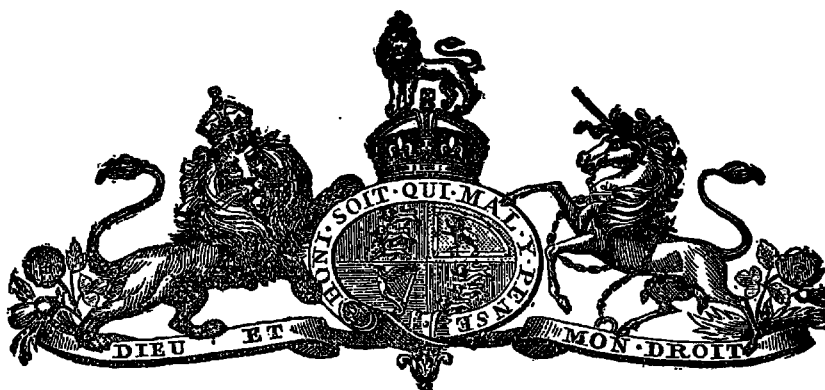

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of West Sussex) Order, 1909.

Dated 30th August, 1909.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1903, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of West Sussex, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of West Sussex) Order, 1909.

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of West Sussex so as to be between the 31st day of January and the 1st day of September in any year, except with respect to the following birds:—

Curlew, Godwit, Wild Goose, Sandpipers other than Redshank, Snipe, Wild Swan, Mallard, Teal and other Wild Duck, Whimbrel, Widgeon.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of

West Sussex to the following Wild Birds in the same manner as if they were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Black-headed Bunting, Gull Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Bustard, Buzzard (all species), Chiffchaff, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Crane, Dipper or Water Ousel, Golden Eagle, White-tailed Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Flycatcher (all species), Harrier (all species), Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Linnet, Martin (both species), Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Kentish Plover, Raven, Redstart, Shrike (all species), Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Twite, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of February following, the killing or taking of the following Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of West Sussex:—

Avocet, Bee-eater, Common Bittern, Little Bittern, Buzzard (all species), Chough, Tree-Creeper, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick-knee), Flycatcher (all species), Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Grosbeak, Heron, Hoopoe,
