the commercial as it previously was to the educational world.

Long as its history is, Rugby has seldom had the honour of welcoming a Member of the Royal Family. In modern times there have been only two such opportunities. In 1839 Her Gracious Majesty Queen Adelaide paid a visit to the School under Dr. Arnold's headmastership, and was graciously pleased to witness a football match played under the rules which have made Rugby a household word, not only in Your Majesty's wide dominions but wherever the English language is spoken, as well as in many foreign lands.

Two years ago Her Royal Highness Princess Henry of Battenburg honoured the town with her presence, when she opened the Children's

Wing of the Hospital of St. Cross.

But this is the first occasion in the history of Rugby that a reigning Sovereign has visited the town. The day will henceforth be a red-letter one in the annals of Rugby, and we rejoice to have the opportunity on this day of expressing our dutiful allegiance and our fervent hope that Your Majesty may long continue to reign in peace and prosperity over the Empire of which it is our privilege to form part.

We, the Board of Management of the Manchester Royal Infirmary, and the Members of the Honorary Medical Staff, on behalf of the Trustees and Subscribers, humbly approach Your Gracious Majesty gratefully to acknowledge the honour Your Majesty, and Her Majesty Queen Alexandra, have conferred upon us by Your Presence to-day, and to express our thanks for Your Royal recognition of our effort to provide an Infirmary adequate for the needs of the City and District for many years to come.

The Royal Infirmary, of which Your Majesty is the Patron, was founded in 1752; and after more than a century and a half of beneficent work, the growing needs of an ever-increasing population made it necessary to transfer its operations to this more extensive and salubrious

site.

The New Infirmary has been erected to accommodate 600 patients, but to meet existing requirements equipment has been provided for 483. The estimated cost, inclusive of a portion of the site, is £500,000, £400,000 of which have been provided by the sale of the Old Infirmary site to the Corporation of the City, the balance of £100,000 being raised by voluntary contributions. We have every reason to believe that the estimated cost will not be exceeded, and it is a great satisfaction to us to be able to announce that our resources are undiminished, and that our sole

remaining anxiety is the raising annually of a sufficient income to meet the largely increased

expenditure.

We trust that Your Majesties will be graciously pleased to give permission for one of the Wards to be called "King Edward The Seventh Ward," and another "Queen Alexandra Ward."

We desire that Your Majesties will be graciously pleased to accept our loyal and earnest wishes for Your long life and happiness, and we humbly pray that Your Majesty will declare the Manchester Royal Infirmary to be open.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the grant to Continuous Service Men and Boys sent Home sick from abroad of full pay free of stoppages for thirty days from the date of their entry as patients into Hospital in England, provided they be not invalided out of the Service or discharged dead within such period.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that so much of the Order in Council of the twenty-second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, as relates to burials in the churchyard of Saint Peter, Stockport, be varied, so that, notwithstanding anything therein, it shall be lawful, subject to the condition hereinafter set forth, to bury the bodies of six persons at their decease in the addition made subsequent to the date of the Order in Council to the vault belonging to the Wright family in the churchyard attached to Saint Peter's Church, Stockport.

Provided that the burials hereby authorized shall be subject to compliance with the requirement that the coffins be seperately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.
