Arrête:

Art. 1er. Les dispositions qui font l'objet des articles 1er à 6 de l'arrêté royal du 26 septembre 1907, susvisé, sont rendues applicables aux provenances des provinces de Hollande méridionale et de Zélande, ainsi que dans la partie de la pro-vince de Brabant septentrional située à l'Ouest de la ligne de chemin de fer de Baarle-Nassau à Bois-le-Duc (Pays-Bas).

Art. 2. Les provenances, arrivant par mer, seront soumises à la station sanitaire de l'Escaut et dans les ports d'Ostende, de Nieuport et de Zee-Brugge, ainsi qu'à Selzaete, au régime stipulé par le titre 1er, chapitre II, section III, de la Convention adoptée le 3 décembre 1903 par la

Conférence sanitaire de Paris.


