WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Montgomery) Order, 1909.

Dated 22nd September, 1909.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Montgomery, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Montgomery) Order, 1909."

BIRDS.

Close Time for Woodcock Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Woodcock is prohibited within the Administrative County of Montgomery shall be extended so as to be between the 1st day of February and the 13th day of August in each year.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Montgomery:—

Common Buzzard, Goldfinch, Heron, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Owl, Redpole, Siskin.

The House Sparrow deprived of protection.

IV. The whole of the Administrative County of Montgomery is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, so far as the House Sparrow is concerned.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

V. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of Montgomery:—

Common Buzzard, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Owl, Woodcock.

Repeal of former Order.

VI. The Order of the 28th January, 1904, is hereby repealed.

Board of Trade (Harbour Department), London, September 23, 1909.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 7th, from the British Delegate on the Constantinople Board of Health, stating that the following decisions have been taken with regard to arrivals from Russia:—

Pilgrim ships and other ships carrying more than five per cent. (on their nett tonuage) of Moslem or Christian pilgrims, emigrants or similar masses travelling as third class or deck passengers, coming from any Russian port in the Black Sea, will be subjected to three full days' quarantine at Sinope, with disinfection of dirty linen, all suspected objects, and of the ship. Pilgrim ships proper will, after their quarantine, transit the Straits in quarantine, and proceed to Beirut or Abu-Saad for a final medical visit and disinfection. The other ships above mentioned will receive free pratique (after they have undergone their measures) in any Turkish port where there is a medical officer, after a favourable medical visit.

Pilgrim ships will be permitted to take on board other pilgrims, provisions, water, and goods not offering any danger to the health of the pilgrims or to the security of the ship, in any intermediate port where there is a medical officer.

WE, THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD, in pursuance of the Public Health (Foreign Meat) Regulations, 1908, hereby give notice that, for the purposes of those Regulations, each Official Certificate of which the details are set forth in any representation or design or in any verbal description comprised in the schedule appended to and forming part of this Notice is, subject to such instructions as are comprised in the notes subjoined to the representation or design or verbal description, hereby declared, in relation to each country of which, as a place of origin, the name is prefixed as a heading to that representation, or design, or verbal description, to be admissible, during the period of twelve months beginning on the First day of October, One thousand nine hundred and eight, in the manner, to the extent, and subject to the rules and conditions prescribed in this Notice, as evidence that the pig from which any foreign meat is derived has been certified by a competent authority in the place of origin to be free from disease at the time of slaughter, and that the meat has been certified by the like authority to have been dressed or prepared, and packed with the needful observance of all

THE PUBLIC HEALTH (FOREIGN MEAT) | requirements for the prevention of danger REGULATIONS, 1908. | arising to public health from the meat as an article of food:

> AND FURTHER, with respect to the manner, to the extent, and to the rules and conditions in, to, and subject to which every Official Certificate is admissible as evidence for any such purpose as is hereinbefore described, We hereby prescribe as follows, that is to say :-

(i) An Official Certificate used in relation to foreign meat, or in relation to a box, case. receptacle or package containing foreign meat shall be admissible as aforesaid only where the

meat is derived from a pig.

(ii) An Official Certificate in the form of a label shall be admissible as aforesaid only where the label is securely affixed or attached to any foreign meat, or to any box, case, receptacle or package containing foreign meat; and where the label so affixed or attached has not, in any other circumstances, or on any other occasion, been used as an Official Certificate.

(iii) In this Notice, any word or expression to which a special meaning is assigned by the Public Health (Foreign Meat) Regulations, 1908, has the same meaning as in those Regulations.







- (o) To keep all buildings and all dynamos, engines, boilers and fixed machinery, and all

other parts of the plant, apparatus, rolling stock and other things insured against loss by fire.

- (p) To repair and keep in good condition with such materials and in such manner as the Council shall direct
 - (1) So much of the road as lies between the rails of the railway;
 - (2) So much of the road as lies between the two lines of rails; and
 - (3) So much of the roads as extends eighteen inches along the rails and beyond them.
