NEWPORT ALLOTMENT GARDENS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1909.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

## Premises to which this Order applies.

- 1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the county borough of Newport, to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said county borough and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.
- (2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the

Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.
